HOUSE BILL NO. 239

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-3-519, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
- 2 TO AUTHORIZE THE SHERIFF AND HIS DEPUTIES IN ANY COUNTY HAVING A
- 3 POPULATION OF SIXTY THOUSAND OR MORE, UPON RESOLUTION DULY ADOPTED
- 4 BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY, TO USE RADAR SPEED
- 5 DETECTION EQUIPMENT UPON THE PUBLIC STREETS, ROADS AND HIGHWAYS OF
- 6 THE COUNTY LYING OUTSIDE OF THE LIMITS OF ANY INCORPORATED
- 7 MUNICIPALITY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 9 SECTION 1. Section 63-3-519, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 10 amended as follows:[JWB1]
- 11 63-3-519. (1) It is unlawful for any person or peace
- 12 officer or law enforcement agency, except the Mississippi Highway
- 13 Safety Patrol, to purchase or use or allow to be used any type of
- 14 radar speed detection equipment upon any public street, road or
- 15 highway of this state. However, such equipment may be used:
- 16 <u>(a)</u> By municipal law enforcement officers within a
- 17 municipality having a population of two thousand (2,000) or more
- 18 upon the public streets of the municipality;
- 19 <u>(b)</u> By any college or university campus police force
- 20 within the confines of any campus wherein more than two thousand
- 21 (2,000) students are enrolled;
- 22 <u>(c)</u> By municipal law enforcement officers in any
- 23 municipality having a population in excess of fifteen thousand

- 24 (15,000) according to the latest federal census on federally
- 25 designated highways lying within the corporate limits; and
- 26 (d) By the sheriff and deputy sheriffs of any county
- 27 <u>having a population of sixty thousand (60,000) or more, according</u>
- 28 to the latest federal decennial census, upon resolution duly
- 29 <u>adopted and entered on the minutes of the board of supervisors of</u>
- 30 the county, upon the public streets, roads and highways of the
- 31 county lying outside of the limits of any incorporated
- 32 <u>municipality</u>.
- 33 (2) The Mississippi Highway Safety Patrol shall not set up
- 34 radar on highways within municipalities with a population in
- 35 excess of fifteen thousand (15,000) according to the latest
- 36 federal census.
- 37 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 38 and after July 1, 2000.
