Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
7	Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance
8	of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks for the fiscal
9	year beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026
10	\$ 17,322,192.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in any special fund in
13	the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Wildlife,
14	Fisheries and Parks which is comprised of special source funds

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15 collected by or otherwise available to the department for the 16 support and maintenance of the department, including the Museum of 17 Natural Science and the Bureau of Parks and Recreation, for the 18 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026..... 19\$ 73,770,137.00.

The following sum, which is included in the sum appropriated above in this section, is appropriated out of the state excise taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products to the Fisheries and Wildlife Fund for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026......\$ 5,750,000.00.

25 The Department of Revenue is directed to set aside the amount 26 of this appropriation or any part thereof at any time it sees fit, 27 out of any collections of taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products, and to deduct the amounts so set aside from 28 such funds before making distribution thereof. However, 29 30 provisions shall first be made for the Highway Bonds Sinking Fund, 31 as required under the provisions of Chapter 130, Laws of 1938, and any amendments thereto, and Section 27-5-101, Mississippi Code of 32 33 1972.

Any funds available in the Wildlife Heritage Fund may be expended by the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks as authorized by law. The department shall make a detailed report to the Legislature regarding the spending of the Wildlife Heritage funds by September 1 for the preceding fiscal year.

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39 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 40 Section 2 to the Bureau of Wildlife and Fisheries, funds in the 41 amount of One Hundred Twenty-five Thousand Three Hundred 42 Thirty-five Dollars (\$125,335.00) shall be derived from the 43 Education Enhancement Fund deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 44 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the purpose of 45 defraying the expenses of Project WILD for Fiscal Year 2026.

46 **SECTION 4.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 47 this act, the following positions are authorized:

51 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 52 responsibility to make certain that funds required for Personal 53 Services for Fiscal Year 2027 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2026 funds 54 appropriated for that purpose unless programs or positions are 55 added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 budget by the Mississippi 56 Legislature. The Legislature shall determine the agency's 57 personal services appropriation, which the State Personnel Board 58 shall publish. The agency's personal services appropriation may 59 consist of restricted funds for approved vacancies for Fiscal Year 60 2026 that may be utilized to fill vacant Fiscal Year 2025 headcount. It shall be the agency's responsibility to ensure that 61 62 the funds provided for vacancies are used to increase headcount and not for promotions, title changes, in-range salary adjustments 63

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64 or any other mechanism for increasing salaries for current 65 employees. It is the Legislature's intention that no employee 66 salary falls below the minimum salary established by the 67 Mississippi State Personnel Board.

68 Additionally, the State Personnel Board shall determine and 69 publish the projected annualized payroll costs based on current 70 employees. It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to ensure that actual personnel expenditures for Fiscal Year 2026 do 71 72 not exceed the data provided by the Legislative Budget Office. If 73 the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 projected cost exceeds the 74 annualized costs, no salary actions shall be processed by the 75 State Personnel Board except for new hires determined to be 76 essential for the agency.

77 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 78 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or 79 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 80 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. 81 The 82 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written 83 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or positions 84 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 85 appropriated level.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for

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88 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are 89 withdrawn and no longer available.

90 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in 91 violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A 92 relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as 93 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.

94 SECTION 5. Each conservation officer and supervisor shall be 95 furnished an allowance for uniforms not to exceed Five Hundred 96 Fifty Dollars (\$550.00) per annum.

97 Provided further, when any personnel of the Bureau of 98 Wildlife and Fisheries are transferred from one (1) county to 99 another on a permanent assignment, the expense monies now paid on 100 out-of-county duty shall not be applicable.

101 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 102 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall maintain 103 complete accounting and personnel records related to the 104 expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such 105 records shall be in the same format and level of detail as 106 maintained for Fiscal Year 2025. It is further the intention of 107 the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 108 2027 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee 109 in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level 110 of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request 111 process.

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112 SECTION 7. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 113 114 the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized 115 in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the 116 intended mission of this agency. SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, the following amount shall be derived from the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks Special Pearl River Timber Fund No. 3465, for the purpose of making improvements to the Pearl River Wildlife Management Area.....\$ 50,000.00.

193 SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated within this act, the 194 Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks may enter into 195 cooperative agreements with the board of supervisors of any county 196 or any group or combination of counties for the purpose of 197 creating, improving or restoring parks, public game and fish 198 habitat lying or to be situated wholly or partially within such 199 county or in an adjoining county; and each county is empowered and 200 authorized, in its discretion, to expend funds from the general 201 county fund for such purposes from which fund they shall reimburse 202 to the Commission on Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks the actual cost 203 of all surveying and engineering projects incurred by the 204 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks incidental thereto. 205 Such boards of supervisors are further authorized and empowered, 206 in their discretion, to enter into agreements necessary to carry 207 out the purposes of this act with any other county, the United 208 States Forest Service or any other agency if same should be 209 necessary for the acquisition of land by lease or otherwise for 210 such purposes.

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SECTION 10. It shall be unlawful for any officer, employee or other person whatsoever to use or permit or authorize the use of any automobile or any other motor vehicle owned by the State of Mississippi or any department, agency or institution thereof for any purpose other than upon the official business of the State of Mississippi or any agency, department or institution thereof.

It is the intent of the Legislature that motor vehicles authorized to be owned and operated by this agency shall comply with Sections 25-1-77 through 25-1-93, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 11. In order to be in compliance with Section 63-1-201 et seq., funds are herein provided and may be expended by the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks to pay the costs of commercial driver's licenses for specific employees and/or to reimburse such costs for specific employees who, in the course of their duties and responsibilities, are required to hold a valid Mississippi Commercial Driver's License.

SECTION 12. The Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks is authorized to provide financial support of One Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$175,000.00) and to enter into an agreement with the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service for a project specialist and related supportive cost.

SECTION 13. The department is authorized to spend up to sixty percent (60%) of revenue in the State Park Timber Endowment Fund, as needed, to operate and maintain the state parks.

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235 SECTION 14. It is the intention of the Legislature that 236 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the 237 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things 238 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, 239 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind 240 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to 241 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 242 made without competitive bids.

SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is the intention of the Legislature that Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000.00) is allocated for the detection and prevention of Chronic Wasting Disease in deer populations across the state.

SECTION 16. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is the intention of the Legislature that Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00) is allocated for LeFleur's Bluff State Park for playground security expenses.

252 SECTION 17. Of the funds appropriated herein, Two Hundred 253 Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) may be provided to fund the Youth 254 Participation Initiative for the purpose of educating children in 255 the areas of hunting, fishing, conservation, and safety.

256 **SECTION 18.** It is the intention of the Legislature that no 257 more than One Million Three Hundred Thousand Dollars 258 (\$1,300,000.00) be expended from the Motor Vehicle Fund for the 259 purchase of any type of motor vehicle.

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260 **SECTION 19.** The executive director of the Department of 261 Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks is authorized to enter into an 262 agreement with any public or private entities to manage any park 263 or parks within the state park system.

264 SECTION 20. It is the intent of the Legislature that no 265 state-owned wildlife management area be closed and that to the 266 greatest practicable extent, department land management decisions 267 and actions may not result in any net loss of any acreage 268 available for hunting opportunities that existed on July 1, 2006, 269 as provided in Section 49-5-99(4). It is the intention of the 270 Legislature that no state park be closed without legislative 271 approval.

272 SECTION 21. It is the intent of the Legislature that the 273 Mississippi Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have 274 the authority to enter into multi-year contracts for the purpose 275 of placing a sign on such state park property under the 276 department's domain, in accordance with any applicable rules and 277 regulations. All proceeds generated from these activities shall 278 remain with the department and shall be deposited into the proper 279 special fund.

SECTION 22. It is the intent of the Legislature that from the funds available to the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks, the department may purchase and pay premium(s) on property damage insurance on its motor vehicles, boats, trailers, real property improvements, buildings, furnishings, and such other

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285 assets as may be appropriate or practical, and/or as required by a 286 granting entity.

SECTION 23. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 2, One Million Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$1,750,000.00) shall be designated for the purpose of defraying the operational expenses of Special Projects. None of these funds shall be used for "Personal Services."

SECTION 24. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries and Parks shall have the authority to receive, budget and expend funds from the Gulf and Wildlife Protection Fund, not to exceed Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) for the purpose of preservation, protection, conservation, and acquisition of waters, land and wildlife of this state.

SECTION 25. It is the intention of the Legislature that the funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for actions contrary to this provision.

306 **SECTION 26.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is 307 the intention of the Legislature that Fifty-eight Thousand Five 308 Hundred Ninety-three Dollars (\$58,593.00) may be allocated for the

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309 Hunter Education program supported from the General Fund court 310 assessments.

311 The following sum, or so much thereof as may be SECTION 27. 312 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Capital 313 Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated for the Mississippi 314 Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks for the purpose of 315 reauthorizing the expenditure of Capital Expense Funds, as authorized in House Bill 1791, 2024 Regular Session, to defray 316 317 expenses of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026.. 318 319\$ 3,800,000.00. 320 This appropriation is made for the purpose of reauthorizing

321 the expenditure of funds as allocated herein:

322 (a) Projects on the Parks Improvement Plan....\$ 2,300,000.00 323 (b) Museum Admissions Area Renovations.....\$ 1,500,000.00 324 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section, 325 the amount that may be expended under the authority of this 326 section, shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds 327 remaining as of June 30, 2025, from the amount authorized for the 328 previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation shall not 329 change the purpose for which the funds were originally authorized.

330 **SECTION 28.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 331 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 332 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 333 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal

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Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. **SECTION 29.** This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2025, and shall stand repealed from and after June 30, 2025.
