## HOUSE BILL NO. 5

1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE STATE FORESTRY COMMISSION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2026.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State General
7	Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance
8	of the State Forestry Commission for the fiscal year beginning
9	July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026
10	\$ 17,751,623.00.
11	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the special fund in
13	the State Treasury to the credit of the State Forestry Commission
14	which is comprised of special source funds collected by or
15	otherwise available to the commission, for the support and
16	maintenance of the commission for the fiscal year beginning
17	July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026 \$ 13,668,617.00.

18	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
19	this act, not more than the following amount of funds, with the
20	exception of the provisions in this section, shall be expended
21	only for "Personal Services," which includes "Vacancy Funding,"
22	for the following authorized number of employment headcount:

27	PERSONAL SERVICES:
28	Employee Salaries, Wages, and

31	Vacancy Funding: \$ 547,772.00
32	Total Personal Services: \$ 17,332,928.00
33	AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:
34	Permanent: 259
35	Time-Limited: 7
36	As used in this section, the term "Personal Services" shall
37	mean funds provided under the major object of expenditure category
38	Personal Services for Salaries, Wages, and Fringe Benefits. Funds
39	in this category shall not be transferred to any other category.
40	It is the intention of the Legislature to ensure compliance
41	with the Variable Compensation Plan, as outlined in Section
42	25-9-147, Mississippi Code of 1972. Payment from these funds shall

- 43 be in accordance with the Variable Compensation Plan promulgated
- 44 by the Mississippi State Personnel Board. It is the Legislature's
- 45 intention that no employee's salary falls below the minimum salary
- 46 established by the Mississippi State Personnel Board.
- The State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the
- 48 projected annual cost of "Personal Services" based on monthly and
- 49 year-to-date payroll expenditures in compliance with the
- 50 provisions of this act.
- With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
- 52 responsibility to ensure that no single personnel action or
- 53 combination of personnel actions, when annualized, exceeds the
- 54 Fiscal Year 2026 appropriation for "Personal Services" with the
- 55 exception of escalated funds. Further, it shall be the agency's
- 56 responsibility to ensure that funds required to be appropriated
- 57 for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2027 do not exceed Fiscal
- 58 Year 2026 funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or
- 59 positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 budget by the
- 60 Mississippi Legislature.
- If, at the time the agency takes any action to change
- 62 "Personal Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the
- 63 agency has taken or will take an action that would cause the
- 64 agency to exceed the funds appropriated in this act when
- 65 annualized for Fiscal Year 2026 or increase the need for "Personal
- 66 Services" for Fiscal Year 2027, when annualized, the State
- 67 Personnel Board shall process no salary actions until such time as

- 68 the requirements of the provisions of this section are met with
- 69 the exception of new hires determined to be essential for the
- 70 agency.
- 71 When used in this section, "Vacancy Funding" shall mean funds
- 72 included in the Total Personal Services amount listed above and
- 73 designated for approved vacancies in Fiscal Year 2026. These funds
- 74 are to be utilized to increase the number of filled headcounts
- 75 that were authorized but unfilled as of the last day of Fiscal
- 76 Year 2025. If the agency fills additional headcounts after May 1,
- 77 2025, until the end of Fiscal Year 2025, the amount of available
- 78 Vacancy Funding may be proportionally reduced to reflect the
- 79 updated number of filled headcounts. The agency shall be
- 80 responsible for ensuring that "Vacancy Funding" is used to
- 81 increase headcounts and not for promotions, title changes,
- 82 in-range salary adjustments, or any other mechanism for increasing
- 83 salaries for current employees.
- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 85 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
- 86 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 87 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 88 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 89 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 90 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or headcounts
- 91 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 92 appropriated level. Unless specifically noted, all Fiscal Year

- 93 2025 escalated headcounts have been accounted for and shall be
- 94 converted to authorized time-limited headcounts.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 96 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for
- 97 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are
- 98 withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 100 violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
- 101 relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
- 102 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- 103 If the agency's total authorized headcount decreases from
- 104 Fiscal Year 2025 to Fiscal Year 2026, it will be the agency's
- 105 discretion as to what headcounts are removed.
- The Legislature authorized seven (7) new headcounts, which
- 107 are included in the authorized headcount above for Fiscal Year
- 108 2026.

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- 109 New Headcount Authorized:
- 110 Forestry Job Family Classification 13
- 111 **SECTION 4.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 112 State Forestry Commission shall maintain complete accounting and
- 113 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds
- 114 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the
- 115 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year
- 116 2025. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the
- 117 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2027 shall be submitted to

118	the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format a	and level of
119	detail comparable to the format and level of detail	provided

121	SECTION 5. In compliance with the "Mississippi	i Performance
122	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the	ne intent of
123	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall	l be utilized
124	in the most efficient and effective manner possible	to achieve the
125	intended mission of this agency. Based on the fund	ing authorized,
126	this agency shall make every effort to attain the ta	argeted

145	A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets
146	set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the
147	agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget
148	Committee for Fiscal Year 2027.
149	SECTION 6. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, it is the
150	intention of the Legislature that Two Hundred Thousand Dollars
151	(\$200,000.00) shall be transferred to the Department of
152	Agriculture and Commerce for the Beaver Control or Eradication
153	Program during the Fiscal Year 2026.
154	SECTION 7. Any funds in the Salary, Wages and Fringe
155	Benefits major object of expenditure may be used to purchase
156	accumulated compensatory time within the funds available.
157	SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that
158	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
159	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
160	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
161	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
162	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
163	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
164	made without competitive bids.
165	SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
166	funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
167	Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency

168	shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
169	appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
170	or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
171	actions contrary to this provision.
172	SECTION 10. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
173	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
174	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
175	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
176	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
177	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
178	SECTION 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from
179	and after July 1, 2025.
