House Amendments to Senate Bill No. 3032

TO THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE HOUSE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

7	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
8	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the State
9	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
10	defraying the expenses of the Mississippi Emergency Management
11	Agency in accordance with the provisions of Section 33-15-1 et
12	seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year beginning
13	July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026\$ 5,601,056.00
14	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
15	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the special
16	fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi
17	Emergency Management Agency which is comprised of special source
18	funds collected by or otherwise available to the agency, for the
19	support and maintenance of the agency for the fiscal year
20	beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026
21	\$ 21,580,587.00
22	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated in Sections 1 and 2 of
23	this act, the following positions are authorized:

27 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 28 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal 29 Services for Fiscal Year 2027 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2026 funds 30 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 budget by the Mississippi 31 32 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board 33 34 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may

35 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year

36 2026 that may be utilized to fill vacant Fiscal Year 2025

37 headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that

the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount 38

39 and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments

40 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current

employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee 41

42 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the

43 Mississippi State Personnel Board.

> Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2026 do not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If

49 the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 projected cost exceeds the

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- 50 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the
- 51 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be
- 52 essential for the agency.
- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 54 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
- 55 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 56 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 57 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 58 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 59 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions
- 60 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the

- 132 this act shall be used to establish a special reserve fund in the
- 133 State Treasury for disaster relief except as provided for in
- 134 Section 33-15-307, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 135 **SECTION 8.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 136 Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency may, upon
- 137 the request of a local public emergency management organization in
- 138 an area which has suffered a natural disaster, supply equipment to
- 139 rural water associations to enable their continued operation when
- 140 the local emergency management organization determines that such
- 141 private entities provide services essential to the welfare of the
- 142 community.
- 143 **SECTION 9.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 144 Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall
- 145 provide enhanced training to local governments, supervisors,
- 146 mayors, civil defense groups and municipal associations in
- 147 disaster management.
- 148 **SECTION 10.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 149 Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall maintain complete
- 150 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all
- 151 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be
- 152 in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal
- 153 Year 2025. It is further the intention of the Legislature that

154	the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2027 shall be		
155	submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format		
156	and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail		
157	provided during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request process.		
158	SECTION 11. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance		
159	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of		
160	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized		
161	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the		
162	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,		
163	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted		
164	performance measures provided below:

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A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets
set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the
agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget
Committee for Fiscal Year 2027.

Executive Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall have authority to transfer not more than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) from any general or special fund treasury fund and major object budget category to another special or general fund treasury fund and major object budget category accordingly under the control of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency. The purpose of this authority is to more efficiently use available cash reserves. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the Executive Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall submit written justification for the transfer to the Legislative Budget Office and the Department of Finance and Administration on or before the fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date of the

SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
Mississippi Emergency Management Agency shall submit a
notification and summary of all state support funding on all
disasters that require general funds or state support special
funds to the Legislative Budget Office.

SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that from any funds appropriated in this act, the agency shall maintain a minimum of nine (9) Area Coordinators to provide daily assistance to local jurisdictions with emergency management activities as well as to provide quicker response to incidents and/or disasters. In addition, it is the intent of the Legislature that these Area Coordinators shall reside in or within fifty (50) miles of their

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assigned districts.

213 SECTION 15. It is the intention of the Legislature that 214 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 215 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 216 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 217 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 218 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 219 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 220 made without competitive bids.

221 SECTION 16. With funds appropriated herein, the Mississippi 222 Emergency Management Agency is authorized to make reimbursement 223 payments directly to individual Mississippi citizens who have been 224 or will be approved to participate in the Federal Emergency 225 Management Agency's Safe Room Grant Program. All funds paid by 226 the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency under this program 227 will be reimbursed to the Agency by the Federal Emergency 228 Management Agency.

229 **SECTION 17.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
230 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Capital

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231	Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Mississippi
232	Emergency Management Agency for the purpose of reauthorizing the
233	expenditure of Capital Expense Funds for the purpose of defraying
234	the expenses for vehicle purchases, as authorized in Senate Bill
235	No. 3040, 2024 Regular Session, for the fiscal year beginning
236	July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026\$ 47,563.00.
237	Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
238	the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
239	section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
240	remaining as of June 30, 2025, from the amount authorized for the
241	previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation shall not
242	change the purpose for which the funds were originally authorized.
243	SECTION 18. The expenditure of the funds appropriated by
244	this act shall be under the direction of the Governor and shall be
245	paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the proper fund or
246	funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State
247	Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his
248	warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or
249	officers in the manner provided by law.
250	SECTION 19. This act shall take effect and be in force from
