## REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

## MR. PRESIDENT AND MR. SPEAKER:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

S.B. No. 2257: Child care facility licensure law; make technical amendments thereto.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the House recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the Senate and House adopt the following amendment:
- 1 AMEND by striking Section 1 in its entirety and substitute in
- 2 lieu thereof the following:
- 3 SECTION 1. Section 43-20-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 4 amended as follows:
- 5 43-20-5. When used in this chapter, the following words
- 6 shall have the following meanings:
- 7 (a) "Child care facility" means a place which provides
- 8 shelter and personal care for six (6) or more children who are not
- 9 related within the third degree computed according to the civil
- 10 law to the operator and who are under thirteen (13) years of age,
- 11 for any part of the 24-hour day, whether such place be organized
- 12 or operated for profit or not. The term "child care facility"
- 13 includes day nurseries, day care centers and any other facility
- 14 that falls within the scope of the definitions set forth above,
- 15 regardless of auspices. Exemptions from the provisions of this
- 16 chapter include:
- 17 <u>(i)</u> Child care facilities which operate for no
- 18 more than two (2) days a week, whose primary purpose is to provide
- 19 respite for the caregiver or temporary care during other scheduled
- 20 or related activities and organized programs which operate for
- 21 three (3) or less weeks per year such as, but not limited to,
- 22 vacation bible schools and scout day camps \* \* \*.
- 23 <u>(ii)</u> \* \* \* Any child residential home as defined
- in, and in compliance with the provisions of, Section 43-16-3(b)
- 25 et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972.

26	(iii) * * * Any elementary, including
27	kindergarten, and/or secondary school system, accredited by the
28	Mississippi State Department of Education, the Southern
29	Association of Colleges and Schools, * * * the Mississippi Private
30	School Education Association, the Association of Christian Schools
31	International, and any Headstart program operating in conjunction
32	with an elementary school system, whether it be public, private or
33	parochial, whose primary purpose is a structured school or school
34	readiness program. <u>Accreditation</u> , for the purpose of exemption
35	from the provisions of this paragraph, shall mean (A) receipt by
36	any school or school system of full accreditation from an
37	accrediting entity listed within this paragraph, or (B) proof of
38	application by the school or school system for accreditation
39	status from the accrediting entity. Proof of application for
40	accreditation status shall include, but not be limited to, a copy
41	of the applicant's completed application for accreditation filed
42	with the licensing agency and a letter or other authenticating
43	documentation from a signatory authority with the accrediting
44	entity that the application for accreditation has been received
45	and that the applicant is currently under consideration or review
46	for full accreditation status by the accrediting entity. An
47	exemption for a non-accredited applicant under this paragraph
48	shall be for a maximum of six (6) months from the receipt date by
49	the licensing agency of the completed documentation for proof of
50	application for accreditation status. Failure to receive full
51	accreditation by the end of the six-month exemption period for a
52	non-accredited applicant shall result in the non-accredited
53	applicant no longer remaining exempt from the provisions of this
54	chapter at the end of the six-month period. This paragraph (iii)
55	shall stand repealed on July 1, 2001.
56	(iv) * * * Any membership organization affiliated
57	with a national organization which charges only a nominal annual
58	membership fee, does not receive monthly, weekly or daily payments
59	for services, and is certified by its national association as
60	being in compliance with the association's minimum standards and

- 61 procedures, including, but not limited to, the Boys and Girls Club
- 62 of America, and the YMCA.
- 63 <u>(v) Any family child care home as defined in</u>
- 64 <u>Section 43-20-53(a) et seq., Mississippi Code of 1972.</u>
- All other preschool child care programs and/or extended day
- 66 school programs must meet requirements set forth in this chapter.
- (b) "Health" means that condition of being sound in
- 68 mind and body and encompasses an individual's physical, mental and
- 69 emotional welfare.
- 70 (c) "Safety" means that condition of being protected
- 71 from hurt, injury or loss.
- 72 (d) "Person" means any person, firm, partnership,
- 73 corporation or association.
- 74 (e) "Operator" means any person, acting individually or
- 75 jointly with another person or persons, who shall establish, own,
- 76 operate, conduct or maintain a child care facility. The child
- 77 care facility license shall be issued in the name of the operator,
- 78 or, if there is more than one (1) operator, in the name of one (1)
- 79 of the operators. In the event that there is more than one (1)
- 80 operator, all statutory and regulatory provisions concerning the
- 81 <u>background checks of operators shall be equally applied to all</u>
- 82 operators of a facility, including, but not limited to, a spouse
- 83 who jointly owns, operates or maintains the child care facility
- 84 regardless of which particular person is named on the license.
- (f) "Personal care" means assistance rendered by
- 86 personnel of the child care facility in performing one or more of
- 87 the activities of daily living, which includes, but is not limited
- 88 to, the feeding, personal grooming, supervising and dressing of
- 89 children placed in the child care facility.
- 90 (g) "Licensing agency" means the Mississippi State
- 91 Department of Health.
- 92 <u>(h) "Caregiver" means any person who provides direct</u>

93 care, supervision or quidance to children in a child care
94 facility, reqardless of title or occupation.
