SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 63

- A RESOLUTION REMEMBERING THE GALLANT SERVICE AND COMMENDING
 THE LIFE OF UNITED STATES ARMY CHIEF WARRANT OFFICER 2 ANDREW LOYD
 EAVES OF BROOKSVILLE, MISSISSIPPI, WHO WAS LOST IN ACTION IN A
 TRAINING MISSION IN WASHINGTON, D.C., ON JANUARY 29, 2025, AND
- 5 EXPRESSING THE SYMPATHY OF THE LEGISLATURE.
- 6 WHEREAS, services were held on February 13, 2025, in
- 7 Mississippi for 39-year-old Chief Warrant Officer 2 Andrew Loyd
- 8 Eaves, a Black Hawk helicopter pilot lost in action in an in-air
- 9 collision in Washington, D.C.; and
- 10 WHEREAS, his family held a private service in West Point,
- 11 Mississippi, before Warrant Officer Eaves was laid to rest with
- 12 full military honors at Bethesda Baptist Church Cemetery near
- 13 Crawford, Mississippi; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Honorary pallbearers included members of the Army's
- 15 12th Aviation Battalion; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Warrant Officer Eaves and two other Army airmen were
- 17 piloting a Black Hawk helicopter on January 29, 2025, when it
- 18 collided with a commercial American Airlines flight near Ronald
- 19 Reagan Washington National Airport in Washington, D.C. The three

- 20 servicemen were lost in the crash. The Army airmen were on a
- 21 training mission out from Davison Army Airfield at Fort Belvoir,
- 22 Virginia, where they were members of the 12th Aviation Battalion;
- 23 and
- 24 WHEREAS, Warrant Officer Eaves was born in Columbus,
- 25 Mississippi, and grew up in Brooksville, Mississippi. He attended
- 26 Central Academy in Macon and Mississippi Youth Challenge Academy
- 27 at Camp Shelby in Hattiesburg. He earned an associate's degree
- 28 from the University of Maryland Global Campus; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Warrant Officer Eaves served ten years in the Navy,
- 30 where he reached the rank of First Class Petty Officer (E-6),
- 31 before joining the Army; and
- 32 WHEREAS, survivors include his wife, Carrie Eaves; daughter,
- 33 Kaylee Lester; and son, Michael Lester; mother, Betty Hayden Eaves
- 34 of Brooksville, Mississippi; father, Hank Loyd Eaves of Coker,
- 35 Alabama; and brother, Forrest Eaves of Brooksville, Mississippi;
- 36 WHEREAS, Andrew Eaves was a loving son, husband and father
- 37 who is counted among America's heroes, committed to our nation's
- 38 safety and security. To a country, a fallen soldier means a
- 39 national loss; to a community, a fallen soldier means a true hero;
- 40 to a spouse, parent, or child a fallen soldier means a husband or
- 41 son or father who will not be coming home. Mississippians
- 42 understand the costs of conflict, because we have paid them in the
- 43 past, and it is with great pride and humility that we recognize
