2 3 4	COMMUNITY COLLEGE (PRCC) LADY WILDCATS CHEER TEAM AND HEAD COACH SARAH SMITH FOR WINNING THEIR THIRD UCA NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP IN FOUR YEARS.
5	WHEREAS, the Pearl River Community College (PRCC) Cheer Team
6	continued to set the bar high on the national stage, winning its
7	third UCA National Championship in four years; and
8	WHEREAS, the Lady Wildcats, under the direction of Head Coach
9	Sarah Smith, first struck gold on January 19, 2025, winning the
10	2025 All-Girl Game Day Championship; and
11	WHEREAS, "We came into this weekend with four goals, and we
12	checked each one off the list," Pearl River Cheer Coach Sarah
13	Smith said. "Our goals were to make game day finals, to hit in
14	game day finals, to make traditional finals, and to hit in
15	traditional finals. We were content with letting the results take
16	care of themselves if we accomplished those goals"; and
17	WHEREAS, in their second year competing in the Game Day
18	competition, the Wildcats held onto a minuscule half-point lead
19	heading into the Game Day finals. Not ones to rest on their

- 20 laurels, Pearl River delivered a nearly flawless routine and
- 21 captured the All-Girl Game Day National Championship by two
- 22 points, its third National Championship in team history. "This is
- 23 only our second year to take on the game day portion of the
- 24 competition," Coach Smith said. "It's a big task, and splitting
- 25 our time at home between two routines can be challenging. Winning
- 26 our first Game Day National Championship was very exciting and
- 27 fulfilling"; and
- 28 WHEREAS, the Wildcats followed their championship performance
- 29 impressively by capturing second place in the All-Girl Traditional
- 30 Championship on January 20, 2025; and
- 31 WHEREAS, Pearl River won back-to-back national championships
- 32 in 2022 and 2023 while placing second in the Game Day competition
- 33 in 2024. "I'm extremely proud of the team and how much work they
- 34 put into preparing for this weekend," Coach Smith said. "We are at
- 35 practice throughout the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays; the
- 36 girls sacrifice a lot and choose to commit themselves to their
- 37 sport. It was an honor to represent Pearl River at College
- 38 Nationals, and we are proud to be adding a third title to the
- 39 cheer program"; and
