- awareness, the census count and overall commitment to statewide 11
- 12 civic engagement; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated, is the
- 14 oldest Greek letter organization in the United States founded by
- college-educated African American women on January 15, 1908, on 15
- 16 the campus of Howard University. Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority,
- 17 Inc., is currently led by International President Danette Anthony
- 18 Reed; and

L 9	WHEREAS, Alpha Kappa Alpha is comprised of ten regions around
20	the globe. The States of Tennessee, Mississippi and Alabama make
21	up the South Eastern Region. Presently, the South Eastern Region
22	comprises 116 chapters, 48 undergraduate chapters and 68 graduate
23	chapters. With over 14,000 Sorors, the region is dedicated to the
24	mission of this illustrious organization. The South Eastern
25	Region is led by Dr. Tracey Morant Adams; and
26	WHEREAS, the South Eastern Region has a legacy of providing
27	exemplary service to all mankind. Through the collective efforts
28	of its members, the South Eastern Region implements programs of
29	service that transform, magnify, and accelerate communities and
30	campuses. The sorority's social advocacy agenda focuses on issues
31	that will save lives and transform communities. These efforts in
32	Mississippi are led by Mississippi Connection and Social Action
33	Coordinator Attorney Demetrice Williams Wells and the South
34	Eastern Representative to the International Connection and Social
35	Action Committee Leah J. Holder Wiggins; and
36	WHEREAS, the members of Alpha Kappa Alpha who reside in the
37	State of Mississippi have significantly contributed to local,
38	state and national programs that have made a positive impact on
39	the State of Mississippi. Their dedication, hard work and
10	commitment to providing service to the citizens of Mississippi are
11	evident by the countless hours of community service, millions of
12	dollars in financial contributions, and vocal social advocacy that

- WHEREAS, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated, has a
- 46 117-year tradition of social action. Under the sorority's current
- 47 theme, "Soaring to Greater Heights of Service and Sisterhood," the
- 48 International Connection and Social Action Committee is poised to
- 49 implement the "Advocate for Social Justice" initiative in an
- 50 effort to save lives and transform communities as advocates to
- 51 reduce suicide among our black youth and reduce the preventable
- 52 deaths of Black mothers during pregnancy and child birth. Alpha
- 53 Kappa Alpha's robust advocacy agenda was initiated during the 2022
- 54 mid-term elections and included the launch of the "Soar to the
- 55 Polls" voter engagement campaign, U.S. elections impact policy and
- 56 funding decisions regarding health care, education, environment,
- 57 voting rights, housing, public safety, and economics, among other
- 58 issues; while all votes matter in these decisions, voter
- 59 suppression is at an all-time high; the "Soar to the Polls"
- 60 campaign was developed to address voting barriers via a
- 61 three-pronged approach: Voter Education, Voter Registration, and
- 62 Voter Engagement; and
- 63 WHEREAS, these efforts in Mississippi are led by the South
- 64 Eastern Representative, Tracey Morant Adams, to the International
- 65 Connection and Social Action Committee Leah J. Holder Wiggins,
- 66 Mississippi Connection and Social Action Coordinator Attorney,

- 67 Demetrice Williams Wells and the Mississippi Connection and Social
- 68 Action Committee; and
- 69 WHEREAS, with 36 graduate and undergraduate chapters in the
- 70 State of Mississippi, Alpha Kappa Alpha members continue to
- 71 Empower Our Families, Build Our Economic Wealth, Enhance Our
- 72 Environment, Advocate for Social Justice, and Uplift Our Local
- 73 Community as they strengthen the bonds to support their service
- 74 mission; and
- 75 WHEREAS, we acknowledge the contributions of Alpha Kappa
- 76 Alpha Sorority, Inc., whose members devote their talents, time and
- 77 energy in excess of 2.5 million hours of community service
- 78 advancing effective initiatives fostering a better and equal
- 79 quality of life for all individuals, especially the individuals of
- 80 the great State of Mississippi:
