COMMITTEE AMENDMENT NO 1 PROPOSED TO**

**Senate Bill No. 3018**

**BY: Committee**

**Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting  
in lieu thereof the following:**

5       **SECTION 1.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be  
6 necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury  
7 to the credit of the Office of State Aid Road Construction Fund,  
8 for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Office of State  
9 Aid Road Construction of the Mississippi Department of  
10 Transportation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and  
11 ending June 30, 2026.....\$    220,376,205.00.

12       **SECTION 2.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of  
13 this act, the following positions are authorized:

17           With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's  
18 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal  
19 Services for Fiscal Year 2027 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2026 funds  
20 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are  
21 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 budget by the Mississippi  
22 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's  
23 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board  
24 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may  
25 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year  
26 2026 that may be utilized to fill vacant Fiscal Year 2025  
27 headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that  
28 the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount  
29 and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments  
30 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current  
31 employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee  
32 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the  
33 Mississippi State Personnel Board.

34           Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and  
35 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current  
36 employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to  
37 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2026 do  
38 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If  
39 the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 projected cost exceeds the



40 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the  
41 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be  
42 essential for the agency.

43 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with  
44 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or  
45 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State  
46 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written  
47 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The  
48 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written  
49 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions  
50 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the  
51 appropriated level.

52 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be  
53 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for  
54 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are  
55 withdrawn and no longer available.

56 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in  
57 violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A  
58 relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as  
59 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

60 **SECTION 3.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this  
61 act, it is the intention of the Legislature that an amount not to  
62 exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) is authorized  
63 to be expended from funds received from the Mississippi  
64 Development Authority as reimbursements for actual expenses



65 incurred by the Office of State Aid Road Construction for  
66 administering and providing engineering services to political  
67 subdivisions as authorized under Section 65-4-15, Mississippi Code  
68 of 1972. Any such funds shall be deposited into the Office of  
69 State Aid Roads Administrative Fund for the fiscal year beginning  
70 July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026.

71 **SECTION 4.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is the  
72 intention of the Legislature that an amount not to exceed Forty  
73 Million Dollars (\$40,000,000.00) is authorized to be expended for  
74 the purpose of replacement of structurally deficient bridges on  
75 the Local System Bridge Program (LSBP).

76 **SECTION 5.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the  
77 Office of State Aid Road Construction shall maintain complete  
78 accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all  
79 funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be  
80 in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal  
81 Year 2025. It is further the intention of the Legislature that  
82 the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2027 shall be  
83 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format  
84 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail  
85 provided during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request process.

86 **SECTION 6.** In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance  
87 Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of  
88 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized  
89 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the



intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,  
this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted  
performance measures provided below:

agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee for Fiscal Year 2027.

**SECTION 7.** With the funds appropriated in this act, the Office of State Aid Road Construction shall notify members of the Mississippi Senate and House of Representatives upon the award of projects within their respective districts and at least five (5) days prior to a public ceremony announcing the award of any grant in their district or any public announcement or ceremony regarding the groundbreaking or opening of a facility, roadway or bridge for which the Legislature has made funds available. Any signage regarding any public event or any new facility, roadway or bridge shall include the following language: "Funds were made available for this project by the Mississippi State Legislature." The signage shall further state the four-year legislative term in which the project was funded.

**SECTION 8.** It is the intention of the Legislature to authorize the State Aid Engineer to utilize funds available to the Office of State Aid Road Construction, from any source herein appropriated or made available by the counties or any other source, to pay for costs necessary to comply with the National Bridge Inspection Standards and the Federal Highway Administration's requirements for bridge inspections and/or special studies necessary to comply with federal laws. The State Aid Engineer shall follow the same procedures as have heretofore been established by Sections 65-9-9, 65-9-15 and 65-9-17,



Mississippi Code of 1972, for payment of such costs. The Office of State Aid Road Construction may accept, budget and expend these funds subject to and in accordance with rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of federal or state funds.

**SECTION 9.** It is the intention of the Legislature that in the letting of contracts for which the Office of State Aid Road Construction administers and provides engineering services to political subdivisions under the Economic Development Highway Act, bids may be made from the lowest and best bidder after advertising for competitive sealed bids once in a newspaper published or having a circulation in the county or municipality where the contract will be performed, and the date published for the bid opening may be not less than seven (7) working days after the advertisement is published.

**SECTION 10.** The State Engineer is hereby authorized to transfer funds between any programs designated herein for the administration, planning, construction, maintenance, or inspection of Mississippi roads and bridges, provided that such transfers do not exceed twenty percent (20%) of the total fund allocated for this purpose. The State Aid Engineer shall submit written notification to the State Fiscal Officer and the Legislative Budget Office prior to executing any such transfer, detailing the amount and purpose of the transfer.



188           **SECTION 11.** It is the intention of the Legislature that  
189 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the  
190 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things  
191 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,  
192 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind  
193 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to  
194 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are  
195 made without competitive bids.

196           **SECTION 12.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the  
197 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with  
198 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency  
199 shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their  
200 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally  
201 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for  
202 actions contrary to this provision.

203           **SECTION 13.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Fifty  
204 Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00), or so much thereof as may be  
205 necessary, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury  
206 to the credit of the Project Poppy Fund, as created in Section  
207 57-1-631, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as  
208 determined by the Treasurer's Office. These funds are provided  
209 for expediting services needed for Project Poppy.

210           **SECTION 14.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by  
211 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the  
212 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon



213 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal  
214 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the  
215 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

216       **SECTION 15.** This act shall take effect and be in force from  
217 and after July 1, 2025.
