5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be

L 4	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
15	necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any special
16	source funds, which are collected by or otherwise become available
17	for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the State Department
18	of Agriculture and Commerce, including the Divisions of Support
19	and Plant Industry, Farmers Central Market, Fair Commission,
20	Livestock Coliseum, Industrial Showcase, Agriculture Museum, the
21	Fairgrounds, Dixie National Rodeo and Trade Mart Building for the
22	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026
23	\$ 19,222,733.00.
24	The funds authorized for expenditure under the provisions of
25	this section include subscription fees produced from the Market
26	Bulletin and admission fees produced from the Mississippi
27	Agriculture and Forestry Museum.
28	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
29	this act, the following positions are authorized:

32	Time-Limited: 13
33	With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
34	responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal
35	Services for Fiscal Year 2027 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2026 funds
36	appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are
37	added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 budget by the Mississippi
38	Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's

- 39 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board
- 40 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may
- 41 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year
- 42 2026 that may be utilized to fill vacant Fiscal Year 2025
- 43 headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that
- 44 the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount
- 45 and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments
- 46 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current
- 47 employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee
- 48 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the
- 49 Mississippi State Personnel Board.
- Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and
- 51 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current
- 52 employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to
- 53 ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2026 do
- 54 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If
- 55 the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 projected cost exceeds the
- 56 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the
- 57 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be
- 58 essential for the agency.
- 59 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 60 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
- 61 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 62 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 63 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The

68	No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
69	used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for

72	None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
73	violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
74	relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
75	interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
76	SECTION 4. In addition to all other sums herein
77	appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be
78	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
79	Treasury to the credit of the Beaver Control Program or from any
80	other special source funds made available to the Beaver Control
81	Program, to the Department of Agriculture and Commerce for the
82	support of the Beaver Control Program for the fiscal year

193 agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget

Committee for Fiscal Year 2027.

SECTION 8. The funds appropriated and authorized to be expended under the provisions of this act shall be expended for the purpose of defraying all expenses incurred by the State Department of Agriculture and Commerce in the operation of all programs and activities (except operation of the State Lime Plants, Veterinary Laboratory, Pink Bollworm-Plant Quarantine Inspection Stations and Fire Ant Program) authorized to be conducted and carried on by said department; including, but not limited to: the administration of the Feed, Fertilizer and Dairy Act; the Weights and Measures Act; the Meat Inspection Act of 1968; the Mississippi Pure Seed Law; and the following additional programs and activities: enforcement of the egg law; publication and distribution of the Mississippi Market Bulletin, agricultural statistics, market news service at Stoneville, Mississippi; and inspection, grading and certifying of fruits, vegetables, hay, grain, meat and meat products, milk and dairy products, pecans, seed and syrup.

212 **SECTION 9.** The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and 213 Commerce, with the assistance of the State Department of Audit and

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- 214 the Department of Finance and Administration, shall establish a
- 215 budgeted enterprise funds for all "for-profit" activities related
- 216 to the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum. The funds
- 217 shall be maintained in accordance with generally accepted
- 218 accounting principles and regulations prescribed by the Department
- 219 of Finance and Administration.
- 220 **SECTION 10.** Of the funds provided by the provisions of this
- 221 act, it is the intent of the Legislature that not more than Thirty
- 222 Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00) shall be expended for the
- 223 Mississippi Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Pilot Program, which
- 224 shall be established by the State Department of Agriculture and
- 225 Commerce to serve senior citizens above sixty (60) years of age
- 226 who fall within one hundred thirty percent (130%) of the poverty
- 227 level. The Commissioner of Agriculture may promulgate rules and
- 228 regulations necessary to implement the Mississippi Senior Farmers'
- 229 Market Nutrition Pilot Program.
- 230 **SECTION 11.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this
- 231 act, Four Hundred Thousand (\$400,000.00), is provided for matching
- 232 funds required for the Mississippi Healthy Food and Families
- 233 Program as established in Senate Bill No. 2077, 2022 Regular
- 234 Session.
- 235 **SECTION 12.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 236 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 237 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 238 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,



239	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
240	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
241	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
242	made without competitive bids.
243	SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the

Department of Agriculture and Commerce shall maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 2025. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2027 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request process.

264	SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this
265	act, Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand (\$750,000.00), or so much
266	thereof as may be necessary, is provided for operational
267	expenditures at the Mississippi Agriculture and Forestry Museum.
268	The department may expend these funds for improvements to the
269	museum and for marketing and promotion programs for the museum ir
270	a manner consistent with the museum's historical purpose.
271	SECTION 16. The Mississippi Department of Agriculture and
272	Commerce is authorized to accept and expend any grant, donation,
273	or contribution from any individual, public, or private

organization, or government entity for purposes of defraying the operational costs of the department. Such grants, donations or contributions shall be received and expended under the rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds not to exceed One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00).

The Commissioner of Agriculture shall notify, in writing, the Lieutenant Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Chairman of the Senate Appropriations Committee, the Chairman of the House Appropriations A Committee, and the Legislative Budget Office of any escalation. The written notification shall include the justification for the escalation of funds, the amount, and how the funds will be used. This written notification shall be sent on or before the fifteenth day of the month prior to the effective date of the escalation.

SECTION 17. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.
SECTION 18. This act shall take effect and be in force from
and after July 1, 2025.
