SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 94

- A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE TUPELO HIGH SCHOOL LADY WAVE GIRLS BASKETBALL TEAM AND HEAD COACH MATT JUSTICE FOR THEIR SECOND CONSECUTIVE MHSAA CLASS 7A STATE CHAMPIONSHIP.
- WHEREAS, on February 27, 2025, the Tupelo High School Lady
- 5 Wave Girls Basketball Team won its second consecutive Class 7A
- 6 State Championship, defeating Starkville 62-57 in overtime.
- 7 Tupelo trailed by as many as 13 points in the game before rallying
- 8 in the second half to secure the victory; and
- 9 WHEREAS, in Tupelo's semifinal game against Northwest Rankin,
- 10 the Lady Wave had trailed early by double digits. This was a
- 11 similar situation Tupelo was in during the MHSAA Class 7A
- 12 Championship game, down nine points at halftime. That recent
- 13 experience led Tupelo to mount a second-half comeback and defend
- 14 its Class 7A state title with a 62-57 overtime win over Starkville
- 15 at the Mississippi Coliseum; and
- 16 WHEREAS, the championship win is Tupelo girls basketball's
- 17 first back-to-back state championship; and

- 18 WHEREAS, "It was a dog fight," said Tupelo Senior Jade
- 19 Rucker, who led Tupelo (29-4) with 22 points and 12 rebounds. "We
- 20 were down in the first half. We came in and we prepared ourselves
- 21 for moments like this." Tupelo's biggest deficit came late in the
- 22 second quarter, when the team trailed 20-7, trailing at halftime
- 23 24-15; and
- 24 WHEREAS, the Class 7A State Championship game marked the
- 25 fourth time Tupelo and Starkville faced each other this season.
- 26 "We knew them. They knew us. It was just whether or not we were
- 27 stopping them from doing what they do best," Coach Justice said.
- 28 "That is getting in the paint and getting rebounds. In the second
- 29 half, we just picked up the pace and put pressure on the ball so
- 30 they weren't able to set up their offense"; and
- 31 WHEREAS, the 2024-2025 Tupelo Girls Championship Basketball
