1 2	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY FOR FISCAL YEAR 2026.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
4	SECTION 1. The following sum of money, or so much thereof as
5	may be necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State
6	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to defray the expenses of
7	the Department of Public Safety for the fiscal year beginning
8	July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026 \$ 168,604,209.00.
9	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
10	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury
11	to the credit of the Department of Public Safety for the purpose
12	of defraying the expenses incurred in the operation of the various
13	divisions of the department for the fiscal year beginning
14	July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026\$ 117,126,547.00.
15	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
16	this act, not more than the following amount of funds, with the
17	exception of the provisions in this section, shall be expended

18	only for "Personal Services," which is	ncludes "Vacancy Funding,"
19	for the following authorized number o	f employment headcount:

- The State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the
- 45 projected annual cost of "Personal Services" based on monthly and
- 46 year-to-date payroll expenditures in compliance with the
- 47 provisions of this act.
- With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
- 49 responsibility to ensure that no single personnel action or
- 50 combination of personnel actions, when annualized, exceeds the
- 51 Fiscal Year 2026 appropriation for "Personal Services" with the
- 52 exception of escalated funds. Further, it shall be the agency's
- 53 responsibility to ensure that funds required to be appropriated
- 54 for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2027 do not exceed Fiscal
- 55 Year 2026 funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or
- 56 positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 budget by the
- 57 Mississippi Legislature.
- If, at the time the agency takes any action to change
- 59 "Personal Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the
- 60 agency has taken or will take an action that would cause the
- 61 agency to exceed the funds appropriated in this act when
- 62 annualized for Fiscal Year 2026 or increase the need for "Personal
- 63 Services" for Fiscal Year 2027, when annualized, the State
- 64 Personnel Board shall process no salary actions until such time as
- 65 the requirements of the provisions of this section are met with

- 66 the exception of new hires determined to be essential for the 67 agency.
- When used in this section, "Vacancy Funding" shall mean funds 68
- included in the Total Personal Services amount listed above and 69
- 70 designated for approved vacancies in Fiscal Year 2026. These funds
- 71 are to be utilized to increase the number of filled headcounts
- 72 that were authorized but unfilled as of the last day of Fiscal
- 73 Year 2025. If the agency fills additional headcounts after May 1,
- 74 2025, until the end of Fiscal Year 2025, the amount of available
- 75 Vacancy Funding may be proportionally reduced to reflect the
- 76 updated number of filled headcounts. The agency shall be
- 77 responsible for ensuring that "Vacancy Funding" is used to
- 78 increase headcounts and not for promotions, title changes,
- 79 in-range salary adjustments, or any other mechanism for increasing
- 80 salaries for current employees.
- 81 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 82 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
- 83 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 84 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 85 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 86 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 87 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or headcounts
- without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 88
- 89 appropriated level. Unless specifically noted, all Fiscal Year

90	2025 escalated headcounts have been accounted for and shall be
91	converted to authorized time-limited headcounts.
92	No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
93	used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for
94	salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are
95	withdrawn and no longer available.
96	None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
97	violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
98	relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
99	interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
100	If the agency's total authorized headcount decreases from
101	Fiscal Year 2025 to Fiscal Year 2026, it will be the agency's
102	discretion as to what headcounts are removed.
103	The Legislature authorized four (4) new headcounts, which are
104	included in the authorized headcount above for Fiscal Year 2026.

111	SECTION 4. The Commissioner of Public Safety may, on a
112	case-by-case basis, within funds available, recommend that
113	corrective salary adjustments be made to the compensation of

employees of the Department of Public Safety where an inequity was

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- 115 created between employees of equivalent capacity by previous
- 116 application of the agency appropriation acts. Any such corrective
- 117 salary adjustment plan must have prior approval by the State
- 118 Personnel Board. Such adjustments will not be retroactive.
- 119 Any funds in the Salary, Wages and Fringe Benefits major
- 120 object of expenditure may be used to purchase accumulated
- 121 compensatory time within funds available.
- 122 **SECTION 5.** It is the intention of the Legislature, that the
- 123 Department of Public Safety shall receive Five Million Dollars
- 124 (\$5,000,000.00) from the Mississippi Department of Transportation,
- 125 for the operations of the Office of Commercial Transportation
- 126 Enforcement Division that is authorized in Section 77-7-330,
- 127 Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 128 **SECTION 6.** It is the intent of the Legislature that the
- 129 local governments pay for part of the computer cost of the
- 130 Mississippi Justice Information Center by maintaining their
- 131 contribution to the Department of Public Safety.
- 132 **SECTION 7.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 133 Department of Public Safety designate certain employees to aid the
- 134 Office of Forensics Laboratories in the billing and collecting of
- 135 all fees charged for services rendered by the Office of Forensics
- 136 Laboratories.
- 137 **SECTION 8.** No part of the funds appropriated herein shall be
- 138 transferred to, expended by, or used, directly or indirectly, for
- 139 the benefit of any public relations, publicity or publication

140	activities of any other state agency, department or officer, nor
141	shall any personnel paid with funds appropriated herein be
142	transferred or assigned to any other state agency, department or
143	officer for public relations, publicity, or publication activities
144	of such office.
145	SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
146	Department of Public Safety shall not issue citations for
147	violations of speed limits on a quota basis. No funds expended
148	under this act shall be used for such quota-based citations for
149	violations of speed limits.
150	SECTION 10. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
151	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
152	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
153	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
154	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
155	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
156	performance measures provided below:

317 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that all divisions within the Mississippi Department of Public Safety shall 318 319 maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the 320 expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such 321 records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 2025. It is further the intention of 322 323 the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2027 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee 324 325 in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level 326 of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request 327 process.

SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 2 of this act, funds may be expended to defray the costs of clothing for sworn nonuniform law enforcement officers in an amount not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) annually per officer.

SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to

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- 339 the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are 340 made without competitive bids.
- 341 SECTION 14. The department is authorized to expend available 342 funds on technology or equipment upgrades or replacements when it 343 will generate savings through efficiency or when the savings
- 344 generated from such upgrades or replacements exceed expenditures
- 345 thereof.
- 346 SECTION 15. Of the funds provided herein, and in addition to
- 347 the One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) authorized in Section 45-3-7,
- Mississippi Code of 1972, Department of Public Safety Officers who 348
- 349 are licensed commercial pilots shall receive an additional Nine
- Hundred Dollars (\$900.00), for a total of One Thousand Dollars 350
- 351 (\$1,000.00), additional compensation for such service.
- 352 SECTION 16. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 353 Department of Public Safety shall provide an annual report to the
- 354 Mississippi Legislature detailing any elected official or any
- 355 other person who is not an employee of the Department of Public
- 356 Safety who was transported in Highway Patrol aircraft during the
- 357 fiscal year. The report shall be provided to each member of the
- 358 Mississippi Legislature on or before January 15, 2026.
- 359 SECTION 17. The Commissioner of Public Safety shall have the
- 360 authority to transfer any funds from any division within the
- Department of Public Safety to any other division of the 361
- 362 Department of Public Safety Special Funds, including, but not
- limited to, Funds 3711, 371C, 371E, 3713, 3714, 3715, 3740, 3741, 363

364	3742, 3744, 3747 and 3718, not to exceed Twenty Million Dollars
365	(\$20,000,000.00) collectively during Fiscal Year 2026. However,
366	none of the funds appropriated by this act shall be expended
367	unless the Department of Public Safety provides prior written
368	notification of any transfer of funds provided in this section.
369	SECTION 18. The Bureau of Narcotics is authorized to expend
370	a sum, not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00)
371	from account No. 3371800000, for purposes of effectuating the
372	provisions of Section 41-29-179, Mississippi Code of 1972, Section
373	1 of this act. Expenditures authorized by this section may
374	include, but not be limited to, costs associated with contracting
375	with one or more vendors, contractors or other persons or entities
376	to create, operate and maintain the forfeiture website and to
377	provide continuing support in relation thereto. In the event an
378	amount less than Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000.00) is required
379	to effectuate the purposes of this section, the Bureau is
380	authorized to expend the remainder of such authorized funds for
381	the purchase of commodities, vehicles and/or other equipment
382	necessary in the furtherance of the needs of the Bureau.
383	SECTION 19. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
384	act, it is the intention of the Legislature that Four Million
385	Three Hundred Twelve Thousand Six Hundred Two Dollars
386	(\$4,312,602.00) may be allocated for the programs supported from
387	General Fund court assessments as follows:

406	(337200000), not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
407	(\$500,000.00).
408	SECTION 21. Of the funds appropriated by this act, pursuant
409	to Section 97-3-54.9, Mississippi Code of 1972, Two Hundred Fifty
410	Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) is provided for the duties and
411	operations of a Statewide Human Trafficking Coordinator and a data
412	analyst within the Bureau of Investigation in the Department of
413	Public Safety, who shall coordinate all statewide activities and

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- 415 victims recovered.
- SECTION 22. Of the funds appropriated by this act, pursuant
- 417 to Section 45-1-2(7), Mississippi Code of 1972, Two Hundred
- 418 Forty-two Thousand Six Hundred Three Dollars (\$242,603.00) is
- 419 provided for the duties and operations associated with the
- 420 Mississippi School Safety Act of 2019.
- 421 **SECTION 23.** The department may subgrant a portion of the
- 422 funds appropriated herein to the Jackson Police Department for
- 423 eligible activities contingent upon the execution of an
- 424 operational agreement between the Capitol Police and Jackson
- 425 Police Department on roles and responsibilities within the Capitol
- 426 Complex Improvement District.
- 427 **SECTION 24.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
- 428 act, Nine Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$900,000.00) is provided to
- 429 the Capitol Police for the purpose of defraying expenses related
- 430 to the housing of detainees arrested within the Capital Complex
- 431 Improvement District.
- SECTION 25. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 433 necessary, is re-appropriated out of any money in the Capital
- 434 Expense Fund not otherwise appropriated to the Department of
- 435 Public Safety for the purpose of reauthorizing the expenditure of
- 436 Capital Expense Funds, as authorized in Senate Bill No. 3020, 2024
- 437 Regular Session, to the Department of Public Safety for the fiscal
- 438 year beginning July 1, 2025 and ending June 30, 2026.....

These funds are provided for the Driver Service Bureau to replace the driver license system.

SECTION 30. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, One Million One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,100,000.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Capital Expense Fund, as created in Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office. These funds are provided for a Capitol Security Platform.

SECTION 31. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, One Million Two Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$1,260,000.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Capital Expense Fund, as created in Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office. These funds are provided for the Driver Service Bureau Canton building lease.

SECTION 32. With the funds appropriated herein, the Department of Public Safety is authorized to make payments to certain vendors for expenses incurred during Fiscal Years 2021 through 2024 in the following total amount.....\$ 294,862.00.

SECTION 33. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal

- Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
