1 2 3 4	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FROM SPECIAL FUNDS IN THE STATE TREASURY FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING THE EXPENSES OF THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2026; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
6	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
7	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury
8	to the credit of the Department of Transportation, for the purpose
9	of defraying the administrative expenses of the Mississippi
10	Department of Transportation for the fiscal year beginning
11	July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026
12	\$ 1,480,857,218.00.
13	SECTION 2. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
14	this act, not more than the following amount of funds, with the
15	exception of the provisions in this section, shall be expended
16	only for "Personal Services," which includes "Vacancy Funding,"
17	for the following authorized number of employment headcount:

28	AUTHORIZED HEADCOUNT:
29	Permanent: 2,698
30	Time-Limited: 0
31	As used in this section, the term "Personal Services" shall
32	mean funds provided under the major object of expenditure category
33	Personal Services for Salaries, Wages, and Fringe Benefits. Funds
34	in this category shall not be transferred to any other category.
35	It is the intention of the Legislature to ensure compliance
36	with the Variable Compensation Plan, as outlined in Section
37	25-9-147, Mississippi Code of 1972. Payment from these funds shall
38	be in accordance with the Variable Compensation Plan promulgated
39	by the Mississippi State Personnel Board. It is the Legislature's
40	intention that no employee's salary falls below the minimum salary
41	established by the Mississippi State Personnel Board.
42	The State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the
43	projected annual cost of "Personal Services" based on monthly and

- 44 year-to-date payroll expenditures in compliance with the
- 45 provisions of this act.
- With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
- 47 responsibility to ensure that no single personnel action or
- 48 combination of personnel actions, when annualized, exceeds the
- 49 Fiscal Year 2026 appropriation for "Personal Services" with the
- 50 exception of escalated funds. Further, it shall be the agency's
- 51 responsibility to ensure that funds required to be appropriated
- 52 for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2027 do not exceed Fiscal
- 53 Year 2026 funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or
- 54 positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 budget by the
- 55 Mississippi Legislature.
- If, at the time the agency takes any action to change
- 57 "Personal Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the
- 58 agency has taken or will take an action that would cause the
- 59 agency to exceed the funds appropriated in this act when
- 60 annualized for Fiscal Year 2026 or increase the need for "Personal
- 61 Services" for Fiscal Year 2027, when annualized, the State
- 62 Personnel Board shall process no salary actions until such time as
- 63 the requirements of the provisions of this section are met with
- 64 the exception of new hires determined to be essential for the
- 65 agency.
- When used in this section, "Vacancy Funding" shall mean funds
- 67 included in the Total Personal Services amount listed above and
- 68 designated for approved vacancies in Fiscal Year 2026. These funds

- 69 are to be utilized to increase the number of filled headcounts
- 70 that were authorized but unfilled as of the last day of Fiscal
- 71 Year 2025. If the agency fills additional headcounts after May 1,
- 72 2025, until the end of Fiscal Year 2025, the amount of available
- 73 Vacancy Funding may be proportionally reduced to reflect the
- 74 updated number of filled headcounts. The agency shall be
- 75 responsible for ensuring that "Vacancy Funding" is used to
- 76 increase headcounts and not for promotions, title changes,
- 77 in-range salary adjustments, or any other mechanism for increasing
- 78 salaries for current employees.
- 79 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 80 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
- 81 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 82 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 83 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 84 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 85 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or headcounts
- 86 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 87 appropriated level. Unless specifically noted, all Fiscal Year
- 88 2025 escalated headcounts have been accounted for and shall be
- 89 converted to authorized time-limited headcounts.
- 90 No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 91 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for
- 92 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are
- 93 withdrawn and no longer available.

94	None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
95	violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
96	relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
97	interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
98	If the agency's total authorized headcount decreases from
99	Fiscal Year 2025 to Fiscal Year 2026, it will be the agency's
100	discretion as to what headcounts are removed.
101	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated to the Mississippi
102	Department of Transportation under the provisions of Section 1,
103	the following amounts shall be available for expenditure in the
104	program budgets as required by Section 27-103-127, Mississippi
105	Code of 1972:

111	SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
112	Mississippi Department of Transportation shall maintain complete
113	accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all
114	funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be
115	in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal
116	Year 2025. It is further the intention of the Legislature that
117	the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2027 shall be
118	submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format

- 119 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail
- 120 provided during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request process.
- 121 **SECTION 5.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, it is the
- 122 intention of the Legislature that Six Hundred Fifty Thousand
- 123 Dollars (\$650,000.00) shall be transferred to the Department of
- 124 Agriculture and Commerce for the Beaver Control or Eradication
- 125 Program during the Fiscal Year 2026.
- 126 **SECTION 6.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 and
- 127 authorized for expenditure in Section 3, Five Million Dollars
- 128 (\$5,000,000.00) shall be transferred by the Mississippi Department
- 129 of Transportation to the Department of Public Safety Office of
- 130 Commercial Transportation Enforcement Division for the operations
- 131 of the Division consistent with Section 77-7-330, Mississippi Code
- 132 of 1972.
- 133 **SECTION 7.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
- 134 act, the Mississippi Department of Transportation shall expend
- 135 such funds as necessary to conduct project planning. Such project
- 136 planning shall apply to all preliminary engineering, right-of-way
- 137 acquisition and construction projects of the department and, at a
- 138 minimum, shall consist of policies for the oversight and
- 139 management of project cost which:
- 140 (a) Establish a reasonable cost estimate for each
- 141 project. For purposes of this provision, projects include
- 142 preliminary engineering, right-of-way acquisition and
- 143 construction;

- (d) Capture the cost of consultants, engineers, attorneys, contract appraisers and other technical and professional contractors used in preliminary engineering, right-of-way acquisition and construction projects.
- SECTION 8. None of the funds appropriated under the
 provisions of Section 1 of this act may be expended by the
 Department of Transportation for construction of new highways if
 such highway segment is less than ten (10) miles in length unless:
 - (a) The explanation and justification for letting such a contract for a length of less than ten (10) miles is entered upon the official minutes of the Transportation Commission;
 - (b) The commission, within ten (10) working days after entry of its explanation and justification upon its minutes, gives notice, by United States First Class Mail, and provides a copy of such entry upon its minutes, to the Chairman of the Transportation Committee of the Mississippi House of Representatives and the Chairman of the Mississippi Senate Highways and Transportation Committee.

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- SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that of the sum appropriated in Section 1, the Department is authorized to provide a protective footwear allowance of not more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) per person annually for Engineers, Maintenance, and Construction Workers as part of their safety equipment.
- SECTION 10. Of the funds appropriated to the Mississippi
 Department of Transportation, Four Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
 (\$450,000.00) shall be used for the Statewide Litter Prevention
 Program.
- SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, not less than Eighty Million Dollars (\$80,000,000.00) shall be expended for contracted maintenance overlay and pavement rehabilitation.
- SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
 Mississippi Department of Transportation is authorized to transfer
 between the various programs in an amount not to exceed ten
 percent (10%) of the amount allocated in Section 3, except that no
 transfers shall be authorized which increase the "Administrative
 and Other Expenses" Program or which decrease the "Maintenance"
 Program.
- SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
 Mississippi Department of Transportation is authorized to expend
 an amount not to exceed Thirty Million Dollars (\$30,000,000.00)
 received from other public or private entities as reimbursements
 for payments made on federal projects.

194	SECTION 14. With the funds appropriated in this act, the
195	Mississippi Department of Transportation shall notify members of
196	the Mississippi Senate and House of Representatives upon the award
197	of projects within their respective districts and at least five
198	(5) days prior to a public ceremony announcing the award of any
199	grant in their district or any public announcement of ceremony
200	regarding the groundbreaking or opening of a facility, roadway or
201	bridge for which the Legislature has made funds available. Any
202	signage regarding any public event or any new facility, roadway or
203	bridge shall include the following language: "Funds were made
204	available for this project by the Mississippi State Legislature."
205	Further, the signage shall state the four-year legislative term in
206	which the project was funded.

SECTION 15. It is the intention of the Legislature that whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are made without competitive bids.

215 SECTION 16. The Mississippi Department of Transportation is 216 authorized to dispose of or transfer used cell phones that are 217 obsolete or inoperable to cell phone recycling programs dedicated

277	shall be received and expended under the rules and regulations of
278	the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner
279	consistent with the escalation of federal funds not to exceed One
280	Hundred Twenty-five Million Dollars (\$125,000,000.00).
281	SECTION 19. With the funds appropriated herein, the
282	Mississippi Department of Transportation is authorized to make
283	payments for expenses incurred during prior fiscal years for an
284	amount not to exceed Two Hundred Ten Thousand One Hundred Thirteer
285	Dollars and Ten Cents (\$210,113.10).
286	SECTION 20. In addition to all other funds appropriated
287	herein, the following sums, or so much thereof as may be
288	necessary is appropriated out of the following funds in the State
