2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE OFFICE OF STATE AID ROAD CONSTRUCTION OF THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2026.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury
7	to the credit of the Office of State Aid Road Construction Fund,
8	for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Office of State
9	Aid Road Construction of the Mississippi Department of
10	Transportation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and
11	ending June 30, 2026\$ 220,376,205.00
12	SECTION 2. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
13	this act, the following positions are authorized:
14	AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:
15	Permanent: 54
16	Time-Limited: 0
17	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
18	responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal

- 19 Services for Fiscal Year 2027 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2026 funds
- 20 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
- 21 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 budget by the Mississippi
- 22 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
- 23 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board
- 24 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may
- 25 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year
- 26 2026 that may be utilized to fill vacant Fiscal Year 2025
- 27 headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that
- 28 the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount
- 29 and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments
- 30 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current
- 31 employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee
- 32 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the
- 33 Mississippi State Personnel Board.
- 34 Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and
- 35 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current
- 36 employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to
- 37 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2026 do
- 38 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If
- 39 the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 projected cost exceeds the
- 40 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the
- 41 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be
- 42 essential for the agency.



43	Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
44	the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
45	allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
46	Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
47	approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
48	Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
49	approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
50	without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
51	appropriated level.

- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 56 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A 57 58 relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as 59 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 60 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this 61 act, it is the intention of the Legislature that an amount not to 62 exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) is authorized 63 to be expended from funds received from the Mississippi 64 Development Authority as reimbursements for actual expenses incurred by the Office of State Aid Road Construction for 65 66 administering and providing engineering services to political

subdivisions as authorized under Section 65-4-15, Mississippi Code

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- 68 of 1972. Any such funds shall be deposited into the Office of
- 69 State Aid Roads Administrative Fund for the fiscal year beginning
- 70 July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026.
- 71 **SECTION 4.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Forty
- 72 Million Dollars (\$40,000,000.00) is provided for the purpose of
- 73 replacement of structurally deficient bridges on the Local System
- 74 Bridge Program (LSBP).
- 75 **SECTION 5.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 76 Office of State Aid Road Construction shall maintain complete
- 77 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all
- 78 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be
- 79 in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal
- 80 Year 2025. It is further the intention of the Legislature that
- 81 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2027 shall be
- 82 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format
- 83 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail
- 84 provided during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request process.
- 85 **SECTION 6.** In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
- 86 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
- 87 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
- 88 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
- 89 intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
- 90 this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
- 91 performance measures provided below:

140	SECTION 7. With the funds appropriated in this act, the	
141	Office of State Aid Road Construction shall notify members of the	
142	Mississippi Senate and House of Representatives upon the award of	

143	projects within their respective districts and at least five (5)
144	days prior to a public ceremony announcing the award of any grant
145	in their district or any public announcement or ceremony regarding
146	the groundbreaking or opening of a facility, roadway or bridge for
147	which the Legislature has made funds available. Any signage
148	regarding any public event or any new facility, roadway or bridge
149	shall include the following language: "Funds were made available
150	for this project by the Mississippi State Legislature." The
151	signage shall further state the four-year legislative term in
152	which the project was funded.

153 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature to 154 authorize the State Aid Engineer to utilize funds available to the 155 Office of State Aid Road Construction, from any source herein 156 appropriated or made available by the counties or any other 157 source, to pay for costs necessary to comply with the National 158 Bridge Inspection Standards and the Federal Highway 159 Administration's requirements for bridge inspections and/or 160 special studies necessary to comply with federal laws. The State 161 Aid Engineer shall follow the same procedures as have heretofore been established by Sections 65-9-9, 65-9-15 and 65-9-17, 162 163 Mississippi Code of 1972, for payment of such costs. The Office 164 of State Aid Road Construction may accept, budget and expend these 165 funds subject to and in accordance with rules and regulations of 166 the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner 167 consistent with the escalation of federal or state funds.

168	SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that in
169	the letting of contracts for which the Office of State Aid Road
170	Construction administers and provides engineering services to
171	political subdivisions under the Economic Development Highway Act,
172	bids may be made from the lowest and best bidder after advertising
173	for competitive sealed bids once in a newspaper published or
174	having a circulation in the county or municipality where the
175	contract will be performed, and the date published for the bid
176	opening may be not less than seven (7) working days after the
177	advertisement is published.

SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are made without competitive bids.

186 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 187 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with 188 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency 189 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their 190 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally 191 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for actions contrary to this provision. 192

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193	SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Fifty
194	Thousand Dollars ($$50,000.00$), or so much thereof as may be
195	necessary, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury
196	to the credit of the Project Poppy Fund, as created in Section
197	57-1-631, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as
198	determined by the Treasurer's Office. These funds are provided
199	for expediting services needed for Project Poppy.
200	SECTION 13. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
201	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
202	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
203	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
204	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
205	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
206	SECTION 14. This act shall take effect and be in force from
207	and after July 1, 2025, and shall stand repealed from and after
208	June 30, 2025.
