HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 6  
(As Adopted by House)

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING MISS HELEN J. MCDADE FOR HER MANY  
2 YEARS OF PUBLIC SERVICE TO KEMPER COUNTY, MISSISSIPPI.

3 WHEREAS, Miss Helen J. McDade has been a lifelong resident of  
4 Kemper County, Mississippi, where she has worked in the legal  
5 field for over fifty years; and

6 WHEREAS, Miss McDade began her career as a legal secretary  
7 and court reporter in Kemper County; and

8 WHEREAS, in July 1947, Miss McDade was admitted to the  
9 practice of law before the courts of the State of Mississippi; and

10 WHEREAS, representing the citizens of Kemper County, Miss  
11 McDade was elected to the Mississippi House of Representatives,  
12 where she faithfully served from 1968 to 1980; and

13 WHEREAS, Miss McDade, County Prosecuting Attorney since  
14 September 1992, has won justice for the victims and families of  
15 Kemper County by prosecuting and obtaining convictions for  
16 numerous criminals; and

17 WHEREAS, in June 1998, Miss McDade was dutifully recognized  
18 by the Mississippi Bar for her outstanding service in the legal  
19 profession in the State of Mississippi for over fifty years; and

20 WHEREAS, the House of Representatives finds it most  
21 appropriate to pay special tribute to such an outstanding citizen  
22 as Miss Helen J. McDade, who has served the citizens of Kemper  
23 County, Mississippi, to the best of her ability in carrying out  
24 her many duties of public service in the legal profession for over  
25 fifty years:
