## Senate Amendments to House Bill No. 1491

## TO THE CLERK OF THE HOUSE:

THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT THE SENATE HAS ADOPTED THE AMENDMENTS SET OUT BELOW:

## **AMENDMENT NO. 2**

- AMEND by inserting the following after line 354 as a new section and renumbering subsequent sections accordingly:
- 3 **SECTION \*.** (1) The purpose of this act is to establish a
- 4 Technology Innovation Fund, hereafter referred to as "Fund," to
- 5 facilitate the development and deployment of innovative
- 6 technological solutions that enhance the efficiency, transparency
- 7 and responsiveness of government services. The fund is intended
- 8 to support collaborative efforts between government agencies,
- 9 educational institutions, private sector partners and nonprofit
- 10 organizations in the implementation of digital solutions that
- 11 drive public sector modernization.
- 12 (2) (a) There is hereby established the Technology
- 13 Innovation Fund, which shall be administered by the Mississippi
- 14 Department of Information Technology Services (ITS) under the
- 15 authority of the Chief Information Officer (CIO) of the State of
- 16 Mississippi.
- 17 (b) The fund shall provide financial support for
- 18 projects that utilize technology to address critical needs,

- 19 improve service delivery, and foster collaboration between public
- 20 and private entities.
- 21 (3) The objectives of the fund shall include, but are not
- 22 limited to, the following:
- 23 (a) Promote the development of digital solutions that
- 24 improve government service delivery and operational efficiency;
- 25 (b) Foster cross-agency and intergovernmental
- 26 collaboration in the adoption of shared technologies and best
- 27 practices;
- 28 (c) Encourage public-private partnerships in the
- 29 development and deployment of innovative technologies;
- 30 (d) Facilitate research, prototyping, and piloting of
- 31 emerging technologies such as artificial intelligence, blockchain,
- 32 data analytics, and cloud computing;
- 33 (e) Ensure equitable access to technological
- 34 innovations that can benefit underserved communities and regions;
- 35 and
- 36 (f) Enhance cybersecurity and protect the integrity of
- 37 state digital infrastructure.
- 38 (4) (a) The following entities shall be eligible to apply
- 39 for funding under this act:
- 40 (i) State and local government agencies;
- 41 (ii) Public and private educational institutions;

- 42 (iii) Nonprofit organizations engaged in
- 43 technology-driven public service initiatives; and
- 44 (iv) Private sector entities, in partnership with
- 45 public sector agencies, for collaborative projects.
- 46 (b) Applications for funding must demonstrate how the
- 47 proposed project will contribute to the digital transformation of
- 48 government services and the achievement of the objectives outlined
- 49 in Section 3 of this act.
- 50 (5) (a) The CIO of the Mississippi Department of
- 51 Information Technology Services shall establish criteria for the
- 52 evaluation of proposals and the allocation of funds, prioritizing
- 53 projects that:
- (i) Provide measurable benefits to the public and
- 55 improve government operations;
- 56 (ii) Demonstrate potential for scalability and
- 57 sustainability;
- 58 (iii) Foster partnerships across government,
- 59 private, and nonprofit sectors; and
- 60 (iv) Address urgent challenges in service
- 61 delivery, efficiency, and cybersecurity.
- 62 (b) The fund may allocate grants, matching funds, or
- 63 loans to eligible projects, as deemed appropriate by the CIO.

- 64 (6) (a) Each recipient of funding from the Technology
- 65 Innovation Fund shall be required to provide periodic reports to
- 66 the CIO detailing the progress, outcomes, and financial
- 67 expenditures associated with the funded project.
- 68 (b) The CIO shall submit an annual report to the
- 69 Governor and Legislature detailing the use of the Technology
- 70 Innovation Fund, including descriptions of funded projects, their
- 71 outcomes, and recommendations for future innovations.
- 72 (7) (a) The fund shall be initially capitalized with an
- 73 appropriation of monies from the General Fund, with additional
- 74 funding to be secured from:
- 75 (i) Public-private partnerships;
- 76 (ii) Federal grants or matching programs;
- 77 (iii) Revenues from technological licensing or
- 78 commercialization resulting from funded projects; and
- 79 (iv) Donations or contributions from private or
- 80 philanthropic organizations.
- 81 (b) The fund may also establish a revolving loan
- 82 mechanism to replenish available resources through repayments from
- 83 successful projects.
- 84 (8) The CIO of the Mississippi Department of Information
- 85 Technology Services (ITS) is authorized to promulgate any rules

- 86 and regulations necessary for the implementation and
- 87 administration of this act.
- 88 FURTHER, AMEND the title to conform.
