SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 543

- A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION CELEBRATING 40 YEARS OF ADVOCACY AND SERVICE BY CASA OF SOUTHEAST MISSISSIPPI AND DESIGNATING APRIL
- 3 2025 AS "CHILD ABUSE AWARENESS MONTH" IN MISSISSIPPI.
- WHEREAS, Child Abuse Awareness Month is a time to recognize
- 5 the suffering of children who have been abused and neglected and
- 6 to raise awareness about the critical need for prevention,
- 7 intervention, and support; and
- 8 WHEREAS, for the past 40 years, CASA of Southeast Mississippi
- 9 (formerly CASA of Jackson County), has been a beacon of hope,
- 10 providing crucial services to children and families impacted by
- 11 abuse and neglect, working tirelessly to ensure that every child
- 12 is given the opportunity to grow up in a safe and nurturing
- 13 environment; and
- WHEREAS, in 1985, a small group of compassionate individuals
- 15 came together in Jackson County with a single vision: to provide
- 16 a safe space for children in the youth court system who had been
- 17 affected by abuse, neglect and trauma. Today, 40 years later,
- 18 that vision has grown into a beacon of hope for thousands of

- 19 children and families living in Jackson, George and Greene
- 20 Counties; and
- 21 WHEREAS, over the past four decades, CASA of Southeast
- 22 Mississippi has celebrated many significant milestones. Some of
- 23 their key accomplishments include:
- Expansion of Services: In the early years, their focus
- 25 was primarily on providing emergency care and advocacy for
- 26 children in Jackson County. Today, they offer a comprehensive
- 27 range of services and resources to children in Jackson, George and
- 28 Greene Counties;
- A Network of Partners: CASA has built strong
- 30 partnerships with Child Protective Services, Youth Court staff,
- 31 local schools, law enforcement, health care providers, and other
- 32 community organizations to create a robust support network for
- 33 children and families:
- Increased Awareness and Advocacy: Over the years, their
- 35 advocacy efforts have helped raise awareness about child abuse
- 36 during the month of April and the long-lasting effects of trauma,
- 37 pushing for systemic changes in how children are treated and
- 38 supported at the local, state and national levels;
- Serving Thousands of Children: Since their inception,
- 40 they have been privileged to help thousands of children regain
- 41 their sense of safety, stability and hope for the future. Through
- 42 their programs, they've also been able to empower countless

- 43 children to overcome their challenges and thrive in safe,
- 44 permanent, loving homes; and
- WHEREAS, it is our shared responsibility as a community to
- 46 stand united in protecting the well-being of our most vulnerable
- 47 children, ensuring that they live free from fear, harm and
- 48 neglect, and they are provided with the resources and care they
- 49 need to build healthy futures; and
- 50 WHEREAS, during this month, we honor the dedication of
- 51 nonprofit organizations, social workers, law enforcement,
- 52 educators, health professionals, and all who are committed to
- 53 protecting children from abuse and neglect and raising awareness
- 54 about the impact of such trauma on individuals and society at
- 55 large; and
- 56 WHEREAS, the 40-year legacy of CASA of Southeast Mississippi
- 57 exemplifies the power of community, compassion and collective
- 58 action in creating a world where every child is safe, loved and
- 59 supported in their journey to adulthood:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 61 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
- 62 we do hereby designate the month of April 2025 as "Child Abuse
- 63 Awareness Month," and celebrate the 40th Anniversary of CASA of
- 64 Southeast Mississippi's unwavering dedication to children and
- 65 families. May this milestone serve as both a reflection of the
- 66 progress we have made, and a reminder of the ongoing work needed
- 67 to ensure that all children grow up free from abuse and neglect.
