SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 21

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING "THEE" JACKSON 2 STATE UNIVERSITY "SONIC BOOM OF THE SOUTH" MARCHING BAND AND 3 DIRECTOR DR. RODERICK LITTLE FOR THEIR ELECTRIFYING PERFORMANCE AT THE 2025 TOURNAMENT OF ROSES PARADE IN PASADENA, CALIFORNIA. 5 WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we extend the congratulations of the State to the Jackson State University 6 7 "Sonic Boom of the South" Marching Band for its outstanding performance on national television entertaining parade spectators 8 9 at the 2025 Tournament of Roses Parade on January 1, 2025; and 10 WHEREAS, all eyes were glued to the Tournament of Roses Parade on January 1, 2025, with Mississippians entertaining crowds 11 12 along the parade route. Jackson State University's Sonic Boom of 13 the South and Mississippi's musical legacy appear on the national 14 stage, showing why the state is the birthplace of American music; 15 and WHEREAS, "It's an opportunity for us to share with the world 16 17 what we've always known, which is that we have the greatest band in the land, that Mississippi is home, it is the birthplace of 18 19 music, and that we are maintaining that tradition, " said Dr. Lisa S. - 20 Beckley-Roberts, Chair of Jackson State University's Department of
- 21 Music; and
- 22 WHEREAS, "This is a place that we've belonged for a long
- 23 time, but we're finally taking our place," said Visit Jackson
- 24 spokesperson Yolanda Clay-Moore. "We have such a rich culture and
- 25 musical footprint"; and
- 26 WHEREAS, it's been quite a year for the Sonic Boom,
- 27 performing at the Super Bowl in February and now starting the New
- 28 Year in the Rose Parade. "A once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for
- 29 our students and now to cap off this year and to be in California
- 30 and to be performing at the Rose Bowl Parade, we're all just
- 31 overwhelmed with gratitude," added Beckley-Roberts; and
- 32 WHEREAS, the Sonic Boom of the South is one of the elite
- 33 Historically Black Colleges and Universities marching bands. Its
- 34 unique style and showmanship include the J5 drum majors, Prancing
- 35 J-Settes, floating JSU, Tiger Run-On, the "Get Ready" entrance,
- 36 and "The Series." Its musical approach can be traced to the early
- 37 years, when a former arranger for Cab Calloway's big band was the
- 38 director (1948-1971). The band performs marches, Jazz, Gospel,
- 39 R&B, Hip-Hop, and Deep South Rap. Founded as the Jackson State
- 40 University Marching Band, the name "Sonic Boom of the South" was
- 41 adopted by Director Harold J. Haughton, Sr. in 1971, having been
- 42 suggested by band members; and
- WHEREAS, Haughton acted as director until 1983. During his
- 44 tenure, he changed the band uniform color from royal blue to light

- 45 navy blue, introduced the Motown hit "Get Ready" as the band's
- 46 theme, replaced the Majorettes with featured dancers and
- 47 introduced the "Tiger Run-On" shuffle, "Tiger Strut" and "Floating
- 48 JSU" half-time display. He was replaced as director by Dowell
- 49 Taylor, an alumnus of the band. In 2020, alumnus Roderick Little
- 50 became the youngest director in the band's history; and
- 51 WHEREAS, in 2022, Sonic Boom of the South was featured on
- 52 ABC's Good Morning America during JSU's homecoming week. In 2024,
- 53 Sonic Boom of the South performed with Usher during the Super Bowl
- 54 LVIII half-time show. The Sonic Boom of the South has performed
- 55 at several notable occasions such as Motown 30th Anniversary, the
- 56 34th National Association for the Advancement of Colored People
- 57 (NAACP) Image Awards, alongside "Cedrick the Entertainer", a
- 58 number of NFL games and its prestigious performance at the 2021
- 59 Presidential Inauguration Parade; and
- 60 WHEREAS, the JSU Sonic Boom of the South marching band was in
- 61 the 17th position in the Rose Parade, followed by the Mississippi
- 62 Float in the 19th position; and
- WHEREAS, "We're thrilled to add this award to the long list
- 64 of recent wins for Mississippi," said Mississippi Governor Tate
- 65 Reeves. "From record-breaking tourism and economic development to
- 66 our nationally recognized advancements in education, something
- 67 special is happening in Mississippi. This award is yet another
- 68 example of that. Today we extended an invitation to the 850,000
- 69 parade attendees and millions of viewers around the country and

- 70 world to discover all of the awesome things our state has to
- 71 offer. It was a great day for Mississippi"; and
- 72 WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we recognize this elite
- 73 Mississippi university musical organization that has brought
- 74 excitement and excellent musical performances to venues across our
- 75 country and has brought honor to its university, its community and
- 76 to the State of Mississippi:
- 77 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 78 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby commend and congratulate "Thee"
- 79 Jackson State University "Sonic Boom of the South" marching band
- 80 and Director Dr. Roderick Little for their electrifying
- 81 performance at the 2025 Tournament of Roses Parade in Pasadena,
- 82 California, and extend the best wishes of the Senate for future
- 83 successes.
