## SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 10

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE BALDWIN HIGH  
2 SCHOOL BEARCATS FOOTBALL TEAM AND HEAD COACH MICHAEL GRAY FOR  
3 WINNING THEIR FIRST MISSISSIPPI HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITIES ASSOCIATION  
4 CLASS 1A CHAMPIONSHIP SINCE 2008.

5 WHEREAS, the Baldwin High School Bearcats Football Team could  
6 not have asked for a worst start, but the ending was one to  
7 remember. Behind a second half offensive surge along with a  
8 defense that forced four turnovers, the Bearcats rallied past  
9 Simmons 21-20 to claim the MHSAA Class 1A State Championship at  
10 Southern Miss' M.M. Roberts Stadium on December 6, 2024; and

11 WHEREAS, it was Baldwin's second state title in school  
12 history and its first since 2008; and

13 WHEREAS, "I told the seniors at halftime you have 24 minutes  
14 to find a way to win this game and they did, and I couldn't be any  
15 more proud of this bunch," said Baldwin coach Michael Gray. "It's  
16 hard to get here, and we worked hard to get to this point. It's  
17 an awesome feeling"; and

18 WHEREAS, Simmons scored the game's first points. After  
19 Baldwin was forced to punt, Simmons extended their lead to 12-0.



20 Buchanan found Armani Strahan on a 9-yard touchdown pass with 29  
21 seconds left before halftime. The Bearcats had 12 yards of  
22 offense in the first half; and

23 WHEREAS, the third quarter was all Baldwyn. The Bearcats  
24 scored on their opening drive of the second half on a Terrell  
25 Robinson 1-yard touchdown run. After Simmons was forced to punt,  
26 Dy'Lan Johnson dove into the end zone from 1-yard out to give the  
27 Bearcats a 14-12 lead with 5:46 remaining in the third quarter.  
28 Ashton Grice extended the Baldwyn lead to 21-12 on a 26-yard  
29 interception return for a touchdown with 2:53 left in the third  
30 quarter. Simmons answered, returning the ensuing kickoff 78 yards  
31 for a touchdown, and a successful two-point conversion cut the  
32 Baldwyn lead to 21-20 with 2:39 left in the third quarter; and

33 WHEREAS, after Baldwyn turned the ball over on downs at the  
34 Simmons 8-yard line with 2:35 left in the fourth quarter, Simmons  
35 drove to their own 44-yard line, but Colton Hayes intercepted a  
36 pass at the Baldwyn 40-yard line with 45 seconds left to seal the  
37 win. The Bearcat defense forced four turnovers, three  
38 interceptions and a fumble, and held Simmons to just 151 yards of  
39 total offense; and

40 WHEREAS, "When we scored our first touchdown it changed the  
41 vibe for us, and the script flipped, and we were more physical,"  
42 Gray said. "Defense was great and did what they did all year.  
43 Defense wins championships and that's what happened." Johnson had  
44 58 yards passing to lead Baldwyn. Linebacker Aiden Stewart was



45 named the game's MVP with 11 tackles, a sack, a tackle for loss,  
46 and an interception for the Bearcats; and
