SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 99

- 1 A RESOLUTION COMMEMORATING THE LEGACY OF THE LATE MISSISSIPPI 2 REPRESENTATIVE ICEY DAY FROM ATTALA COUNTY, THE "FATHER OF THE 3 MISSISSIPPI INDUSTRIES FOR THE BLIND," ON THE 70TH ANNIVERSARY OF 4 HIS PASSING AND COMMENDING THE IMPORTANT FUNCTION OF MIB AS THE 5 PREFERRED EMPLOYER OF INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE VISUALLY IMPAIRED. 6 WHEREAS, we join the employees, administrators and supporters
- 7 of the Mississippi Industries for the Blind in remembering the
- 8 legacy of its founder, Mississippi Representative Icey Day from
- 9 Attala County, on the 70th Anniversary of his passing on December
- 10 21, 1955; and
- WHEREAS, in 1928, the Mississippi Commission for the Blind 11
- 12 was formed to administer newly enacted legislation authorizing the
- state to "aid the blind, whose training is not otherwise provided 13
- for, in finding employment." In 1942, a state agency, Mississippi 14
- 15 Industries for the Blind, was founded through legislation to
- provide employment and training for Mississippians who are blind 16
- 17 or visually impaired; and
- WHEREAS, the mission of Mississippi Industries for the Blind 18
- 19 (MIB) is to be the preferred employer of Mississippians who are

- 20 blind or visually impaired throughout the entire State of
- 21 Mississippi. MIB is the leader in providing service to
- 22 individuals who are blind or visually impaired regarding the
- 23 available assistance and technology that can enhance independence
- 24 and self-reliance in their careers and personal lives; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Icey Wiley Day (July 1, 1891 December 21, 1955),
- 26 who was blind, was a longtime Democratic member of the Mississippi
- 27 House of Representatives, representing Attala County.
- 28 Representative Day was elected to the Mississippi House of
- 29 Representatives, representing his native Attala County as a
- 30 Democrat, for the first time in 1915. He was elected again and
- 31 served the terms of 1932-1936, 1936-1940, 1944-1948, and 1948-
- 32 1952. During his tenure, he founded the Mississippi Industries
- 33 for the Blind; and
- 34 WHEREAS, at the time of his passing, the following tributes
- 35 appeared in The Clarion Ledger:
- The tragic and untimely passing of Representative Icey W.
- 37 Day, Mississippi's distinguished legislator from Attala County,
- 38 represents a distinct loss to progressive government. Although
- 39 blind for the greater portion of his life, this handicap in no way
- 40 impaired his long and useful service to the people of this state.
- 41 Representative Day served as counselor for vocational
- 42 rehabilitation work for the blind of our state, his monument to
- 43 his memory. Nor were the efforts of this gentle and lovable
- 44 personality limited to that particular field. Throughout his

- 45 entire public service career, he worked tirelessly and brilliantly
- 46 in all movements for the betterment of Attala County and the State
- 47 of Mississippi. Icey W. Day's concept of duty and service has few
- 48 parallels in the history of his county. As a member of the
- 49 Legislature, as a Christian and as a father and husband, his
- 50 record is without blemish. His tenacity of purpose and devotion
- 51 to others stamp him as one to be remembered as one of
- 52 Mississippi's greatest and most useful sons. His counsel and
- 153 leadership will be sorely missed by those he served so well"; and
- 54 WHEREAS, the Jackson Daily News stated: "No man in either
- 55 House or Senate was more genuinely loved. To Icey Day of Attala
- 56 belongs a large share of the credit for construction of the
- 57 magnificent group of buildings now occupied by the State School
- 58 for the Blind and the State School for the Deaf. These two
- 59 institutions will long stand as monuments to his memory"; and
- 60 WHEREAS, it is with great respect that we remember the legacy
- of a great Mississippian whose ambition was to respect fellow
- 62 employees for their abilities to perform in the workplace and to
- 63 uphold the trust to maintain a safe and productive workplace for
- 64 all Mississippians:
- 65 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 66 MISSISSIPPI, That we do hereby commemorate the legacy of the late
- 67 Mississippi Representative Icey Day from Attala County, the
- 68 "Father of the Mississippi Industries for the Blind," on the 70th
- 69 Anniversary of his passing and commend the important function of

- 70 MIB as the preferred employer of individuals who are visually
- 71 impaired.
- 72 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution be presented to
- 73 the Executive Director of the Mississippi Industries for the
- 74 Blind, forwarded to the Governor, the Icey W. Day Memorial
- 75 Building of the Mississippi Industries for the Blind, and made
- 76 available to the Capitol Press Corps.
