1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE MISSISSIPPI BOARD OF ANIMAL HEALTH FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE BOARD FOR FISCAL YEAR 2026.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
7	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
8	defraying the expenses of the Mississippi Board of Animal Health
9	for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and ending
LO	June 30, 2026\$ 1,768,035.00.
L1	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
L2	necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special
L3	source funds which are collected by or otherwise become available
L 4	for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Mississippi Board
L5	of Animal Health, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and
L 6	ending June 30, 2026\$ 1,119,460.00.
L7	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
L 8	this act, the following positions are authorized:

19 AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:

20 Permanent: 23

21 Time-Limited: 5

22 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's

23 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal

24 Services for Fiscal Year 2027 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2026 funds

25 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are

26 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 budget by the Mississippi

27 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's

28 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board

29 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may

30 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year

31 2026 that may be utilized to fill vacant Fiscal Year 2025

32 headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that

33 the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount

34 and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments

35 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current

36 employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee

37 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the

38 Mississippi State Personnel Board.

39 Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and

40 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current

41 employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to

42 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2026 do

43 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If

44	the	agency's	Fiscal	Year	2026	proj	jected	cost	exceeds	the
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- 45 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the
- State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be 46
- 47 essential for the agency.
- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 48
- 49 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
- 50 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 51 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 52 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration.
- Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 53
- 54 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 55 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 56 appropriated level.
- 57 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 58 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for
- 59 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are
- 60 withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in 61
- 62 violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
- 63 relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 64 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 65 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- Mississippi Board of Animal Health shall maintain complete 66
- 67 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all

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funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be 68

- 69 in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal
- 70 Year 2025. It is further the intention of the Legislature that
- 71 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2027 shall be
- 72 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format
- 73 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail
- 74 provided during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request process.
- 75 **SECTION 5.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 76 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 77 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 78 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 79 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 80 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 81 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 82 made without competitive bids.
- 83 **SECTION 6.** The Mississippi Board of Animal Health is
- 84 authorized to accept and expend any grant, donation, or
- 85 contribution from any individual, public or private organization,
- 86 or government entity for purposes of defraying the operational
- 87 costs of the department. Such grants, donations, contributions,
- 88 and any carryover funds shall be received and expended under the
- 89 rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and
- 90 Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of
- 91 federal funds not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 92 (\$500,000.00).

93	SECTION /. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
94	funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
95	Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
96	shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
97	appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
98	or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
99	actions contrary to this provision.
100	SECTION 8. Of the funds in Section 2 of this act, Two
101	Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) is provided from the
102	Animal Health Disaster Response Fund. These funds are provided
103	for expenses incurred by the Board of Animal Health in responding
104	to animal disease outbreaks as outlined in Section 69-15-21,
105	Mississippi Code of 1972.
106	SECTION 9. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
107	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
108	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
109	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
110	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
111	proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.
112	SECTION 10. This act shall take effect and be in force from

June 30, 2025.

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and after July 1, 2025, and shall stand repealed from and after
