1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING FOR SUPPORT OF THE EIGHT UNIVERSITIES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2026.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum of money, or so much thereof as
6	may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the
7	State General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Board of
8	Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning for the purpose
9	of support, maintenance, affirmative action plan, interest funds
10	and repairs at the state-supported institutions of higher
11	learning; for support of Alcorn State University, Delta State
12	University, Jackson State University, Mississippi State
13	University, Mississippi University for Women, Mississippi Valley
14	State University, University of Mississippi, and University of
15	Southern Mississippi, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025,
16	and ending June 30, 2026\$ 376,509,458.00.
17	SECTION 2. The following sum of money, or so much thereof as
18	may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the proceeds from

L 9	any federal, student fees or other special source funds not
20	otherwise appropriated, to the Board of Trustees of State
21	Institutions of Higher Learning for the purpose of support of
22	education and general operations of Alcorn State University, Delta
23	State University, Jackson State University, Mississippi State
24	University, Mississippi University for Women, Mississippi Valley
25	State University, University of Mississippi, and University of
26	Southern Mississippi, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025,
27	and ending June 30, 2026\$ 1,092,141,241.00
28	SECTION 3. The following sums, or so much thereof as may be
29	necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any money in the Ayers
30	Endowment interest fund for the purposes as set out by the courts
31	in the Ayers Case for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and
32	ending June 30, 2026:
33	Alcorn State University\$ 424,500.00
34	Jackson State University\$ 651,000.00
35	Mississippi Valley State University\$ 424,500.00
36	TOTAL:\$ 1,500,000.00
37	SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
88	Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall
39	allocate funds to the off-campus centers based on a minimum rate
10	of sixty-five percent (65%) of the on-campus cost of a full-time
11	equivalent student. The on-campus distribution is to be
12	determined without regard to the costs incurred by any one or more
13	of them in the operation of off-campus degree-completing centers'

- 44 classes. Off-campus centers which are operated jointly by two (2)
- 45 or more institutions, the amount allocated to such centers shall
- 46 be prorated among the institutions jointly operating such centers
- 47 based on the full-time equivalent enrollment of such centers.
- The board of trustees shall ensure that the off-campus
- 49 centers are not charged with any indirect or overhead cost
- 50 prorated from any on-campus activity. It is the intention of the
- 51 Legislature that the on-campus operations charge the off-campus
- 52 centers with only actual direct charges.
- 53 **SECTION 5.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
- 54 act, the amount of One Hundred Forty-five Thousand Dollars
- 55 (\$145,000.00) shall be used for the promotion and expenses of the
- 56 Mississippi Governor's School for the Gifted and Talented.
- 57 Provided, however, that the Board of Trustees of State
- 58 Institutions of Higher Learning shall develop the governing policy
- 59 for faculty, course content and facilities selection on a
- 60 competitive basis from all Mississippi senior colleges and
- 61 universities. The Mississippi Governor's School for the Gifted
- 62 and Talented shall accept not less than one (1) high school
- 63 student nominee from each accredited high school in Mississippi.
- 64 The nominees, selected under criteria developed and adopted by the
- 65 Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, shall
- 66 be provided a two-week tuition-free program.
- 67 **SECTION 6.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
- 68 act, the amount of Three Hundred Forty-nine Thousand Two Hundred

69	Dollars (\$349,200.00) shall be used for the promotion and expenses
70	of the Teacher Corps.
71	SECTION 7. It is the intent of the Legislature that no
72	general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to
73	replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being
74	used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and
75	which are withdrawn and no longer available.
76	SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
77	act, the following amounts shall be used as set forth:
78	(a) For Mississippi State University as interest
79	on agricultural land script fund and interest on sale of
80	university land, the sum of\$ 14,387.00.
81	(b) For the University of Mississippi as interest on
82	original seminary fund, the sum of\$ 32,643.00.
83	(c) For the University of Mississippi as interest on
84	1904 land grant fund, the sum of\$ 9,965.00.
85	(d) For the University of Mississippi as interest on
86	LaBauve Fund, the sum of\$ 1,420.00.
87	(e) For Mississippi University for Women as interest on
88	funds paid into the State Treasury as proceeds of sale of land
89	donated to the Industrial Institute and College by the United
90	States government, the sum of\$ 9,389.00.
91	(f) For Alcorn State University as interest on land
92	script and land sales funds, the sum of\$ 12,592.00.

93	SECTION 9. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this
94	act, the following amount shall be derived from Education
95	Enhancement Funds deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and
96	27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972:

- SECTION 10. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
 Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall
 first use special funds to the greatest extent possible to defray
 the costs of providing remediation at the state-supported
 institutions of higher learning.
- 107 SECTION 11. None of the funds appropriated by this act shall 108 be expended for any purpose that is not actually required or 109 necessary for performing any of the powers or duties of the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, or any of 110 111 the powers or duties of any institution under the jurisdiction of 112 the board of trustees, that are authorized by the Mississippi 113 Constitution of 1890, state or federal law, or rules or 114 regulations that implement state or federal law.
- SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the budget requests of the institutions for Fiscal Year 2027 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format

- 118 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail
- 119 provided during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request process.
- 120 SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 121 Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning
- 122 continue to review, and eliminate when possible, duplicating
- 123 programs and degrees in the existing institutions of higher
- 124 learning in this state.
- 125 SECTION 14. No state appropriations or student tuition and
- 126 fee receipts, except those specifically charged for the provision
- of the services, shall be used to support auxiliary enterprises, 127
- 128 with the exception of intercollegiate athletics at a level
- 129 designated by the board of trustees. It is the intent of the
- 130 Legislature that auxiliary enterprises shall be self-supporting
- 131 and that deficits not be taken from funds intended for instruction
- 132 and academic programs.
- 133 SECTION 15. The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of
- 134 Higher Learning shall report yearly to the Legislature the
- institution compliance with Section 97-11-51, Mississippi Code of 135
- 136 1972, which prohibits deficit spending.
- 137 SECTION 16. Any funds appropriated pursuant to this act and
- 138 paid as a fee to or deposited in a financial institution shall be
- 139 in compliance with Section 109 of the Constitution of the State of
- 140 Mississippi and Section 25-4-105, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 141 SECTION 17. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
- Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of 142

200	SECTION 22. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of

203	to the Delta State University E-Learning Center
204	\$ 155,000.00.
205	SECTION 23. None of the State General Funds appropriated by
206	this act shall be expended for the purpose of travel outside the
207	United States.
208	SECTION 24. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of
209	Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, the following
210	sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be allocated to
211	Delta State University Department of Commercial Aviation
212	\$ 800,000.00.
213	SECTION 25. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 and
214	Section 2 of this act, One Hundred Ninety-one Thousand Six Hundred
215	Ten Dollars (\$191,610.00) is provided for geospatial site
216	licenses.

217	SECTION 26. It is the intention of the Legislature that none
218	of the funds provided herein shall be used to pay certain
219	utilities for state-furnished housing for any employees. Such
220	utilities shall include electricity, natural gas, butane, propane,
221	cable and phone services. Where actual cost cannot be determined,
222	the agency shall be required to provide meters to be in compliance
223	with legislative intent. Such state-furnished housing shall
224	include single-family and multifamily residences but shall not
225	include any dormitory residences. Allowances for such utilities
226	shall be prohibited.
227	SECTION 27. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of
228	Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, the following
229	amount shall be allocated to the Delta State University Delta
230	Center for Culture and Learning\$ 100,000.00.
231	The funds allocated in this section shall only be used for
232	the Delta Center for Culture and Learning.
233	SECTION 28. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of
234	Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, the following
235	amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be allocated
236	to fund the Washington Center for Internships and Academic
237	Seminars Mississippi Initiative Scholarship Program
238	\$ 90,000.00.
239	This program will provide opportunities for Mississippi's
240	university and college students to gain real-life experience
241	working in Washington, D.C., and through attending short course

- 242 Academic Seminars. The funding will provide scholarships at
- 243 Alcorn State University, Delta State University, Jackson State
- 244 University, Mississippi State University, Mississippi University
- 245 for Women, Mississippi Valley State University, and the University
- 246 of Southern Mississippi. A written report shall be submitted
- 247 listing the scholarship recipients by university to the Chairmen
- 248 of the Senate and House Appropriations and Universities and
- 249 Colleges Committees.
- 250 **SECTION 29.** None of the funds appropriated and/or authorized
- 251 for expenditure under this act shall be used for research in which
- 252 a human embryo is killed or destroyed.
- 253 **SECTION 30.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
- 254 of Section 1 of this act, an amount not more than One Hundred
- 255 Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$125,000.00) shall be allocated to
- 256 implement university system efficiencies, including, but not
- 257 limited to, academic, space, energy and any other system projects
- 258 or expenditures that would lead to improved efficiency. Such
- 259 funds may also be used to draw down other funds or as matching
- 260 funds.
- 261 **SECTION 31.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
- 262 of Section 1 of this act, Nine Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 263 (\$900,000.00) shall be used to defray the expenses of the
- 264 Children's Center for Communication and Development at the
- 265 University of Southern Mississippi.

- SECTION 32. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act, the amount of One Million One Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 268 (\$1,100,000.00) is provided for defraying the expenses of the
- 269 DuBard School at the University of Southern Mississippi.
- 270 **SECTION 33.** Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
- 271 of Section 1 of this act, Two Hundred Sixty-six Thousand Seven
- 272 Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$266,750.00) is provided for the Southwest
- 273 Mississippi Center for Culture and Learning at Alcorn State
- 274 University.
- 275 **SECTION 34.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
- 276 act, it is the intention of the Legislature that Eight Hundred
- 277 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$850,000.00) is provided for the Engineer
- 278 Research and Development Center in Vicksburg, Mississippi, for
- 279 Research and Development opportunities in Science and Technology
- 280 initiatives.
- 281 **SECTION 35.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
- 282 act, Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) is provided for
- 283 the Delta State University Delta Music Institute.
- 284 **SECTION 36.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
- 285 act, Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000.00) is provided for
- 286 the T.K. Martin Center to study the IDEA Part C Early Intervention
- 287 System in Mississippi and Mississippi's Laws Regarding Early
- 288 Intervention, as established by Senate Bill 2167, 2023 Regular
- 289 Session.



290	SECTION 37. It is the intention of the Legislature that
291	Mississippi Valley State University is authorized to provide water
292	or sewer service to any existing, privately owned structures that
293	presently take water or sewer service from Mississippi Valley
294	State University. Furthermore, Mississippi Valley State
295	University is authorized to charge a flat or metered rate for the
296	service provided. Mississippi Valley State University shall not
297	provide any water or sewer service to any new, privately owned
298	structures.
299	SECTION 38. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this
300	act, One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000.00),
301	shall be derived from funds in the Education Enhancement Fund
303	denosited nursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31 Mississippi

deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office. These funds are provided to Alcorn State University for STEM related programs as determined by the university.

307 SECTION 39. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this 308 act, One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), or so much as necessary, 309 shall be derived from funds in the Education Enhancement Fund 310 deposited pursuant to Sections 27-65-75 and 27-67-31, Mississippi 311 Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as determined by the 312 Treasurer's Office. These funds are provided to the IHL research 313 institutions for the purpose of technology transfer and entrepreneurial programs, which may be connected to the Department 314

315	of Defense and related federal research in Mississippi. It is the
316	intent of the legislature that funds can be used for both research
317	and upgrades to the physical space in order to perform research
318	and entrepreneurship.

- 319 **SECTION 40.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this 320 act, One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00), or so much thereof, is 321 hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the 2023 Declaration of Independence Center for the 322 323 Study of American Freedom Fund, as created in Section 37-115-131, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as determined 324 325 by the Treasurer's Office, to support the operations of the 326 Declaration of Independence Center for the Study of American 327 Freedom ("Center") at the University of Mississippi, subject to 328 the conditions that the Center shall:
- 329 Promote scholarly research and civic education by 330 exploring the principles of freedom expressed in our country's 331 founding documents;
- 332 Support individual faculty members at institutions (b) 333 of higher learning who have been named Declaration Fellows and who 334 actively participate in the Center's network of scholars and 335 further the mission and principles of the Center;
- 336 Support classes, activities, and internships that advance students' understanding of American freedom at both the 337 338 secondary and post-secondary level of education, including support for the operation of any Freedom Studies minor that may be 339

341	well as support for all Freedom Studies courses belonging to this
342	minor; and
343	(d) Continue to be governed and advised in accordance
344	with the Center governing structure described in the last
345	paragraph of the Center mission statement signed by the
346	Chancellor, Provost and founding Director of the Center and
347	received in the Office of the Chancellor on March 1, 2023.
348	SECTION 41. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
349	necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Education
350	Enhancement Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the Institutions
351	of Higher Learning for the purpose of reauthorizing the
352	expenditure of Education Enhancement Funds to defray the expenses
353	of the Institutions of Higher Learning, as authorized in Senate
