1 AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF 2 STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER LEARNING FOR SUPPORT OF THE EIGHT 3 UNIVERSITIES' DESIGNATED INSTITUTES, LABORATORIES AND PROGRAMS FOR 4 WHICH THEY ARE RESPONSIBLE AND THE EXECUTIVE OFFICE OF THE BOARD 5 OF TRUSTEES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2026; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 7 SECTION 1. - 148 **SECTION 6.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 149 budget requests of the individual institutes, laboratories and
- 150 programs consolidated in this bill for Fiscal Year 2027 shall be
- 151 submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format
- 152 and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail
- 153 provided during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request process.
- 154 **SECTION 7.** The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of
- 155 Higher Learning shall report yearly to the Legislature any
- 156 institution not in compliance with Section 97-11-51, Mississippi
- 157 Code of 1972, which prohibits deficit spending.
- 158 **SECTION 8.** Any funds appropriated pursuant to this act and
- 159 paid as a fee to or deposited in a financial institution shall be
- 160 in compliance with Section 109 of the Constitution of the State of
- 161 Mississippi and Section 25-4-105, Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 162 **SECTION 9.** It is the intention of the Legislature that
- 163 whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
- 164 purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
- 165 stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
- 166 quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
- 167 shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
- 168 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
- 169 made without competitive bids.

- 170 SECTION 10. None of the funds appropriated and/or authorized 171 for expenditure under this act shall be used for research in which 172 a human embryo is killed or destroyed.
- 173 **SECTION 11.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the 174 funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with 175 Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their 176 177 appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally 178 or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for 179 actions contrary to this provision.
- 180 SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act, One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000.00) is 181 182 hereby provided for the National Center for Cannabis Research and 183 Education at the University of Mississippi - Research Institute of 184 Pharmaceutical Sciences for the purpose of data analysis, 185 educational initiatives, and other activities in collaboration 186 with the State Department of Health pursuant to Section 41-138-1, 187 Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 188 SECTION 13. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 189 necessary, is reappropriated out of any money in the Capital 190 Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated for the Executive Office 191 of the Board of Trustees for the purpose of reauthorizing the expenditure of Capital Expense Fund, as appropriated in SB 3007, 192 193 2024 Regular Session, for the repair, maintenance, or replacement of the fire detection and suppression system at the IHL Education 194

195	and Research Center for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025,
196	and ending June 30, 2026\$ 300,000.00.
197	Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under this section,
198	the amount that may be expended under the authority of this
199	section shall not exceed the unexpended balance of the funds
200	remaining as of June 30, 2025, from the amount authorized for the
201	previous fiscal year. In addition, this reappropriation shall not
202	change the purpose for which the funds were originally authorized.
203	SECTION 14. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
204	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
205	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
206	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
207	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
208	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
209	SECTION 15. This act shall take effect and be in force from
210	and after July 1, 2025.
