1 2	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY FOR FISCAL YEAR 2026.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
4	SECTION 1. The following sum of money, or so much thereof as
5	may be necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State
6	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to defray the expenses of
7	the Department of Public Safety for the fiscal year beginning
8	July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026\$ 168,604,209.00.
9	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
10	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury
11	to the credit of the Department of Public Safety for the purpose
12	of defraying the expenses incurred in the operation of the various
13	divisions of the department for the fiscal year beginning
14	July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026\$ 117,126,547.00.
15	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
16	this act, not more than the following amount of funds, with the
17	exception of the provisions in this section, shall be expended

18	only for "Personal Services," which includes "Vacancy Funding,"
19	for the following authorized number of employment headcount:

33	As used in this section, the term "Personal Services" shall
34	mean funds provided under the major object of expenditure category
35	Personal Services for Salaries, Wages, and Fringe Benefits. Funds
36	in this category shall not be transferred to any other category.
37	It is the intention of the Legislature to ensure compliance
38	with the Variable Compensation Plan, as outlined in Section
39	25-9-147, Mississippi Code of 1972. Payment from these funds
40	shall be in accordance with the Variable Compensation Plan
41	promulgated by the Mississippi State Personnel Board. It is the
42	Legislature's intention that no employee's salary falls below the

- 43 minimum salary established by the Mississippi State Personnel
- 44 Board.
- The State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the
- 46 projected annual cost of "Personal Services" based on monthly and
- 47 year-to-date payroll expenditures in compliance with the
- 48 provisions of this act.
- With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
- 50 responsibility to ensure that no single personnel action or
- 51 combination of personnel actions, when annualized, exceeds the
- 52 Fiscal Year 2026 appropriation for "Personal Services" with the
- 53 exception of escalated funds. Further, it shall be the agency's
- 54 responsibility to ensure that funds required to be appropriated
- 55 for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2027 do not exceed Fiscal
- 56 Year 2026 funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or
- 57 positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 budget by the
- 58 Mississippi Legislature.
- 59 If, at the time the agency takes any action to change
- 60 "Personal Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the
- 61 agency has taken or will take an action that would cause the
- 62 agency to exceed the funds appropriated in this act when
- 63 annualized for Fiscal Year 2026 or increase the need for "Personal
- 64 Services" for Fiscal Year 2027, when annualized, the State
- 65 Personnel Board shall process no salary actions until such time as
- 66 the requirements of the provisions of this section are met with

- the exception of new hires determined to be essential for the agency.
- When used in this section, "Vacancy Funding" shall mean funds
- 70 included in the Total Personal Services amount listed above and
- 71 designated for approved vacancies in Fiscal Year 2026. These
- 72 funds are to be utilized to increase the number of filled
- 73 headcounts that were authorized but unfilled as of the last day of
- 74 Fiscal Year 2025. If the agency fills additional headcounts after
- 75 May 1, 2025, until the end of Fiscal Year 2025, the amount of
- 76 available Vacancy Funding may be proportionally reduced to reflect
- 77 the updated number of filled headcounts. The agency shall be
- 78 responsible for ensuring that "Vacancy Funding" is used to
- 79 increase headcounts and not for promotions, title changes,
- 80 in-range salary adjustments, or any other mechanism for increasing
- 81 salaries for current employees.
- 82 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 83 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
- 84 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 85 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 86 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 87 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 88 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or headcounts
- 89 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 90 appropriated level. Unless specifically noted, all Fiscal Year

91	2025 escalated headcounts have been accounted for and shall be
92	converted to authorized time-limited headcounts.
93	No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
94	used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for
95	salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are
96	withdrawn and no longer available.
97	None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
98	violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
99	relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
100	interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
101	If the agency's total authorized headcount decreases from
102	Fiscal Year 2025 to Fiscal Year 2026, it will be the agency's
103	discretion as to what headcounts are removed.
104	The Legislature authorized four (4) new headcounts, which are
105	included in the authorized headcount above for Fiscal Year 2026.

112	SECTION 4. The Commissioner of Public Safety may, on a
113	case-by-case basis, within funds available, recommend that
114	corrective salary adjustments be made to the compensation of

employees of the Department of Public Safety where an inequity was

- 116 created between employees of equivalent capacity by previous
- 117 application of the agency appropriation acts. Any such corrective
- 118 salary adjustment plan must have prior approval by the State
- 119 Personnel Board. Such adjustments will not be retroactive.
- 120 Any funds in the Salary, Wages and Fringe Benefits major
- 121 object of expenditure may be used to purchase accumulated
- 122 compensatory time within funds available.
- 123 **SECTION 5.** It is the intention of the Legislature, that the
- 124 Department of Public Safety shall receive Five Million Dollars
- 125 (\$5,000,000.00) from the Mississippi Department of Transportation,
- 126 for the operations of the Office of Commercial Transportation
- 127 Enforcement Division that is authorized in Section 77-7-330,
- 128 Mississippi Code of 1972.
- 129 **SECTION 6.** It is the intent of the Legislature that the
- 130 local governments pay for part of the computer cost of the
- 131 Mississippi Justice Information Center by maintaining their
- 132 contribution to the Department of Public Safety.
- 133 **SECTION 7.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 134 Department of Public Safety designate certain employees to aid the
- 135 Office of Forensics Laboratories in the billing and collecting of
- 136 all fees charged for services rendered by the Office of Forensics
- 137 Laboratories.
- 138 **SECTION 8.** No part of the funds appropriated herein shall be
- 139 transferred to, expended by, or used, directly or indirectly, for
- 140 the benefit of any public relations, publicity or publication

141	activities of any other state agency, department or officer, nor
142	shall any personnel paid with funds appropriated herein be
143	transferred or assigned to any other state agency, department or
144	officer for public relations, publicity, or publication activities
145	of such office.
146	SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
147	Department of Public Safety shall not issue citations for
148	violations of speed limits on a quota basis. No funds expended
149	under this act shall be used for such quota-based citations for
150	violations of speed limits.
151	SECTION 10. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
152	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
153	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
154	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
155	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
156	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
157	performance measures provided below:

318 SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that all 319 divisions within the Mississippi Department of Public Safety shall 320 maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the 321 expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such 322 records shall be in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 2025. It is further the intention of 323 324 the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2027 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee 325 326 in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level 327 of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request 328 process.

SECTION 12. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 2 of this act, funds may be expended to defray the costs of clothing for sworn nonuniform law enforcement officers in an amount not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) annually per officer.

SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to

- SECTION 14. The department is authorized to expend available funds on technology or equipment upgrades or replacements when it will generate savings through efficiency or when the savings generated from such upgrades or replacements exceed expenditures
- SECTION 15. Of the funds provided herein, and in addition to the One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) authorized in Section 45-3-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, Department of Public Safety Officers who are licensed commercial pilots shall receive an additional Nine Hundred Dollars (\$900.00), for a total of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), additional compensation for such service.
 - SECTION 16. - 493 act, One Million One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,100,000.00) or
- 494 so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be derived out of any
- 495 money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Capital Expense
- 496 Fund, as created in Section 27-103-303, Mississippi Code of 1972,
- 497 and allocated in a manner as determined by the Treasurer's Office.
- 498 These funds are provided for a Capitol Security Platform.
- 499 **SECTION 31.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 of this
- 500 act, One Million Two Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars
- (\$1,260,000.00) or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be
- 502 derived out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of
- 503 the Capital Expense Fund, as created in Section 27-103-303,
- 504 Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as determined
- 505 by the Treasurer's Office. These funds are provided for the
- 506 Driver Service Bureau Canton building lease.
- 507 **SECTION 32.** With the funds appropriated herein, the
- 508 Department of Public Safety is authorized to make payments to
- 509 certain vendors for expenses incurred during Fiscal Years 2021
- 510 through 2024 in the following total amount.....\$ 294,862.00.
- 511 **SECTION 33.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 512 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 513 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 514 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal

- 515 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 516 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
- 517 **SECTION 34.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 518 and after July 1, 2025.
