1 2	AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO DEFRAY THE EXPENSES OF THE MISSISSIPPI WORKERS' COMPENSATION COMMISSION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2026.
3	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
4	SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
5	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
6	General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the purpose of
7	defraying the expenses incurred by the Mississippi Workers'
8	Compensation Commission for the fiscal year beginning
9	July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026\$ 6,164,999.00.
10	SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
11	necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
12	Treasury to the credit of the Second Injury Fund (Fund Number
13	3352300000) for the purpose of making payments under the
14	provisions of Section 71-3-73, Mississippi Code of 1972, for the
15	fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2026
16	\$ 25,000.00.
17	SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of
18	this act, not more than the following amount of funds, with the
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20 only for "Personal Services," which includes "Vac	cancy Funding,"

As used in this section, the term "Personal	Services" shall
36 mean funds provided under the major object of exp	penditure category
37 Personal Services for Salaries, Wages, and Fringe	e Benefits. Funds
38 in this category shall not be transferred to any	other category.
39 It is the intention of the Legislature to en	nsure compliance
40 with the Variable Compensation Plan, as outlined	in Section
41 25-9-147, Mississippi Code of 1972. Payment from	these funds shall
42 be in accordance with the Variable Compensation 1	Plan promulgated
43 by the Mississippi State Personnel Board. It is	the Legislature's

- 44 intention that no employee's salary falls below the minimum salary
- 45 established by the Mississippi State Personnel Board.
- The State Personnel Board shall determine and publish the
- 47 projected annual cost of "Personal Services" based on monthly and
- 48 year-to-date payroll expenditures in compliance with the
- 49 provisions of this act.
- With the funds herein appropriated, it shall be the agency's
- 51 responsibility to ensure that no single personnel action or
- 52 combination of personnel actions, when annualized, exceeds the
- 53 Fiscal Year 2026 appropriation for "Personal Services" with the
- 54 exception of escalated funds. Further, it shall be the agency's
- 55 responsibility to ensure that funds required to be appropriated
- 56 for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2027 do not exceed Fiscal
- 57 Year 2026 funds appropriated for that purpose unless programs or
- 58 positions are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2026 budget by the
- 59 Mississippi Legislature.
- If, at the time the agency takes any action to change
- 61 "Personal Services," the State Personnel Board determines that the
- 62 agency has taken or will take an action that would cause the
- 63 agency to exceed the funds appropriated in this act when
- 64 annualized for Fiscal Year 2026 or increase the need for "Personal
- 65 Services" for Fiscal Year 2027, when annualized, the State
- 66 Personnel Board shall process no salary actions until such time as
- 67 the requirements of the provisions of this section are met with

- 68 the exception of new hires determined to be essential for the 69 agency.
- 70 When used in this section, "Vacancy Funding" shall mean funds
- 71 included in the Total Personal Services amount listed above and
- 72 designated for approved vacancies in Fiscal Year 2026. These funds
- 73 are to be utilized to increase the number of filled headcounts
- 74 that were authorized but unfilled as of the last day of Fiscal
- 75 Year 2025. If the agency fills additional headcounts after May 1,
- 76 2025, until the end of Fiscal Year 2025, the amount of available
- 77 Vacancy Funding may be proportionally reduced to reflect the
- 78 updated number of filled headcounts. The agency shall be
- 79 responsible for ensuring that "Vacancy Funding" is used to
- 80 increase headcounts and not for promotions, title changes,
- in-range salary adjustments, or any other mechanism for increasing 81
- 82 salaries for current employees.
- 83 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 84 the terms, conditions, and procedures established by law or
- allowable under the terms set forth within this act. The State 85
- 86 Personnel Board shall not escalate positions without written
- 87 approval from the Department of Finance and Administration. The
- 88 Department of Finance and Administration shall not provide written
- 89 approval to escalate any funds for salaries and/or headcounts
- without proof of availability of new or additional funds above the 90
- 91 appropriated level. Unless specifically noted, all Fiscal Year

- 92 2025 escalated headcounts have been accounted for and shall be 93 converted to authorized time-limited headcounts.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- None of the funds herein appropriated shall be used in
 violation of the Internal Revenue Service's Publication 15-A
 relating to the reporting of income paid to contract employees, as
 interpreted by the Office of the State Auditor.
- If the agency's total authorized headcount decreases from 103 Fiscal Year 2025 to Fiscal Year 2026, it will be the agency's 104 discretion as to what headcounts are removed.
- 105 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 106 Mississippi Workers' Compensation Commission shall maintain 107 complete accounting and personnel records related to the 108 expenditure of all funds appropriated under this act and that such 109 records shall be in the same format and level of detail as 110 maintained for Fiscal Year 2025. It is further the intention of 111 the Legislature that the agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 112 2027 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget Committee 113 in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level 114 of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2026 budget request 115 process.

116	SECTION 5. It is the intention of the Legislature that with
117	the funds appropriated in Section 1 of this act, the Mississippi
118	Workers' Compensation Commission shall enter into a contract with
119	the industrial private sector for the purpose of implementing a
120	safety education and training program.
121	SECTION 6. In compliance with the "Mississippi Performance
122	Budget and Strategic Planning Act of 1994," it is the intent of
123	the Legislature that the funds provided herein shall be utilized
124	in the most efficient and effective manner possible to achieve the
125	intended mission of this agency. Based on the funding authorized,
126	this agency shall make every effort to attain the targeted
127	performance measures provided below:

158	A reporting of the degree to which the performance targets
159	set above have been or are being achieved shall be provided in the
160	agency's budget request submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget
161	Committee for Fiscal Year 2027.
162	SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that
163	whenever two (2) or more bids are received by this agency for the
164	purchase of commodities or equipment, and whenever all things
165	stated in such received bids are equal with respect to price,

167	shall be given preference. A similar preference shall be given to
168	the Mississippi Industries for the Blind whenever purchases are
169	made without competitive bids.
170	SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
171	salary of the Workers' Compensation Commission members shall be
172	equal and the salary of the commission chairman shall exceed these
173	salaries as approved by the State Personnel Board.
174	SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
175	funds herein appropriated shall be expended in compliance with
176	Section 27-104-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, that no state agency
177	shall incur obligations or indebtedness in excess of their
178	appropriation and that the responsible officers, either personally
179	or upon their official bonds, shall be held responsible for
180	actions contrary to this provision.
181	SECTION 10. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
182	the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
183	credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
184	warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
185	Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
186	proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.
187	SECTION 11. This act shall take effect and be in force from
