Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 608

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

11 SECTION 1. Section 73-13-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 12 amended as follows: 73-13-5. A Board of Licensure for Professional Engineers and 13 14 Surveyors is hereby created whose duty it shall be to administer the provisions of Sections 73-13-1 through 73-13-105. The board 15 16 shall consist of six (6) licensed professional engineers * * * and 17 three (3) licensed professional surveyors, who are not licensed professional engineers, * * * all of whom shall have the 18 qualifications required by Section 73-13-77. The members of the 19 20 board shall be appointed * * * by the Governor from a list of 21 nominees of licensed professional engineers and of licensed 22 professional surveyors drawn from state engineering societies or 23 councils that are affiliated with national organizations and from 24 state surveying societies or associations that are affiliated with 25 national organizations. Such societies, councils or associations 26 may provide a list of nominees for consideration no less than 27 ninety (90) days before the expiration of a board member's term.

The board so appointed shall have two (2) engineer members

- 29 from each of the three (3) state Supreme Court districts,
- 30 designated by district, Post 1 and Post 2, and shall serve for
- 31 four (4) years, or until their successors are duly appointed and
- 32 qualified. The surveyor members * * * shall be appointed from
- 33 each of the three (3) state Supreme Court districts and serve for
- 34 four (4) years, or until their successors are duly appointed and
- 35 qualified. Each member of the board shall receive a certificate
- 36 of appointment from the Governor, and before beginning his term of
- 37 office he shall file with the Secretary of State the
- 38 constitutional oath of office. On the expiration of the term of
- 39 any member, the Governor shall in the manner herein provided
- 40 appoint for a term of four (4) years a licensed professional
- 41 engineer having the qualifications required by Section 73-13-7, or
- 42 a licensed professional surveyor having the qualifications
- 43 required by Section 73-13-77 to take the place of the member of
- 44 the board whose term is about to expire. Each member shall hold
- 45 office until the expiration of the term for which such member is
- 46 appointed or until a successor shall have been duly appointed and
- 47 shall have qualified.
- The initial members of the reconstituted board shall serve
- 49 terms of office as follows:
- 50 (a) The term of the engineer member presently serving
- 51 at large, which term was set to expire on April 8, 2004, shall
- 52 expire on July 1, 2004; and from and after July 1, 2004, this
- 53 appointment shall be designated as Post 1.

- 54 (b) The term of the engineer member presently serving
- 55 at large, which term was set to expire on April 8, 2004, shall
- 56 expire on July 1, 2005; and from and after July 1, 2004, this
- 57 appointment shall be designated as Post 2.
- (c) An appointment of an engineer member serving at
- 59 large shall be made on July 1, 2004, and shall expire on July 1,
- 60 2006; and from and after July 1, 2004, this appointment shall be
- 61 designated as Post 3.
- 62 (d) The term of the engineer member presently serving
- 63 from the First Supreme Court District, which term was set to
- 64 expire on April 8, 2006, shall expire on July 1, 2007; and from
- 65 and after July 1, 2004, this appointment shall be designated as
- 66 Post 4.
- (e) The term of the engineer member presently serving
- 68 from the Second Supreme Court District, which term was set to
- 69 expire on April 8, 2006, shall expire on July 1, 2008; and from
- 70 and after July 1, 2004, this appointment shall be designated as
- 71 Post 5.
- 72 (f) The term of the engineer member presently serving
- 73 from the Third Supreme Court District, which term was set to
- 74 expire on April 8, 2006, shall expire on July 1, 2009; and from
- 75 and after July 1, 2004, this appointment shall be designated as
- 76 Post 6.
- 77 (g) The term of the surveyor member presently serving
- 78 at large, which term was set to expire on April 8, 2007, shall
- 79 expire on July 1, 2004; subsequent appointments shall be made from

- 80 the First Supreme Court District; from and after July 1, 2004,
- 81 this appointment shall be designated as Post 7.
- 82 (h) An appointment of a surveyor member shall be made
- 83 from the Second Supreme Court District; the appointment shall be
- 84 made on July 1, 2004, and shall expire on July 1, 2005; from and
- 85 after July 1, 2004, this appointment shall be designated as Post
- 86 8.
- (i) The term of the surveyor member presently serving
- 88 at large, which term was set to expire on April 8, 2006, shall
- 89 expire on July 1, 2006; subsequent appointments shall be made from
- 90 the Third Supreme Court District; from and after July 1, 2004,
- 91 this appointment shall be designated as Post 9.
- 92 At the expiration of a term, members of the board shall be
- 93 appointed in the manner prescribed in this section for terms of
- 94 four (4) years from the expiration date of the previous terms.
- 95 Any vacancy on the board prior to the expiration of a term for any
- 96 reason, including resignation, removal, disqualification, death or
- 97 disability, shall be filled by appointment of the Governor in the
- 98 manner prescribed in this section for the balance of the unexpired
- 99 term. The * * * Governor shall fill such vacancies within ninety
- 100 (90) days after each such vacancy occurs.
- 101 It shall not be considered the duty of the State of
- 102 Mississippi to provide office space and office equipment for the
- 103 board herein created.
- No member of the board shall, during the term of his office
- 105 or thereafter, be required to defend any action for damages in any

- 106 of the courts of this state where it is shown that said damage
- 107 followed or resulted from any of the official acts of said board
- 108 in the performance of its powers, duties or authority as set forth
- 109 in this chapter. Any such action filed shall upon motion be
- 110 dismissed, at the cost of the plaintiff, with prejudice.
- 111 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 112 and after July 1, 2025.

Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-13-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF LICENSURE FOR PROFESSIONAL

- 3 ENGINEERS AND SURVEYORS SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR FROM A
- 4 LIST OF NOMINEES DRAWN FROM STATE ENGINEERING SOCIETIES OR
- 5 COUNCILS THAT ARE AFFILIATED WITH NATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS AND FROM
- 6 STATE SURVEYING SOCIETIES OR ASSOCIATIONS THAT ARE AFFILIATED WITH
- 7 NATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS TO BE PROVIDED FOR CONSIDERATION NO LESS
- 8 THAN 90 DAYS BEFORE THE EXPIRATION OF A BOARD MEMBER'S TERM; AND
- 9 FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
