1 2 3	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE OFFICE OF STATE AID ROAD CONSTRUCTION OF THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2026.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
6	necessary, is appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury
7	to the credit of the Office of State Aid Road Construction Fund,
8	for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the Office of State
9	Aid Road Construction of the Mississippi Department of
10	Transportation for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and
11	ending June 30, 2026\$ 235,736,074.00.
12	SECTION 2. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
13	this act, not more than the following amount of funds, with the
14	exception of the provisions in this section, shall be expended
15	only for "Personal Services," which includes "Vacancy Funding,"
16	for the following authorized number of employment headcount:

30	As used in this section, the ter	m "Personal Services" shall
31	mean funds provided under the major o	bject of expenditure category
32	Personal Services for Salaries, Wages	, and Fringe Benefits. Funds
33	in this category shall not be transfe	rred to any other category.
34	It is the intention of the Legis	lature to ensure compliance
35	with the Variable Compensation Plan,	as outlined in Section
36	25-9-147, Mississippi Code of 1972. P	ayment from these funds shall
37	be in accordance with the Variable Co	mpensation Plan promulgated
38	by the Mississippi State Personnel Bo	ard. It is the Legislature's
39	intention that no employee's salary f	alls below the minimum salary
40	established by the Mississippi State	Personnel Board.
41	The State Personnel Board shall	determine and publish the
42	projected annual cost of "Personal Se	rvices" based on monthly and

- 43 year-to-date payroll expenditures in compliance with the
- 44 provisions of this act.
- With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
- 46 responsibility to ensure that no single personnel action or
- 47 combination of personnel actions, when annualized, exceeds the
- 48 Fiscal Year 2026 appropriation for "Personal Services" with the
- 49 exception of escalated funds. Further, it shall be the agency's
- 50 responsibility to ensure that funds required to be appropriated
- 51 for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2027 do not exceed Fiscal
- 52 Year 2026 funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or
- 53 positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 budget by the
- 54 Mississippi Legislature.
- If, at the time the agency takes any action to change
- 56 "Personal Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the
- 57 agency has taken or will take an action that would cause the
- 58 agency to exceed the funds appropriated in this act when
- 59 annualized for Fiscal Year 2026 or increase the need for "Personal
- 60 Services" for Fiscal Year 2027, when annualized, the State
- 61 Personnel Board shall process no salary actions until such time as
- 62 the requirements of the provisions of this section are met with
- 63 the exception of new hires determined to be essential for the
- 64 agency.
- When used in this section, "Vacancy Funding" shall mean funds
- 66 included in the Total Personal Services amount listed above and
- 67 designated for approved vacancies in Fiscal Year 2026. These funds

- 68 are to be utilized to increase the number of filled headcounts
- 69 that were authorized but unfilled as of the last day of Fiscal
- 70 Year 2025. If the agency fills additional headcounts after May 1,
- 71 2025, until the end of Fiscal Year 2025, the amount of available
- 72 Vacancy Funding may be proportionally reduced to reflect the
- 73 updated number of filled headcounts. The agency shall be
- 74 responsible for ensuring that "Vacancy Funding" is used to
- 75 increase headcounts and not for promotions, title changes,
- 76 in-range salary adjustments, or any other mechanism for increasing
- 77 salaries for current employees.
- Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 79 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
- 80 allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State
- 81 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 82 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 83 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 84 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or headcounts
- 85 without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the
- 86 appropriated level. Unless specifically noted, all Fiscal Year
- 87 2025 escalated headcounts have been accounted for and shall be
- 88 converted to authorized time-limited headcounts.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 90 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for
- 91 salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are
- 92 withdrawn and no longer available.

- 93 None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
- 94 violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
- relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as 95
- interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor. 96
- 97 If the agency's total authorized headcount decreases from
- 98 Fiscal Year 2025 to Fiscal Year 2026, it will be the agency's
- discretion as to what headcounts are removed. 99
- 100 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this
- 101 act, it is the intention of the Legislature that an amount not to
- 102 exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) is authorized
- 103 to be expended from funds received from the Mississippi
- 104 Development Authority as reimbursements for actual expenses
- 105 incurred by the Office of State Aid Road Construction for
- 106 administering and providing engineering services to political
- 107 subdivisions as authorized under Section 65-4-15, Mississippi Code
- 108 of 1972. Any such funds shall be deposited into the Office of
- 109 State Aid Roads Administrative Fund for the fiscal year beginning
- July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026. 110
- 111 SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1,
- 112 Fifty-five Million Dollars (\$55,000,000.00) is provided for the
- 113 purpose of replacement of structurally deficient bridges on the
- 114 Local System Bridge Program (LSBP).
- 115 SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 116 Office of State Aid Road Construction shall maintain complete
- accounting and personnel records related to the expenditure of all 117

118	funds appropriated under this act and that such records shall be
119	in the same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal
120	Year 2025. It is further the intention of the Legislature that
121	the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2027 shall be
122	submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format
123	and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail
124	provided during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request process.
125	SECTION 6. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
126	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
127	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
128	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
129	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
130	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
131	performance measures provided below:

176	A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets
177	set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the
178	agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget
179	Committee for Fiscal Year 2027.
180	SECTION 7. With the funds appropriated in this act, the
181	Office of State Aid Road Construction shall notify members of the
182	Mississippi Senate and House of Representatives upon the award of
183	projects within their respective districts and at least five (5)
184	days prior to a public ceremony announcing the award of any grant
185	in their district or any public announcement or ceremony regarding
186	the groundbreaking or opening of a facility, roadway or bridge for
187	which the Legislature has made funds available. Any signage
188	regarding any public event or any new facility, roadway or bridge
189	shall include the following language: "Funds were made available
190	for this project by the Mississippi State Legislature." The
191	signage shall further state the four-year legislative term in
192	which the project was funded.

193	SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature to
194	authorize the State Aid Engineer to utilize funds available to the
195	Office of State Aid Road Construction, from any source herein
196	appropriated or made available by the counties or any other
197	source, to pay for costs necessary to comply with the National
198	Bridge Inspection Standards and the Federal Highway
199	Administration's requirements for bridge inspections and/or
200	special studies necessary to comply with federal laws. The State
201	Aid Engineer shall follow the same procedures as have heretofore
202	been established by Sections 65-9-9, 65-9-15 and 65-9-17,
203	Mississippi Code of 1972, for payment of such costs. The Office
204	of State Aid Road Construction may accept, budget and expend these
205	funds subject to and in accordance with rules and regulations of
206	the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner
207	consistent with the escalation of federal or state funds.
208	SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that in
209	the letting of contracts for which the Office of State Aid Road
210	Construction administers and provides engineering services to
211	political subdivisions under the Economic Development Highway Act,
212	bids may be made from the lowest and best bidder after advertising
213	for competitive sealed bids once in a newspaper published or
214	having a circulation in the county or municipality where the
215	contract will be performed, and the date published for the bid
216	opening may be not less than seven (7) working days after the
217	advertisement is published.

218	SECTION 10. The State Engineer is hereby authorized to
219	transfer from any special fund to another special fund under the
220	control of State Aid Road for the administration, planning,
221	construction, maintenance, or inspection of Mississippi roads and
222	bridges, provided that such transfers do not exceed twenty percent
223	(20%) of the total fund allocated for this purpose. The State Aid
224	Engineer shall submit written notification to the State Fiscal
225	Officer and the Legislative Budget Office prior to executing any
226	such transfer, detailing the amount and purpose of the transfer.
227	SECTION 11. It is the intention of the Legislature that
228	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
229	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
230	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,
231	quality and service, the Mississippi Industries for the Blind
232	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
233	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
234	made without competitive bids.
235	SECTION 12. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
236	funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
237	Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
238	shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
239	appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
240	or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
241	actions contrary to this provision.

242	SECTION 13. Of the funds appropriated in Section 1, Fifty
243	Thousand Dollars ($$50,000.00$), or so much thereof as may be
244	necessary, shall be derived out of any money in the State Treasury
245	to the credit of the Project Poppy Fund, as created in Section
246	57-1-631, Mississippi Code of 1972, and allocated in a manner as
247	determined by the Treasurer's Office. These funds are provided
248	for expediting services needed for Project Poppy.
249	SECTION 14. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
250	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
251	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
252	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
253	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
254	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
255	SECTION 15. This act shall take effect and be in force from
256	and after July 1 2025
