## House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 3018

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

## AMENDMENT NO. 1

## Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be			
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury			
7	to the credit of the Office of State Aid Road Construction Fund,			
8	for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Office of State			
9	Aid Road Construction of the Mississippi Department of			
10	Transportation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and			
11	ending June 30, 2026\$ 220,376,205.00.			
12	SECTION 2. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of			
13	this act, the following positions are authorized:

15	Permanent: 54			
16	Time-Limited: 0			
17	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's			
18	responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal			
19	Services for Fiscal Year 2027 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2026 funds			
20	appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are			
21	added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 budget by the Mississippi			
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22 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's 23 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board 24 The agency's personal services appropriation may shall publish. 25 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year 2026 that may be utilized to fill vacant Fiscal Year 2025 26 27 headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount 28 29 and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments 30 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee 31 32 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the 33 Mississippi State Personnel Board.

34 Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current 35 36 employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to 37 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2026 do 38 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 projected cost exceeds the 39 40 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the 41 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be 42 essential for the agency.

Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
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48 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 49 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 50 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 51 appropriated level.

52 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be 53 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for 54 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are 55 withdrawn and no longer available.

None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

60 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act, it is the intention of the Legislature that an amount not to 61 62 exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) is authorized 63 to be expended from funds received from the Mississippi 64 Development Authority as reimbursements for actual expenses incurred by the Office of State Aid Road Construction for 65 66 administering and providing engineering services to political 67 subdivisions as authorized under Section 65-4-15, Mississippi Code 68 of 1972. Any such funds shall be deposited into the Office of 69 State Aid Roads Administrative Fund for the fiscal year beginning 70 July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026.

71 SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is the 72 intention of the Legislature that an amount not to exceed Forty 73 Million Dollars (\$40,000,000.00) is authorized to be expended for S. B. 3018 PAGE 3 74 the purpose of replacement of structurally deficient bridges on 75 the Local System Bridge Program (LSBP).

76 SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 77 Office of State Aid Road Construction shall maintain complete 78 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all 79 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be 80 in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal 81 Year 2025. It is further the intention of the Legislature that 82 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2027 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format 83 84 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail 85 provided during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request process.

SECTION 6. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

137 A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets 138 set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the 139 agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget 140 Committee for Fiscal Year 2027.

141 SECTION 7. With the funds appropriated in this act, the 142 Office of State Aid Road Construction shall notify members of the Mississippi Senate and House of Representatives upon the award of 143 144 projects within their respective districts and at least five (5) 145 days prior to a public ceremony announcing the award of any grant in their district or any public announcement or ceremony regarding 146 147 the groundbreaking or opening of a facility, roadway or bridge for which the Legislature has made funds available. Any signage 148 149 regarding any public event or any new facility, roadway or bridge 150 shall include the following language: "Funds were made available 151 for this project by the Mississippi State Legislature." The S. B. 3018

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152 signage shall further state the four-year legislative term in 153 which the project was funded.

154 SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature to 155 authorize the State Aid Engineer to utilize funds available to the 156 Office of State Aid Road Construction, from any source herein 157 appropriated or made available by the counties or any other 158 source, to pay for costs necessary to comply with the National 159 Bridge Inspection Standards and the Federal Highway 160 Administration's requirements for bridge inspections and/or 161 special studies necessary to comply with federal laws. The State 162 Aid Engineer shall follow the same procedures as have heretofore 163 been established by Sections 65-9-9, 65-9-15 and 65-9-17, 164 Mississippi Code of 1972, for payment of such costs. The Office 165 of State Aid Road Construction may accept, budget and expend these 166 funds subject to and in accordance with rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner 167 168 consistent with the escalation of federal or state funds.

169 SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that in 170 the letting of contracts for which the Office of State Aid Road 171 Construction administers and provides engineering services to 172 political subdivisions under the Economic Development Highway Act, 173 bids may be made from the lowest and best bidder after advertising 174 for competitive sealed bids once in a newspaper published or 175 having a circulation in the county or municipality where the 176 contract will be performed, and the date published for the bid

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179 SECTION 10. The State Engineer is hereby authorized to 180 transfer funds between any programs designated herein for the 181 administration, planning, construction, maintenance, or inspection 182 of Mississippi roads and bridges, provided that such transfers do 183 not exceed twenty percent (20%) of the total fund allocated for 184 this purpose. The State Aid Engineer shall submit written 185 notification to the State Fiscal Officer and the Legislative 186 Budget Office prior to executing any such transfer, detailing the 187 amount and purpose of the transfer.

188 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that 189 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 190 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 191 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 192 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 193 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 194 195 made without competitive bids.

196 SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 197 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with 198 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency 199 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their 200 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally 201 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for 202 actions contrary to this provision.

Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Project Poppy Fund, as created in Section 57-1-631, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office. These funds are provided for expediting services needed for Project Poppy.

210 **SECTION 14.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 211 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 212 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 213 214 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 215 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 216 SECTION 15. This act shall take effect and be in force from 217 and after July 1, 2025.
