58	mean funds provided under the major object of expenditure category
59	Personal Services for Salaries, Wages, and Fringe Benefits. Funds
60	in this category shall not be transferred to any other category.
61	It is the intention of the Legislature to ensure compliance
62	with the Variable Compensation Plan, as outlined in Section
63	25-9-147, Mississippi Code of 1972. Payment from these funds shall
64	be in accordance with the Variable Compensation Plan promulgated
65	by the Mississippi State Personnel Board. It is the Legislature's
66	intention that no employee's salary falls below the minimum salary
67	established by the Mississippi State Personnel Board.

68	The State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the
69	projected annual cost of "Personal Services" based on monthly and
70	year-to-date payroll expenditures in compliance with the
71	provisions of this act.

- 72 With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's 73 responsibility to ensure that no single personnel action or 74 combination of personnel actions, when annualized, exceeds the Fiscal Year 2026 appropriation for "Personal Services" with the 75 76 exception of escalated funds. Further, it shall be the agency's 77 responsibility to ensure that funds required to be appropriated 78 for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2027 do not exceed Fiscal 79 Year 2026 funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or 80 positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 budget by the 81 Mississippi Legislature.
- If, at the time the agency takes any action to change 83 "Personal Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the 84 agency has taken or will take an action that would cause the agency to exceed the funds appropriated in this act when 85 86 annualized for Fiscal Year 2026 or increase the need for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2027, when annualized, the State 87 88 Personnel Board shall process no salary actions until such time as 89 the requirements of the provisions of this section are met with 90 the exception of new hires determined to be essential for the

agency.

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92	When used in this section, "Vacancy Funding" shall mean funds
93	included in the Total Personal Services amount listed above and
94	designated for approved vacancies in Fiscal Year 2026. These funds
95	are to be utilized to increase the number of filled headcounts
96	that were authorized but unfilled as of the last day of Fiscal
97	Year 2025. If the agency fills additional headcounts after May 1,
98	2025, until the end of Fiscal Year 2025, the amount of available
99	Vacancy Funding may be proportionally reduced to reflect the
100	updated number of filled headcounts. The agency shall be
101	responsible for ensuring that "Vacancy Funding" is used to
102	increase headcounts and not for promotions, title changes,
103	in-range salary adjustments, or any other mechanism for increasing
104	salaries for current employees.
105	Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
106	the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
107	allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
108	Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
109	approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
110	Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
111	approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or headcounts
112	without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
113	appropriated level. Unless specifically noted, all Fiscal Year
114	2025 escalated headcounts have been accounted for and shall be
115	converted to authorized time-limited headcounts.

116	No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
117	used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for
118	salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are
119	withdrawn and no longer available.
120	None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
121	violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
122	relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
123	interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
124	If the agency's total authorized headcount decreases from
125	Fiscal Year 2025 to Fiscal Year 2026, it will be the agency's
126	discretion as to what headcounts are removed.
127	SECTION 5. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
128	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
129	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
130	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
131	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,

232	SECTION 6. The Department of Mental Health and its
233	facilities shall have the authority, within funding and spending
234	authority appropriated under the provisions of this act to
235	transfer funds to the Division of Medicaid in payment of Medicaid
236	match and designate that the funds thus transferred shall be
237	applied to Medicaid match obligations arising in the subsequent
238	fiscal year.
239	SECTION 7. Any person within the Department of Mental Health
240	who must work on a statutory holiday or any holiday proclaimed by

241	the Governor may, at the discretion of the Director of the
242	Institution and the Executive Director of the Department of Mental
243	Health and within available personnel funds, be paid "call-back
244	pay" in lieu of "compensatory time credit."
245	SECTION 8. Of the funds appropriated to the "Service
246	Budget," funds are included for the support of community mental
247	health services for Fiscal Year 2026.
248	Provided, however, that none of the funds appropriated for
249	the support of community mental health services shall be made
250	available to any Regional Mental Health/Intellectual Disability
251	Center which does not receive from each of its participating
252	counties a dollar amount equivalent to what the proceeds of a
253	three-fourths $(3/4)$ mill tax on all taxable property in the county
254	in Fiscal Year 1982 would have been or the amount of funds
255	contributed to the center by the county in Fiscal Year 1984,
256	whichever shall be greater. By means of performance contracts,
257	the Department of Mental Health shall disburse the funds
258	appropriated in this section for services for the mentally ill,
259	intellectually disabled and alcohol/drug abusers. The State Board
260	of Mental Health and the Department of Mental Health shall be
261	responsible for selecting the types of services which shall be
262	provided with the funds appropriated in this section, for
263	developing and monitoring performance contracts and for holding
264	contractors accountable for utilization of funds.

266	to Four Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$450,000.00) from interest
267	earned on funds invested in Ellisville State School Client's Trust
268	Fund for the purpose of supplementing the cost related to
269	supplies, property, and equipment in direct care.
270	SECTION 10. The Department of Mental Health and its
271	facilities shall have the express legal authority, within funding
272	and spending authority appropriated under the provisions of this
273	act to purchase land for use by residential facilities operated by
274	the department, either directly or by means of transferring funds
275	to the Bureau of Building, Grounds and Real Property Management,
276	and to transfer such funds to the Bureau of Building, Grounds, and
277	Real Property Management for the purposes of constructing and
278	equipping group homes for persons with mental illness,
279	intellectual disability, and/or substance abuse; constructing and
280	equipping such other buildings as may be required for treatment of
281	persons with mental illness, intellectual disability, and/or
282	substance abuse; repair and renovate existing buildings; and to
283	construct, repair and/or renovate employee housing. Any
284	intermediate care facilities for individuals with intellectual
285	disabilities (ICF/IID) constructed with funds authorized in this
286	section shall be authorized to participate in Medicaid funding
287	available for such services.
288	SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that the

Department of Mental Health shall maintain complete accounting and

SECTION 9. Ellisville State School is authorized to draw up

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290 personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds 291 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the 292 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year 293 2025. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the 294 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2027 shall be submitted to 295 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of 296 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided 297 during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request process.

SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that none of the funds provided herein shall be used to pay certain utilities for state-furnished housing for any employees. Such utilities shall include electricity, natural gas, butane, propane, cable and phone services. Where actual cost cannot be determined, the agency shall be required to provide meters to be in compliance with legislative intent. Such state-furnished housing shall include single-family and multifamily residences but shall not include any dormitory residences. Allowances for such utilities shall be prohibited.

SECTION 13. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Executive Director of the Department of Mental Health shall have authority to transfer cash from one special fund treasury fund to another special fund treasury fund under the control of the Department of Mental Health. The purpose of this authority is to more efficiently use available cash reserves. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the Executive Director of the

320	SECTION 14. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions
321	of this act, Forty-five Million Seven Hundred Twelve Thousand One

323	Department of Mental Health to expand those community-based
324	services that will improve the State of Mississippi's compliance
325	with the Olmstead decision of the United States Supreme Court.
326	Further, it is the intention of the Legislature that the
327	Department of Mental Health shall have the authority to transfer
328	such sums from this source as are necessary to implement or
329	improve those community services that are more appropriately
330	addressed by the Mississippi Department of Education and/or the
331	Mississippi Department of Rehabilitation Services to those
332	agencies for that purpose. Further, it is the intention of the
333	Legislature that any sums received from this source that are not
334	expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, by the
335	Mississippi Department of Mental Health shall be reappropriated
336	for the same purpose during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026.
337	Further, it is the intention of the Legislature that the

Department of Mental Health shall account for the expenditure of

these funds in sufficient detail to clearly show the purposes for

Department of Mental Health shall submit written justification for

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340	which such funds were expended. The Executive Director of the
341	Department of Mental Health shall report any such reappropriation
342	to the Legislative Budget Office no later than fifteen (15) days

344 SECTION 15. Of the funds appropriated in this act, the 345 Department of Mental Health, with approval by the board, may 346 contract with Community Mental Health Centers, or suitable 347 entities, for the purpose of operating the Crisis Stabilization 348 Units at Grenada, Batesville, Brookhaven, Cleveland, Corinth, 349 Laurel and Newton. The department shall provide quarterly 350 progress reports on the operation of the Crisis Stabilization 351 Units to the Chairmen of the Senate and House Public Health and 352 Appropriations Committees.

It is the intention of the Legislature that SECTION 16. whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price, quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind shall be given preference. 402	Mental Health for the purpose of reauthorizing the expenditure of			
403	Capital Expense Fund, as appropriated in SB 3162, 2024 Regular			
404	Session, to the Department of Mental Health for the purpose of			
405	entering into a subgrant with Canopy Children's Solutions for the			
406	construction and renovation of the CARES Center, including the			
407	children and youth Psychiatric Residential Treatment Facility for

- 429 SECTION 27. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 430 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the

- 433 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 434 proper person, officer or officers in the manner provided by law.
