SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 507

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE  
2 JACKSON STATE UNIVERSITY TIGERS FOOTBALL TEAM AND HEAD FOOTBALL  
3 COACH TC TAYLOR FOR WINNING THEIR FIRST CELEBRATION BOWL, CLAIMING  
4 THE HISTORICALLY BLACK COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES NATIONAL  
5 CHAMPIONSHIP AND FOR THEIR OUTSTANDING 2024 SEASON.

6 WHEREAS, we join the team, coaches, students, administration,  
7 alumni and fans of the Jackson State University Tigers Football  
8 Team in celebrating the university's first Celebration Bowl  
9 victory, which matches the winner of the Southwestern Athletic  
10 Conference Championship (SWAC) against the winner of the Mid-  
11 Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) to decide the (HBCU) National  
12 Championship; and

13 WHEREAS, on December 14, 2024, at the Celebration Bowl, Coach  
14 TC Taylor stood on the stage and threw both of his arms straight  
15 up in the air before the Jackson State football coach grabbed the  
16 silver Celebration Bowl trophy and hoisted it over his head as  
17 blue, orange and white confetti rained down from above. A chant  
18 from the Jackson State crowd at Mercedes-Benz Stadium began to



19 grow louder and louder as they chanted for TC Taylor, JSU's  
20 second-year coach; and

21 WHEREAS, the Tigers (12-2) had just beaten South Carolina  
22 State (9-3) in a dominant 28-7 win anchored by the defense. The  
23 victory was JSU's first Celebration Bowl win, claiming the HBCU  
24 national championship. A 17-game postseason losing streak was  
25 also snapped; and

26 WHEREAS, Deion Sanders took Jackson State to the Celebration  
27 Bowl twice, losing in 2021 and 2022. It only took two seasons for  
28 TC Taylor to match and then top what Sanders accomplished with the  
29 Celebration Bowl win; and

30 WHEREAS, Taylor said he realized the team could be special  
31 when the roster came together in the offseason. Jacobian Morgan,  
32 the offensive MVP of the Celebration Bowl, retook the starting  
33 quarterback job that week. A few games later, the defense  
34 developed into a unit that never allowed more than 21 points in  
35 the final eight games; and

36 WHEREAS, when Jackson State needed it most against South  
37 Carolina State, the defense delivered. Morgan threw an  
38 interception on the second play of the third quarter, setting up  
39 the South Carolina Bulldogs on a short field only trailing 14-0.  
40 An 11-yard sack on third down by Ashton Taylor booted them out of  
41 field goal range. Three times the Bulldogs gained possession in  
42 Tigers' territory but came away with zero points. Even after  
43 Jackson State missed a field goal with five and a half minutes to



44 play that would have pushed the lead to three possessions, the  
45 defense came through again with an interception. Morgan threw a  
46 14-yard touchdown pass to Joanes Fortilien on the next play to  
47 seal the win; and

48 WHEREAS, the seven points allowed were the fewest in the  
49 nine-game Celebration Bowl history. The 21-point margin of  
50 victory also tied the most in Celebration Bowl history. That was  
51 last achieved when South Carolina State defeated Sanders' Jackson  
52 State 31-10 in 2021; and

53 WHEREAS, "Coach TC, knew what it looked like," said defensive  
54 lineman Jeremiah Williams, the game's defensive MVP. "It's why he  
55 won SWAC Coach of the Year. We've been here three times, and he  
56 knew he was going to get it done eventually. It was the small  
57 things. He put the pieces together"; and
