- 27 Legion Baseball Coach for over 50 years. Honorary pallbearers

- 29 Red Sox American Legion Baseball; and

- 31 brought Nickey the most enjoyment was spending time with his
- 32 family; and
- 33 WHEREAS, Nickey was preceded in death by his parents and
- 34 brother Gary Browning. Nickey is survived by his wife, Brenda
- 35 Browning; daughters, Tracy Riddle and Brea Klair Browning; son,
- 36 Jason Browning; sister, Nancy Yates (Hugh); brother, Roger
- 37 Browning (Rebecca) and Tim Browning (Anita); sister-in law, Paula
- 38 Browning; grandson, Memphis Riddle; and a host of other family and
