## HOUSE BILL NO. 871

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-7-31, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXTEND DEER HUNTING SEASON AND PERMIT DEER HUNTING WITH ANY LEGAL HUNTING WEAPON; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 49-7-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows:
- 7 49-7-31. (1) The open season for game birds and game
- 8 animals shall be as follows:
- 9 (a) On bobwhite quail: The season shall open on
- 10 Thanksgiving day and run through the first Saturday in March next
- 11 following.
- 12 (b) On pheasant: There shall be no open season on
- 13 pheasant.
- 14 (c) On wild turkey: The commission shall fix the
- 15 spring season between the Saturday nearest March 20 and May 1 in
- 16 designated areas. In addition, the commission may fix special
- 17 fall either-sex seasons.
- 18 (d) On squirrel:
- 19 (i) Zone 1: For areas north of Highway 82 plus
- 20 those portions of Sunflower County and Washington County south of
- 21 Highway 82 the season shall open on the Saturday nearest October 1
- 22 and run through February 28.
- 23 (ii) Zone 2: For areas between Highway 82 and
- 24 Highway 84, plus such portions of the state south of Highway 84
- 25 and west of Interstate 55, the season shall open on the Saturday
- 26 nearest October 15 and run through February 28.

- 27 (iii) Zone 3: For areas south of Highway 84 and
- 28 east of Interstate 55 the season shall open on the last Saturday
- 29 in October and run through February 28.
- 30 (e) On deer:
- 31 (i) <u>With or without dogs: December 1 through</u>
- 32 January 31. Deer hunting is allowed with any legal hunting
- 33 weapon.
- 34 (ii) When hunting deer with a gun, a hunter must
- 35 wear in full view five hundred (500) square inches of solid
- 36 unbroken fluorescent orange.
- 37 (iii) In order to set and regulate the deer
- 38 seasons, the commission may:
- 39 A. Set and regulate the deer seasons on
- 40 wildlife management areas which it administers;
- B. Allow the harvesting of antlerless deer in
- 42 the districts or zones upon the recommendation of the executive
- 43 director based upon good and substantial quantitative data and
- 44 research evaluations that demonstrate that the harvesting is
- 45 necessary to properly manage the herd. The commission, only upon
- 46 the recommendation of the executive director, may allow the
- 47 harvesting of antlerless deer during the deer season with guns and
- 48 with dogs by a majority vote of the commission. Nothing in this
- 49 section prohibits the harvesting of either sex deer by landowners
- 50 or leaseholders on private lands under a deer management program
- 51 prescribed or approved by the executive director.
- 52 C. Provide a special permit for the
- 53 harvesting of deer when they are depredating and destroying crops.
- 54 The department shall supervise the harvesting and provide for the
- 55 salvaging of the meat of the animals. The commission may
- 56 authorize the department to assist any farmer in this state, who
- 57 sustains crop damage by wildlife, in eradication of the problem
- 58 wildlife.
- 59 (iv) The commission shall establish a special

60 hunting season for youth under the age of sixteen (16) and for

61 handicapped persons in the Natchez State Park. The commission

62 shall also establish a primitive weapon season in the Natchez

63 State Park. The selection of participants in the primitive weapon

64 season shall be by public drawing from all qualified applications.

65 The commission shall set the number of permits to be issued and

66 the length of the special seasons. The commission may also

67 establish a special hunting season for youth and handicapped

68 persons or a primitive weapon season as provided in this

69 subparagraph in any other state park under the jurisdiction of the

70 department but shall only do so upon the recommendation of the

71 staff of the department as approved by the commission. The

72 commission shall select participants and set the number of permits

73 to be issued and the length of the special seasons in the manner

74 provided in this subparagraph.

75  $\underline{\text{(v)}}$  The commission may establish and regulate

special youth hunts for all nonmigratory game birds and animals

outside of the open season on wildlife management areas and on

78 private lands.

79 (f) On fur-bearing animals: The commission may fix the

open season on fur-bearing animals between November 1 and March 1

81 next following and fix the open season for hunting opossums,

82 raccoons and bobcats with dogs and guns by licensed hunters from

83 October 1 to February 28 next following; but raccoons and bobcats

84 may be run, hunted, chased or pursued throughout the year with

85 dogs by licensed hunters. The commission may establish an

86 additional open season on raccoon from July 1 through October 1,

87 and the bag limit on raccoon during the additional open season

88 shall be one (1) per party, per night.

89 (g) On rabbits: The season shall open on the Saturday

90 nearest October 15 and run through February 28 next following, and

91 when rabbits are depredating or destroying crops, the owner of the

92 crops or his tenants may shoot the rabbits with guns.

- 93 (h) On predatory animals: The hunting of predatory
- 94 animals shall be restricted to the open seasons for hunting any
- 95 game animal or game bird, using only the firearms, ammunition,
- 96 primitive weapons or archery equipment legal for use during that
- 97 open season. Landowners, agricultural leaseholders or their
- 98 designated agents may take predatory animals year-round on lands
- 99 owned or leased by them. The taking of any animal or animals
- 100 other than beavers or coyote by the use of a trap or traps is
- 101 unlawful except during the time the season is open for the taking
- 102 of fur-bearing animals. Fox and coyote may be run, chased or
- 103 pursued with dogs except as provided in Section 49-7-32 year-round
- 104 by licensed hunters.
- 105 (i) On migratory birds: The open season for migratory
- 106 birds shall be the season prescribed by the Federal Migratory Bird
- 107 Treaty regulations.
- 108 (j) On nongame gross fish: The season for taking
- 109 nongame gross fish by hand or with grappling tongs shall be from
- 110 May 1 to July 15.
- 111 (k) It is unlawful to trap fox after the closed season
- 112 for trapping of other fur-bearing animals, except on property
- 113 owned or leased by the person trapping.
- 114 (2) It is the intent of the Legislature that the open season
- 115 for game birds and game animals shall be stabilized unless some
- 116 unforeseen calamity affecting the resource necessitates earlier
- 117 change.
- 118 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 119 and after July 1, 2000.
