Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1268

TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

AMENDMENT NO. 1

- AMEND by inserting the following after line 104 and renumbering subsequent section(s) accordingly:
- 3 **SECTION *.** (1) There is created the Mississippi First
- 4 Responder PTSD and Suicide Prevention Task Force. The purpose of
- 5 the task force is to unite key stakeholders in order to assess the
- 6 mental health needs of first responders and develop a strategic
- 7 plan and proposed legislation. The task force shall review and
- 8 make recommendations on how to identify PTSD and those
- 9 contemplating suicide and on methods to prevent suicide for
- 10 Mississippi's first responders. Additionally, this task force
- 11 will identify methods to effectively provide treatment for first
- 12 responders. For the purposes of this section only, the term
- 13 "first responders" includes law enforcement officers, fire
- 14 fighters, 911 dispatchers, members of the Mississippi National
- 15 Guard and emergency medical services.
- 16 (2) The task force shall be composed of the following
- 17 twenty-one (21) members:

- 18 (a) Three (3) members of the Senate Public Health and
- 19 Welfare Committee appointed by the chair of the committee;
- 20 (b) Three (3) members of the House Public Health and
- 21 Human Services Committee appointed by the chair of the committee;
- (c) One (1) employee of the State Department of Health
- 23 appointed by the executive director;
- 24 (d) One (1) employee of the State Department of Mental
- 25 Health appointed by the executive director;
- 26 (e) One (1) employee of the Mississippi Department of
- 27 Human Services appointed by the executive director;
- 28 (f) The Medical Director and the Director of the Office
- 29 of Standards and Training of the Department of Public Safety, or
- 30 their respective designees;
- 31 (g) One (1) employee of the Office of the Attorney
- 32 General appointed by the Attorney General;
- 33 (h) Two (2) members, who must be therapists, appointed
- 34 by the First Responders of Mississippi organization;
- 35 (i) One (1) member of the Mississippi Association of
- 36 Chiefs of Police appointed by the president;
- 37 (j) One (1) member of the Mississippi Sheriffs'
- 38 Association appointed by the president;
- 39 (k) One (1) member of the Mississippi Fire Chiefs
- 40 Association appointed by the president;

- 41 (1) One (1) member of the Professional Firefighters
- 42 Association of Mississippi appointed by the president;
- 43 (m) One (1) member of the Mississippi Law Enforcement
- 44 Officers Association appointed by the president;
- 45 (n) One (1) member of the Mississippi National Guard
- 46 appointed by the Adjutant General of Mississippi; and
- 47 (o) One (1) employee of a member of the Mississippi
- 48 Ambulance Alliance appointed by the president.
- 49 (3) The task force shall perform the following duties:
- 50 (a) Assess the needs of first responders by gathering
- 51 input from first responders about mental health challenges and
- 52 reviewing existing resources, and identify gaps in mental health
- 53 support services;
- 54 (b) Develop a plan to address identified needs by
- 55 creating a detailed plan for programs and services that will
- 56 support first responders' mental health, and identify strategies
- 57 to make mental health services accessible, affordable and
- 58 effective;
- 59 (c) Foster collaboration among stakeholders by bringing
- 60 together first responders, mental health professionals and
- 61 policymakers to identify solutions and propose legislation;
- 62 (d) Identify ways to reduce mental health stigma by
- 63 promoting education and awareness;

- (e) Ensure oversight and sustainability of programs by
- 65 establishing a system and recommending an agency or entity to
- 66 monitor program effectiveness and make needed improvements, and to
- 67 secure funding and resources in order to ensure programs can
- 68 continue long-term; and
- (f) Recommend relevant changes to Mississippi law and
- 70 other state and local policies which can be implemented by state
- 71 and local governmental entities.
- 72 (4) (a) Appointments to the task force must be made within
- 73 thirty (30) days after the effective date of this act. Within
- 74 fifteen (15) days thereafter, on a day to be designated jointly by
- 75 the legislative members of the task force, the task force shall
- 76 meet and organize by selecting from its membership a chair and
- 77 vice chair. The vice chair shall serve also as the secretary and
- 78 is responsible for keeping all records of the task force. A
- 79 majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum.
- 80 In the selection of its officers and the adoption of rules,
- 81 resolutions and reports, an affirmative vote of a majority of the
- 82 task force is required. Written notice of task force meetings
- 83 shall be sent electronically to all members at least fifteen (15)
- 84 days before the date on which a meeting is to be held.
- 85 (b) The task force shall meet at least once monthly.
- 86 (c) The task force shall make a final report of its
- 87 findings and recommendations, including any recommended

- 88 legislation and any funding needs, to the Legislature before
- 89 December 1, 2025, at which time the task force will be dissolved.
- 90 (5) Members of the task force may not receive compensation
- 91 for their service on the task force.
- 92 (6) To effectuate the purposes of this act, upon the request
- 93 of the chair of the task force, a department, division, board,
- 94 bureau, committee, institution or agency of the state or a
- 95 political subdivision of the state shall provide the facilities,
- 96 assistance, information and data needed to enable the task force
- 97 to carry out its duties.
- 98 FURTHER, AMEND the title on line 4 by adding the following
- 99 after the semicolon:
- 100 TO CREATE THE MISSISSIPPI FIRST RESPONDER PTSD AND SUICIDE
- 101 PREVENTION TASK FORCE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE MEMBERSHIP AND DUTIES OF
- 102 THE TASK FORCE; TO REQUIRE THE TASK FORCE TO SUBMIT A REPORT ON
- 103 ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE LEGISLATURE BEFORE
- 104 DECEMBER 1, 2025;
