

House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 3032

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

7 **SECTION 1.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
8 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the State
9 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
10 defraying the expenses of the Mississippi Emergency Management
11 Agency in accordance with the provisions of Section 33-15-1 et
12 seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year beginning
13 July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026.....\$ 5,601,056.00.

14 **SECTION 2.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
15 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special
16 fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi
17 Emergency Management Agency which is comprised of special source
18 funds collected by or otherwise available to the agency, for the
19 support and maintenance of the agency for the fiscal year
20 beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026.....
21\$ 21,580,587.00.

22 **SECTION 3.** Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2 of
23 this act, the following positions are authorized:

24 AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:

25 Permanent: 113

26 Time-Limited: 66

27 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
28 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
29 Services for Fiscal Year 2027 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2026 funds
30 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
31 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 budget by the Mississippi
32 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's
33 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board
34 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may
35 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year
36 2026 that may be utilized to fill vacant Fiscal Year 2025
37 headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that
38 the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount
39 and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments
40 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current
41 employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee
42 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the
43 Mississippi State Personnel Board.

44 Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and
45 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current
46 employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to
47 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2026 do
48 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If
49 the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 projected cost exceeds the

50 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the
51 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be
52 essential for the agency.

53 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
54 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
55 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
56 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
57 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
58 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
59 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
60 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
61 appropriated level.

62 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
63 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for
64 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are
65 withdrawn and no longer available.

66 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
67 violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
68 relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
69 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

70 **SECTION 4.** In addition to all other sums herein
71 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be
72 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
73 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Mississippi
74 Emergency Management Agency for the purpose of defraying certain
75 administrative expenses and the state share of the cost of

76 disaster assistance programs, including, but not being limited to,
77 public assistance programs, individual and family grant programs,
78 and mitigation programs, for the fiscal year beginning
79 July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026.....\$ 585,056.00.

80 **SECTION 5.** In addition to all other sums herein
81 appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be
82 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
83 Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Emergency Management
84 Agency Fund Nos. 33703, 3725, 3728, 372U, 3729, 37AH, 53730,
85 6820174300, and 58202 for the purpose of defraying certain
86 administrative expenses and the state and federal share of the
87 cost of disaster assistance programs, including, but not being
88 limited to, public assistance programs, individual and family
89 grant programs, and mitigation programs, for the fiscal year
90 beginning July 1, 2025, and ending
91 June 30, 2026.....\$ 442,674,787.00.

92 **SECTION 6.** The funds appropriated under the provisions of
93 Sections 4 and 5 of this act are provided to defray certain
94 administrative expenses and the state and federal share of the
95 cost of disaster assistance programs, including public assistance
96 programs, individual and family grant programs, and mitigation
97 programs resulting from, but not being limited to, the following:

SECTION 7. None of the funds appropriated in Section 4 of this act shall be used to establish a special reserve fund in the State Treasury for disaster relief except as provided for in Section 33-15-307, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency may, upon the request of a local public emergency management organization in an area which has suffered a natural disaster, supply equipment to rural water associations to enable their continued operation when the local emergency management organization determines that such private entities provide services essential to the welfare of the community.

SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall provide enhanced training to local governments, supervisors, mayors, civil defense groups and municipal associations in disaster management.

SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 2025. It is further the intention of the Legislature that

the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2027 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request process.

SECTION 11. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized, this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted performance measures provided below:

205 **SECTION 14.** It is the intention of the Legislature that from
206 any funds appropriated in this act, the agency shall maintain a
207 minimum of nine (9) Area Coordinators to provide daily assistance
208 to local jurisdictions with emergency management activities as
209 well as to provide quicker response to incidents and/or disasters.
210 In addition, it is the intent of the Legislature that these Area
211 Coordinators shall reside in or within fifty (50) miles of their
212 assigned districts.

213 **SECTION 15.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
214 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
215 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
216 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
217 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
218 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
219 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
220 made without competitive bids.

221 **SECTION 16.** With funds appropriated herein, the Mississippi
222 Emergency Management Agency is authorized to make reimbursement
223 payments directly to individual Mississippi citizens who have been
224 or will be approved to participate in the Federal Emergency
225 Management Agency's Safe Room Grant Program. All funds paid by
226 the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency under this program
227 will be reimbursed to the Agency by the Federal Emergency
228 Management Agency.

229 **SECTION 17.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
230 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Capital

231 Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Mississippi
232 Emergency Management Agency for the purpose of reauthorizing the
233 expenditure of Capital Expense Funds for the purpose of defraying
234 the expenses for vehicle purchases, as authorized in Senate Bill
235 No. 3040, 2024 Regular Session, for the fiscal year beginning
236 July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026.....\$ 47,563.00.

237 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
238 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
239 section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
240 remaining as of June 30, 2025, from the amount authorized for the
241 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation shall not
242 change the purpose for which the funds were originally authorized.

243 **SECTION 18.** The expenditure of the funds appropriated by
244 this act shall be under the direction of the Governor and shall be
245 paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the proper fund or
246 funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State
247 Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his
248 warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or
249 officers in the manner provided by law.

250 **SECTION 19.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
251 and after July 1, 2025.
