HOUSE BILL NO. 415 (As Passed the House)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 69-25-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE COMMISSIONER OF AGRICULTURE SHALL MEET QUARTERLY 3 WITH THE DIRECTOR OF THE BUREAU OF PLANT INDUSTRY INSTEAD OF THE STATE ENTOMOLOGIST; TO AMEND SECTION 69-25-5, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE DIRECTOR OF THE BUREAU OF PLANT INDUSTRY 5 6 SHALL PERFORM CERTAIN FUNCTIONS PREVIOUSLY ASSIGNED TO THE STATE 7 ENTOMOLOGIST; TO PROVIDE THAT THE COMMISSIONER OF AGRICULTURE AND THE DIRECTOR OF THE BUREAU OF PLANT INDUSTRY SHALL APPOINT THE 8 9 STATE ENTOMOLOGIST; TO AMEND SECTION 69-25-51, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE DIRECTOR OF THE BUREAU OF PLANT 10 INDUSTRY, RATHER THAN THE STATE ENTOMOLOGIST, SHALL ACT AS A REVIEWING OFFICER WHEN ANY ALLEGATION OR CHARGE HAS BEEN MADE 11 12 AGAINST A PERSON FOR VIOLATING THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE 13 14 BUREAU OF PLANT INDUSTRY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 69-25-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 16 17 amended as follows: 69-25-3. The State Plant Board is abolished and its duties 18 are transferred to the Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce, 19 20 and it shall henceforth be known as the Bureau of Plant Industry. 21 There is created an Advisory Board to the Bureau of Plant Industry, composed of the following: the State Chemist; the head 22 of the Entomology and Plant Pathology Department, Mississippi 23 24 State University of Agriculture and Applied Science; the head of 25 the Plant and Soil Science Department, Mississippi State University of Agriculture and Applied Science; Alcorn State 26 27 University Director of Agriculture and Applied Sciences; and, for a period of two (2) years, the following: one (1) soil 28 29 conservation district commissioner appointed by the commissioner; 30 two (2) residents of Mississippi who engage in the production of 31 any crop, appointed by the commissioner; one (1) resident of the State of Mississippi who is a commercial applicator holding a 32

- 33 license issued under the rules and regulations of the Bureau of
- 34 Plant Industry, appointed by the commissioner; one (1) resident of
- 35 the State of Mississippi who is a restricted use pesticide
- 36 registrant or an employee of such person, appointed by the
- 37 commissioner; one (1) resident of the State of Mississippi who is
- 38 either a wholesale or retail horticulturist, appointed by the
- 39 commissioner, and one (1) resident of the State of Mississippi who
- 40 is a licensed landscape contractor, appointed by the commissioner,
- 41 who shall serve with no compensation and whose duties are to
- 42 advise the commissioner on all matters regarding the Bureau of
- 43 Plant Industry. The commissioner shall meet quarterly * * * with
- 44 the advisory board and the <u>Director of the Bureau of Plant</u>
- 45 <u>Industry</u>. It is the intent and purpose of this section to maintain
- 46 the domicile of this division of the Department of Agriculture and
- 47 Commerce at Mississippi State University of Agriculture and
- 48 Applied Science, Mississippi State, Mississippi.
- 49 SECTION 2. Section 69-25-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 50 amended as follows:[HS1]
- 51 69-25-5. The Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce shall
- 52 appoint a full-time executive secretary and director, hereinafter
- 53 called the "Director of the Bureau of Plant Industry," whose
- 54 office shall be at Mississippi State University of Agriculture and
- 55 Applied Science. The <u>director</u> shall serve at the will and
- 56 pleasure of the commissioner and shall receive a salary in an
- 57 amount to be determined by the commissioner. It shall be the duty
- 58 of the <u>director</u> to enforce the rules and regulations adopted by
- 59 the commissioner and to perform such other functions that may be
- 60 assigned to him by the * * * commissioner.
- The Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce and the Director
- 62 <u>of the Bureau of Plant Industry shall appoint a full-time State</u>
- 63 Entomologist, who shall be a qualified entomologist and whose
- 64 <u>office shall be at Mississippi State University of Agriculture and</u>
- 65 Applied Science.
- The full-time executive secretary and director provided for
- 67 in the first paragraph of this section shall carry out the
- 68 statutory functions of the executive officer of the Bureau of
- 69 Plant Industry, Mississippi Department of Agriculture and

- 70 Commerce, as provided in Section 69-21-107. He shall serve a term
- 71 of office on the State Board of Agricultural Aviation on a
- 72 continuous basis as long as he performs his functions as executive
- 73 secretary or director.
- 74 SECTION 3. Section 69-25-51, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 75 amended as follows:
- 76 69-25-51. (1) When any allegation or charge has been made
- 77 against a person for violating the rules and regulations of the
- 78 Bureau of Plant Industry within the regulatory office of the
- 79 Mississippi Department of Agriculture and Commerce or the laws set
- 80 forth in Sections 69-19-1 through 69-19-11 and Sections 69-21-1
- 81 through 69-21-27 and Sections 69-23-1 through 69-23-133,
- 82 Mississippi Code of 1972, the <u>Director of the Bureau of Plant</u>
- 83 <u>Industry</u> or his designated employee shall act as a reviewing
- 84 officer. The designated reviewing officer shall (a) cause the
- 85 complaint to be in writing and signed by the person making the
- 86 charge; (b) insure that the complaint is filed in the Office of
- 87 the Bureau of Plant Industry; and (c) send a copy of the complaint
- 88 and any supporting documents to the person accused along with a
- 89 request for the accused to respond to the allegations within
- 90 thirty (30) days. Such notification shall be accomplished by any
- 91 of the methods provided for in Rule 4 of the Mississippi Rules of
- 92 Civil Procedure. Upon receipt of the response and any supporting
- 93 documents from the accused, the reviewing officer shall screen all
- 94 information on file to determine the merit of the complaint or
- 95 lack thereof. The reviewing officer may meet with and discuss the
- 96 alleged violation with the accused.
- 97 (2) If the reviewing officer determines that the complaint
- 98 lacks merit, he may recommend to the Commissioner of Agriculture
- 99 and Commerce that the complaint be dismissed.
- 100 (3) If the reviewing officer determines that there are
- 101 reasonable grounds to indicate that a violation has occurred or if
- 102 the accused admits to the truth of the allegations upon which the

complaint is based, the reviewing officer may recommend to the
Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce an appropriate penalty
which may be a written notice of warning, assessment of civil
penalties or suspension or cancellation of license or permit as
provided by the Rules and Regulations of the Bureau of Plant
Industry and/or a fine not to exceed Five Thousand Dollars

(\$5,000.00) for each violation.

(4) If the accused requests a hearing, in writing, within thirty (30) days from receipt of the decision of the Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce, the commissioner shall appoint three (3) members of the advisory board to the Bureau of Plant Industry to act as a hearing committee and a hearing shall be scheduled.

In determining the amount of the penalty, the reviewing officer shall consider the appropriateness of such penalty for the particular violation, the effect of the penalty on the person's ability to continue in business and the gravity of the violation.

119 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from 120 and after July 1, 2000.

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
