SENATE BILL NO. 3034

1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF 2 AGRICULTURE AND COMMERCE FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES 3 OF THE DIXIE NATIONAL LIVESTOCK SHOW; A ROUNDUP FOR JUNIOR EXHIBITORS OF LIVESTOCK AND GOATS; SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDS FOR 5 LIVESTOCK PREMIUMS; COUNTY LIVESTOCK SHOWS IN OFFERING AND PAYING 6 PRIZES OR AWARDS TO COMPETITORS IN APPROVED COUNTY LIVESTOCK 7 SHOWS; THE FIVE DISTRICT LIVESTOCK SHOWS; THE FIVE STATE DAIRY 8 SHOWS; THE MISSISSIPPI HIGH SCHOOL RODEO; AND TO PROVIDE HOW SAID 9 MONEY SHALL BE PAID OUT OF THE STATE TREASURY FOR FISCAL YEAR 10 2026. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11 12 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 13 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the State Department of Agriculture and 14 15 Commerce's special fund account to the State Department of 16 Agriculture and Commerce for the purposes of defraying the costs 17 of prizes, premiums, judges and other actual and necessary costs of putting on the Dixie National Livestock Show at the State 18 Fairgrounds in Jackson, Mississippi, for the fiscal year beginning 19 July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026.....\$ 1,200,000.00. 20 21 SECTION 2. The following sums, or so much thereof as may be 22 necessary, are appropriated out of any money in the State General S. B. No. 3034 ~ OFFICIAL ~

24	Agriculture and Commerce as follows:
25	(a) For the support of annual roundup shows for junior
26	exhibitors of junior steers, junior breeding cattle, beef cattle,
27	dairy cattle, hogs, sheep and goats, for the fiscal year beginning
28	July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026\$ 64,890.00.
29	(b) To supplement the funds paid by the State
30	Department of Agriculture and Commerce for livestock premiums at
31	the State Fair, all livestock premiums to be paid on the American
32	system of judging (1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, etc.) on all classes
33	entered in the senior division for the fiscal year beginning
34	July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026\$ 22,000.00.
35	(c) For the county livestock shows in offering and
36	paying prizes or awards to competitors in the approved county
37	livestock shows of Mississippi, for the fiscal year beginning
38	July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026\$ 15,000.00.
39	Provided, however, that of the amount herein appropriated in
40	paragraph (c) of this section, not more than One Thousand Dollars
41	(\$1,000.00) shall be expended or used in any one (1) county of the
42	state during each fiscal year. Provided, further, that none of
43	the monies herein appropriated in paragraph (c) of this section

shall be used in offering or paying prizes or awards for any

livestock show that is not held where there are adequate barns,

pens and other facilities available for such a show.

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47	Provided, further, in paragraph (c) of this section that the
48	management of such shows shall be in the hands of a county
49	livestock association, and such association shall guarantee a
50	minimum amount of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) to be used in the
51	paying of prizes, premiums or awards, and after said county show
52	has been held and premiums paid, fifty percent (50%) of the
53	amount, not exceeding One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), shall be
54	paid upon requisition to the State Department of Agriculture and
55	Commerce.
56	Provided, further, in paragraph (c) of this section that in
57	any county which has two (2) shows with proper facilities, and a
58	contiguous county has no such fair and desires to participate in a
59	fair to be held in an adjoining county, each of the two (2) fairs
60	in one (1) county may receive an equal proportion of the funds
61	hereby appropriated, provided, both shows shall not receive an
62	aggregate sum of more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).
63	(d) For the purpose of offering awards and prizes to
64	competitors in the five (5) district livestock shows, for the
65	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026
66	\$ 65,000.00.
67	(e) For the purpose of offering awards and prizes to
68	competitors in the five (5) state dairy shows as provided in
69	Section 69-5-101 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal
70	year beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026
71	\$ 8,500.00.

72	Provided, further, that no part of the money herein
73	appropriated under the provisions of paragraphs (d) and (e) of
74	this section shall be used for any other purpose than to pay
75	premium awards at said shows and state shows and expositions
76	receiving legislative appropriation shall not conflict in dates in
77	order that livestock exhibitors may make the circuit of shows.
78	Provided, further, that none of the above-mentioned funds shall be
79	paid to any district shows unless shows are held prior to roundup.
80	Not less than seventy-five percent (75%) of the funds herein
81	appropriated under the provisions of paragraphs (d) and (e) of
82	this section shall be used in awarding prizes or premiums to 4-H
83	Club members and Smith-Hughes School members and other boys and
84	girls having entries in said shows.
85	All funds herein appropriated under the provisions of
86	paragraphs (d) and (e) of this section for the five (5) district
87	livestock shows and the five (5) fall state dairy shows shall be
88	distributed in such manner that the livestock exhibitors will each
89	draw equal premium awards for comparable grades and placings at
90	each of the said five (5) district spring shows and the five (5)
91	fall state shows. The management of each district spring show and
92	each state fall show shall submit to the State Department of
93	Agriculture and Commerce, within fifteen (15) days after the close
94	of each said show, a full report on the number of exhibitors at
95	each said show, with the grades and placings of the different
96	classes of livestock exhibited.

97	The State Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce, together
98	with a committee of three (3) to be named by the President of the
99	Mississippi Livestock Council from that organization, shall
100	summarize and prepare a unified list of awards for like classes in
101	all spring district livestock shows and fall state dairy shows
102	receiving state premium money, as authorized in paragraphs (d) and
103	(e) of this section. The State Commissioner of Agriculture and
104	Commerce shall approve and present a requisition to the State
105	Fiscal Officer for the payment of the amount of funds in
106	paragraphs (d) and (e) of this section due each show and said
107	State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrant thereon, and it shall
108	be paid by the State Treasurer.
109	Provided, however, as a condition of expenditure of the funds

Provided, however, as a condition of expenditure of the funds appropriated in paragraphs (d) and (e) of this section, that the board of directors of any district livestock show may, in its discretion, choose to hold its show in the fall instead of the spring. If district shows are held in both spring and fall, then all funds herein appropriated for the five (5) district livestock shows shall be distributed in such a manner that the spring livestock exhibitors will each draw equal premium awards for comparable grades and placings at each district spring show, and the fall livestock exhibitors will each draw equal premium awards for comparable grades and placings at each district fall show.

120 (f) For promotion and expenses of the winners of the

124	(g) For promotion and expenses of the winners of the
125	Mississippi Junior High School Rodeo for attending the national
126	finals, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and ending
127	June 30, 2026\$ 12,000.00.
128	(h) For the support of the Southern Cutting Futurity
129	Championship, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and
130	ending June 30, 2026\$ 50,000.00.
131	SECTION 3. Of the funds in Section 2 of this act, any funds
132	that are remaining at the end of the fiscal year may be
133	transferred between the different show awards and prize monies,
134	with the exception that no county show in Section 2(c) of this act
135	shall receive more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00).
136	SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that
137	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
138	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
139	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
140	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
141	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
142	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
143	made without competitive bids.
144	SECTION 5. The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and
145	Commerce is authorized to accept and expend any grant, donation,
146	or contribution from any individual, public, or private

L47	organization, or government entity for purposes of defraying
L48	the operational costs of the department. Such grants, donations,
L49	or contributions shall be received and expended under the rules
L50	and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in
L51	a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds not to
L52	exceed One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00).
L53	The Commissioner of Agriculture shall notify, in writing, the
L54	Lieutenant Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives,
L55	the Chairman of the Senate Appropriations Committee, the Chairman
L56	of the House Appropriations A Committee, and the Legislative
L57	Budget Office of any escalation. The written notification shall
L58	include the justification for the escalation of funds, the amount,
L59	and how the funds will be used. This written notification shall
L60	be sent on or before the fifteenth day of the month prior to the
L61	effective date of the escalation.
L62	SECTION 6. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
L63	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
L64	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
L65	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
L66	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
L67	proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.
L68	SECTION 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from
L69	and after July 1, 2025, and shall stand repealed from and after
L70	June 30, 2025.

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
