House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 3017

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

Services for Fiscal Year 2027 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2026 funds 47 48 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 budget by the Mississippi 49 50 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's 51 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board 52 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may 53 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year 2026 that may be utilized to fill vacant Fiscal Year 2025 54 55 headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that 56 the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount 57 and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments 58 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current 59 employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee 60 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the Mississippi State Personnel Board. 61

62 Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and 63 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to 64 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2026 do 65 66 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. Ιf 67 the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 projected cost exceeds the 68 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the 69 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be 70 essential for the agency.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or

73 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 74 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written 75 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The 76 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 77 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 78 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 79 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

SECTION 5. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

SECTION 7. Any person within the Department of Mental Health who must work on a statutory holiday or any holiday proclaimed by the Governor may, at the discretion of the Director of the

Institution and the Executive Director of the Department of Mental Health and within available personnel funds, be paid "call-back pay" in lieu of "compensatory time credit."

206 **SECTION 8.** Of the funds appropriated to the "Service 207 Budget," funds are included for the support of community mental 208 health services for Fiscal Year 2026.

Provided, however, that none of the funds appropriated for 209 210 the support of community mental health services shall be made 211 available to any Regional Mental Health/Intellectual Disability Center which does not receive from each of its participating 212 213 counties a dollar amount equivalent to what the proceeds of a 214 three-fourths (3/4) mill tax on all taxable property in the county 215 in Fiscal Year 1982 would have been or the amount of funds 216 contributed to the center by the county in Fiscal Year 1984, whichever shall be greater. By means of performance contracts, 217 218 the Department of Mental Health shall disburse the funds 219 appropriated in this section for services for the mentally ill, 220 intellectually disabled and alcohol/drug abusers. The State Board 221 of Mental Health and the Department of Mental Health shall be responsible for selecting the types of services which shall be 222 223 provided with the funds appropriated in this section, for 224 developing and monitoring performance contracts and for holding 225 contractors accountable for utilization of funds.

SECTION 9. Ellisville State School is authorized to draw up to Four Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$450,000.00) from interest earned on funds invested in Ellisville State School Client's Trust S. B. 3017

Fund for the purpose of supplementing the cost related to supplies, property, and equipment in direct care.

231 SECTION 10. The Department of Mental Health and its 232 facilities shall have the express legal authority, within funding 233 and spending authority appropriated under the provisions of this 234 act to purchase land for use by residential facilities operated by 235 the department, either directly or by means of transferring funds 236 to the Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property Management, 237 and to transfer such funds to the Bureau of Building, Grounds, and 238 Real Property Management for the purposes of constructing and 239 equipping group homes for persons with mental illness, 240 intellectual disability, and/or substance abuse; constructing and 241 equipping such other buildings as may be required for treatment of 242 persons with mental illness, intellectual disability, and/or substance abuse; repair and renovate existing buildings; and to 243 244 construct, repair and/or renovate employee housing. Any 245 intermediate care facilities for individuals with intellectual 246 disabilities (ICF/IID) constructed with funds authorized in this 247 section shall be authorized to participate in Medicaid funding available for such services. 248

249 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 250 Department of Mental Health shall maintain complete accounting and 251 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 252 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the 253 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 254 2025. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the 258 s. B. 3017 259 PAGE 10 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2027 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request process.

259 SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that none 260 of the funds provided herein shall be used to pay certain 261 utilities for state-furnished housing for any employees. Such 262 utilities shall include electricity, natural gas, butane, propane, 263 cable and phone services. Where actual cost cannot be determined, 264 the agency shall be required to provide meters to be in compliance 265 with legislative intent. Such state-furnished housing shall 266 include single-family and multifamily residences but shall not 267 include any dormitory residences. Allowances for such utilities 268 shall be prohibited.

269 SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 270 Executive Director of the Department of Mental Health shall have 271 authority to transfer cash from one special fund treasury fund to 272 another special fund treasury fund under the control of the 273 Department of Mental Health. The purpose of this authority is to 274 more efficiently use available cash reserves. It is further the 275 intention of the Legislature that the Executive Director of the 276 Department of Mental Health shall submit written justification for 277 the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office and the Department of Finance and Administration. None of the funds transferred with 278 279 this section may be transferred to the Central Office for Personal 280 Services.

281 SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions 282 of this act, Twenty-nine Million Seven Hundred Ninety Thousand One 283 Hundred Thirteen Dollars (\$29,790,113.00) is provided to the 284 Department of Mental Health to expand those community-based 285 services that will improve the State of Mississippi's compliance 286 with the Olmstead decision of the United States Supreme Court. 287 Further, it is the intention of the Legislature that the 288 Department of Mental Health shall have the authority to transfer 289 such sums from this source as are necessary to implement or 290 improve those community services that are more appropriately 291 addressed by the Mississippi Department of Education and/or the 292 Mississippi Department of Rehabilitation Services to those 293 agencies for that purpose. Further, it is the intention of the 294 Legislature that any sums received from this source that are not 295 expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, by the 296 Mississippi Department of Mental Health shall be reappropriated 297 for the same purpose during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026. 298 Further, it is the intention of the Legislature that the 299 Department of Mental Health shall account for the expenditure of 300 these funds in sufficient detail to clearly show the purposes for 301 which such funds were expended. The Executive Director of the 302 Department of Mental Health shall report any such reappropriation 303 to the Legislative Budget Office no later than fifteen (15) days 304 after the effective date of the reappropriation.

305 **SECTION 15.** Of the funds appropriated in this act, the 306 Department of Mental Health, with approval by the board, may S. B. 3017 PAGE 12 307 contract with Community Mental Health Centers, or suitable 308 entities, for the purpose of operating the Crisis Stabilization 309 Units at Grenada, Batesville, Brookhaven, Cleveland, Corinth, 310 Laurel and Newton. The department shall provide quarterly 311 progress reports on the operation of the Crisis Stabilization 312 Units to the Chairmen of the Senate and House Public Health and 313 Appropriations Committees.

314 SECTION 16. It is the intention of the Legislature that 315 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 316 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 317 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 318 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 319 320 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 321 made without competitive bids.

322 SECTION 17. The Department of Finance and Administration 323 (DFA) shall transfer funds back to the Department of Mental 324 Health, upon the request of the Department of Mental Health, where 325 the funds received by DFA from the Department of Mental Health 326 were special funds (neither general funds or bond funds) and where 327 those funds are not required for the payment of costs already 328 incurred on a building or repair project. For the purposes of 329 this section, the term "special funds" includes any state source 330 special funds, including, but not limited to, funds from the 331 Health Care Expendable Fund. The duty of DFA to transfer funds 332 back to the Department of Mental Health under this section applies S. B. 3017 PAGE 13

333 to any funds described in this section that were transferred to 334 DFA, regardless of the year that the transfer was made by the 335 Department of Mental Health.

336 **SECTION 18.** None of the funds provided in Section 1, 2, or 3 337 of this act shall be used to pay Medicaid match for the eleven 338 (11) Community Mental Health Centers.

339 SECTION 19. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this 340 act, it is the intention of the Legislature that Three Million 341 Nine Hundred Ten Thousand Seven Hundred Two Dollars 342 (\$3,910,702.00) shall be allocated to the Crisis Intervention 343 Mental Health Fund supported by General Fund court assessments.

344 SECTION 20. Of the funds appropriated in this act, the 345 Department of Mental Health shall fund ten (10) Programs of 346 Assertive Community Treatment (PACT) Teams and provide supportive 347 employment for individuals with intellectual and developmental 348 disabilities.

349 SECTION 21. Notwithstanding any other provision, the 350 Department of Mental Health shall have the authority to escalate 351 its headcount for any additional operational needs related to 352 Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Funds upon approval of the 353 Department of Finance and Administration and the State Personnel 354 Board.

355 SECTION 22. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 and 356 Section 2 of this act, it is the intention of the Legislature that 357 continued funding at or above the Fiscal Year 2025 appropriated

358 amount shall be provided for Three Thousand (3,000) slots in the 359 ID/DD Home and Community Based Waiver program.

360 SECTION 23. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 361 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Capital 362 Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated for the Department of 363 Mental Health for the purpose of reauthorizing the expenditure of 364 Capital Expense Fund, as appropriated in SB 3162, 2024 Regular 365 Session, to the Department of Mental Health for the purpose of 366 entering into a subgrant with Canopy Children's Solutions for the 367 construction and renovation of the CARES Center, including the children and youth Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facility for 368 369 Trauma Recovery, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and 370 ending June 30, 2026.....\$ 20,000,000.00.

Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section, the amount that may be expended under the authority of this section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds remaining as of June 30, 2025, from the amount authorized for the previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation shall not change the purpose for which the funds were originally authorized.

377 **SECTION 24.** With the funds appropriated herein, the 378 Department of Mental Health is authorized to make payment for 379 expenses incurred during Fiscal Year 2023 as follows:

383 **SECTION 25.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 384 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 385 386 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 387 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law. 388 SECTION 26. This act shall take effect and be in force from 389 390 and after July 1, 2025.
