HOUSE BILL NO. 658

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-25, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
- 2 AUTHORIZE THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF CLAIBORNE COUNTY TO PAY AN
- 3 ANNUAL SUPPLEMENT TO THE SHERIFF; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 25-3-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 25-3-25. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsections
- 8 (2) through (10), the salaries of sheriffs of the various counties
- 9 are * * * fixed as full compensation for their services.
- 10 From and after October 1, 1998, the annual salary for each
- 11 sheriff shall be based upon the total population of his county
- 12 according to the latest federal decennial census in the following
- 13 categories and for the following amounts; however, no sheriff
- 14 shall be paid less than the salary authorized under this section
- 15 to be paid the sheriff based upon the population of the county
- 16 according to the 1980 federal decennial census:
- 17 (a) For counties with a total population of more than
- 18 two hundred thousand (200,000), a salary of Seventy-five Thousand
- 19 Dollars (\$75,000.00).
- 20 (b) For counties with a total population of more than
- 21 one hundred thousand (100,000) and not more than two hundred

- 22 thousand (200,000), a salary of Seventy Thousand Dollars
- (\$70,000.00). 23
- (c) For counties with a total population of more than 24
- 25 forty-five thousand (45,000) and not more than one hundred
- thousand (100,000), a salary of Sixty-five Thousand Dollars 26
- 27 (\$65,000.00).
- (d) For counties with a total population of more than 28
- thirty-four thousand (34,000) and not more than forty-five 29
- 30 thousand (45,000), a salary of Sixty Thousand Dollars
- (\$60,000.00). 31
- 32 (e) For counties with a total population of more than
- twenty-five thousand (25,000) and not more than thirty-four 33
- 34 thousand (34,000), a salary of Fifty-two Thousand Dollars
- 35 (\$52,000.00).
- For counties with a total population of more than 36 (f)
- 37 fifteen thousand (15,000) and not more than twenty-five thousand
- (25,000), a salary of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00). 38
- (g) For counties with a total population of more than 39
- 40 nine thousand five hundred (9,500) and not more than fifteen
- thousand (15,000), a salary of Forty-seven Thousand Dollars 41
- 42 (\$47,000.00).
- (h) For counties with a total population of more than 43
- 44 seven thousand five hundred (7,500) and not more than nine
- thousand five hundred (9,500), a salary of Forty-five Thousand 45
- Dollars (\$45,000.00). 46
- (i) For counties with a total population of not more 47
- than seven thousand five hundred (7,500), a salary of Forty-two 48
- Thousand Dollars (\$42,000.00). 49
- (2) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) 50
- 51 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Leflore County * * *,
- 52 in its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of

- 53 the county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 54 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- 55 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
- 56 county for the following reasons:
- 57 (a) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates
- 58 and maintains a restitution center within the county;
- 59 (b) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates
- and maintains a community work center within the county;
- 61 (c) There is a resident circuit court judge in the
- 62 county whose office is located at the Leflore County Courthouse;
- (d) There is a resident chancery court judge in the
- 64 county whose office is located at the Leflore County Courthouse;
- (e) The Magistrate for the Fourth Circuit Court
- 66 District is located in the county and maintains his office at the
- 67 Leflore County Courthouse;
- (f) The Region VI Mental Health-Mental Retardation
- 69 Center, which serves a multicounty area, calls upon the sheriff to
- 70 provide security for out-of-town mental patients, as well as
- 71 patients from within the county;
- 72 (g) The increased activity of the Child Support
- 73 Division of the Department of Human Services in enforcing in the
- 74 courts parental obligations has imposed additional duties on the
- 75 sheriff; and
- 76 (h) The dispatchers of the enhanced E-911 system in
- 77 place in Leflore County has been placed under the direction and
- 78 control of the sheriff.
- 79 (3) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 80 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Rankin County * * *,

- 81 in its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of
- 82 the county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 83 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- 84 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
- 85 county for the following reasons:
- 86 (a) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates
- 87 and maintains the Central Mississippi Correctional Facility within
- 88 the county;
- 89 (b) The State Hospital is operated and maintained
- 90 within the county at Whitfield;
- 91 (c) Hudspeth Regional Center, a facility maintained for
- 92 the care and treatment of the mentally retarded, is located within
- 93 the county;
- 94 (d) The Mississippi Law Enforcement Officers Training
- 95 Academy is operated and maintained within the county;
- 96 (e) The State Fire Academy is operated and maintained
- 97 within the county;
- 98 (f) The Pearl River Valley Water Supply District,
- 99 ordinarily known as the "Reservoir District," is located within
- 100 the county;
- 101 (g) The Jackson International Airport is located within
- 102 the county;
- 103 (h) The patrolling of the state properties located
- 104 within the county has imposed additional duties on the sheriff;
- 105 and
- 106 (i) The sheriff, in addition to providing security to
- 107 the nearly one hundred thousand (100,000) residents of the county,
- 108 has the duty to investigate, solve and assist in the prosecution

- 109 of any misdemeanor or felony committed upon any state property
- 110 located in Rankin County.
- 111 (4) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 112 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Neshoba County shall
- 113 pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county an amount
- 114 equal to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00).
- 115 (5) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 116 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Tunica County * * *,
- 117 in their discretion, <u>may</u> pay an annual supplement to the sheriff
- 118 of the county an amount equal to Ten Thousand Dollars
- 119 (\$10,000.00), payable beginning April 1, 1997.
- 120 (6) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 121 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Hinds County shall
- 122 pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county in an amount
- 123 equal to Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00). The Legislature
- 124 finds and declares that the annual supplement authorized by this
- 125 subsection is justified in such county for the following reasons:
- 126 (a) Hinds County has the greatest population of any
- 127 county, two hundred fifty-four thousand four hundred forty-one
- 128 (254,441) by the 1990 census, being almost one hundred thousand
- 129 (100,000) more than the next most populous county;
- 130 (b) Hinds County is home to the state capitol and the
- 131 seat of all state government offices;
- 132 (c) Hinds County is the third largest county in
- 133 geographic area, containing eight hundred seventy-five (875)
- 134 square miles;
- (d) Hinds County is comprised of two (2) judicial
- 136 districts, each having a courthouse and county office buildings;

- (e) There are four (4) resident circuit judges, four
- 138 (4) resident chancery judges, and three (3) resident county judges
- 139 in Hinds County, the most of any county, with the sheriff acting
- 140 as chief executive officer and provider of bailiff services for
- 141 all;
- 142 (f) The main offices for the clerk and most of the
- 143 judges and magistrates for the United States District Court for
- 144 the Southern District of Mississippi are located within the
- 145 county;
- 146 (g) The state's only urban university, Jackson State
- 147 University, is located within the county;
- 148 (h) The University of Mississippi Medical Center,
- 149 combining the medical school, dental school, nursing school and
- 150 hospital, is located within the county;
- 151 (i) Mississippi Veterans Memorial Stadium, the state's
- 152 largest sports arena, is located within the county;
- 153 (j) The Mississippi State Fairgrounds, including the
- 154 Coliseum and Trade Mart, are located within the county;
- (k) Hinds County has the largest criminal population in
- 156 the state, such that the Hinds County Sheriff's Department
- 157 operates the largest county jail system in the state, housing
- 158 almost one thousand (1,000) inmates in three (3) separate
- 159 detention facilities;
- 160 (1) The Hinds County Sheriff's Department handles more
- 161 mental and drug and alcohol commitments cases than any other
- 162 sheriff's department in the state;
- 163 (m) The Mississippi Department of Corrections maintains
- 164 a restitution center within the county;

- 165 (n) The Mississippi Department of Corrections regularly
- 166 houses as many as one hundred (100) state convicts within the
- 167 Hinds County jail system; and
- 168 (o) The Hinds County Sheriff's Department is regularly
- 169 asked to provide security services not only at the Fairgrounds and
- 170 Memorial Stadium, but also for events at the Mississippi Museum of
- 171 Art and Jackson City Auditorium.
- 172 (7) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 173 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Wilkinson County, in
- 174 its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 175 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 176 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- 177 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
- 178 county because the Mississippi Department of Corrections contracts
- 179 for the private incarceration of state inmates at a private
- 180 correctional facility within the county.
- 181 (8) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
- 182 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Marshall County, in
- 183 its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the
- 184 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 185 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- 186 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
- 187 county because the Mississippi Department of Corrections contracts
- 188 for the private incarceration of state inmates at a private
- 189 correctional facility within the county.
- 190 (9) In addition to the salary provided in subsection (1) of
- 191 this section, the Board of Supervisors of Greene County, in its
- 192 discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the

- 193 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 194 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- 195 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such
- 196 county for the following reasons:
- 197 (a) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates
- 198 and maintains the South Mississippi Correctional Facility within
- 199 the county;
- 200 (b) In 1996, additional facilities to house another one
- 201 thousand four hundred sixteen (1,416) male offenders were
- 202 constructed at the South Mississippi Correctional Facility within
- 203 the county; and
- 204 (c) The patrolling of the state properties located
- 205 within the county has imposed additional duties on the sheriff
- 206 justifying additional compensation.
- 207 (10) <u>In addition to the salary provided for in subsection</u>
- 208 (1) of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Claiborne County,
- 209 <u>in its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of</u>
- 210 the county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars
- 211 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual
- 212 <u>supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in the</u>
- 213 <u>county because the Grand Gulf Nuclear Generating Plant and Alcorn</u>
- 214 State University are located within the county.
- 215 (11) The salaries herein provided shall be payable monthly
- 216 on the first day of each calendar month by chancery clerk's
- 217 warrant drawn on the general fund of the county; however, the
- 218 board of supervisors, by resolution duly adopted and entered on
- 219 its minutes, may provide that such salaries shall be paid
- 220 semimonthly on the first and fifteenth day of each month. If a

- 221 pay date falls on a weekend or legal holiday, salary payments
- 222 shall be made on the workday immediately preceding the weekend or
- 223 legal holiday.
- 224 SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi
- 225 shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor,
- 226 or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the
- 227 Attorney General of the United States or to the United States
- 228 District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the
- 229 provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and
- extended.
- 231 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 232 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting
- 233 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
