## SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 57

A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND PAYING TRIBUTE TO THE MISSISSIPPI

2	POLL WORKERS WHO HAVE SERVED OVER 50 CONSECUTIVE YEARS IN THIS ROLE AS THE "FRONTLINE OF DEMOCRACY."
4	WHEREAS, as the nation and electors in the State of
5	Mississippi vote, it is natural to focus on candidates, policies
6	and outcomes of the elections. Yet, behind every successful
7	election are millions of dedicated election professionals and poll
8	workers who make democracy possible. They are often volunteers
9	who rise to the occasion to serve their communities, ensuring that
10	every eligible voter has the opportunity to make their voice
11	heard; and
12	WHEREAS, election poll workers play a pivotal role in
13	upholding the fabric of democracy through their dedication,
14	resilience and service to their communities. Our election
15	professionals and volunteer poll workers are a shining example of
16	nonpartisan cooperation that puts our democracy and country first.

20	and record early turnout across states, this is an incredibly busy
21	and exciting time for the elections community. In the past few
22	years, professional election administrators have faced and
23	overcome unprecedented obstacles, including the Covid-19 global
24	health pandemic, personnel changes, extreme weather events, budget
25	cuts, an increase in violent threats, and a more public profile
26	overall. Yet the dedicated local election administrators who
27	choose to stay in this profession have been working for months,
28	even years, to maintain accurate voter rolls, secure voting
29	locations, thoroughly test voting equipment, enhance security
30	protocols, train their permanent and temporary labor force on the
31	latest rules and regulations, and educate voters before they head
32	to the polls; and
33	WHEREAS, as we reflect on the importance of free and fair
34	elections, the state should take a moment to honor and thank those
35	who serve behind the scenes, ensuring that our voices are heard
36	and our democracy remains strong; and
37	WHEREAS, we join Secretary of State Michael Watson and the
38	Secretary of State's Office in recognizing Mississippi poll
39	workers who have served over 50 consecutive years in this role.
