SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 37

1 A RESOLUTION EXTENDING THE CONDOLENCES OF THE MISSISSIPPI
2 SENATE TO THE SURVIVING FAMILY OF TYLERTOWN PASTOR AND COMMUNITY
3 LEADER APOSTLE CLAYTON BULLOCK AND EXPRESSING SYMPATHY ON HIS

17 own companies: Integrity Motors, New Era Enterprises, Inc., and
18 New Era Insurance Agency; and

19 WHEREAS, Clayton's greatest passion was serving for the
20 purpose of kingdom progression specifically as youth pastor and
21 later as Senior Pastor of Tylertown First Baptist Church for 10
22 years; and

23 WHEREAS, Clayton served as a community leader in many ways
24 and touched the lives of many around the world. His legacy is
25 carried out not only in his children but all who were blessed by
26 his nurturing spirit; and

27 WHEREAS, we pay tribute and cherish fondly the memory of this
28 most public-spirited citizen of Mississippi whose enormous civic
29 energy will be missed:
