- 3 BENEFITS TRUST FUND; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 45-2-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 45-2-1. (1) Whenever used in this section, the term:
- 8 (a) "Employer" means a state board, commission,
- 9 department, division, bureau, or agency, or a county, municipality
- 10 or other political subdivision of the state, which employs,
- 11 appoints or otherwise engages the services of law enforcement
- 12 officers or firefighters.
- 13 (b) <u>"Firefighter" means any person who is involved in</u>
- 14 <u>extinguishing fires or fire protection whether such person is a</u>
- 15 <u>volunteer or not</u>.
- 16 <u>(c)</u> "Law enforcement officer" means any lawfully sworn
- 17 officer or employee of the state or any political subdivision of
- 18 the state whose duties require the officer or employee to
- 19 investigate, pursue, apprehend, arrest, transport or maintain
- 20 custody of persons who are charged with, suspected of committing,
- 21 or convicted of a crime.
- 22 (2) (a) The Department of Public Safety shall make a
- 23 payment, as provided in this section, in the amount of Ten
- 24 Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) when a law enforcement officer,
- 25 while engaged in the performance of the officer's law enforcement
- 26 duties, or a firefighter, while engaged in the performance of the

- 27 <u>firefighter's duties</u>, is accidentally or intentionally killed or
- 28 receives accidental or intentional bodily injury that results in
- 29 the loss of the officer's <u>or firefighter's</u> life, provided that the
- 30 killing is not the result of suicide and that the bodily injury is
- 31 not intentionally self-inflicted.
- 32 (b) The payment provided for under paragraph (a) of
- 33 this subsection shall be made to the beneficiary that was
- 34 designated in writing by the law enforcement officer or
- 35 <u>firefighter</u>, signed by the officer <u>or firefighter</u> and delivered to
- 36 the employer during the officer's or firefighter's lifetime. If
- 37 no such designation is made, then the payment shall be made to the
- 38 officer's or firefighter's surviving child or children and spouse
- 39 in equal portions, and if there is no surviving child or spouse,
- 40 then to the officer's or firefighter's parent or parents. If a
- 41 beneficiary is not designated and there is no surviving child,
- 42 spouse or parent, then the payment shall be made to the officer's
- 43 <u>or firefighter's</u> estate.
- (c) The payment made under paragraph (a) of this
- 45 subsection is in addition to any workers' compensation or pension
- 46 benefits and is exempt from the claims and demands of creditors of
- 47 the law enforcement officer or firefighter.
- 48 (3) (a) There is established in the State Treasury a
- 49 special fund to be known as the Law Enforcement Officers and
- 50 <u>Firefighters</u> Death Benefits Trust Fund. The trust fund shall be
- 51 funded by an initial appropriation of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 52 (\$200,000.00), and shall be comprised of any additional funds made
- 53 available by the Legislature or by donation, contribution, gift or
- 54 any other source.
- 55 (b) The State Treasurer shall invest the monies of the
- 56 trust fund in any of the investments authorized for the funds of
- 57 the Public Employees' Retirement System under Section 25-11-121,
- 58 and those investments shall be subject to the limitations
- 59 prescribed by Section 25-11-121.
- 60 (c) Unexpended amounts remaining in the trust fund at
- 61 the end of the state fiscal year shall not lapse into the State
- 62 General Fund, and any income earned on amounts in the trust fund
- 63 shall be deposited to the credit of the trust fund.

- 64 (4) The Department of Public Safety shall be responsible for
- 65 the management of the trust fund and the disbursement of death
- 66 benefits authorized under this section. The Department of Public
- 67 Safety shall adopt rules and regulations necessary to implement
- 68 and standardize the payment of death benefits under this section,
- 69 to administer the trust fund created by this section and to carry
- 70 out the purposes of this section.
- 71 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 72 and after July 1, 2000.
