- TO REVISE THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON
- 3 TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICE FOR THE DEAF AND HEARING IMPAIRED AND
- 4 TO AUTHORIZE THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION TO DESIGNATE A
- 5 SUCCESSOR ORGANIZATION TO BE REPRESENTED ON THE COMMITTEE IF A
- 6 SPECIFIED ORGANIZATION CEASES TO EXIST; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 8 SECTION 1. Section 77-3-509, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 9 amended as follows:
- 10 77-3-509. (1) On or before August 1, 1990, the Public
- 11 Service Commission shall appoint an advisory committee to monitor
- 12 the statewide telecommunications relay access service and advise
- 13 and make recommendations to the Public Service Commission in
- 14 pursuing services which meet the needs of the hearing or speech
- 15 impaired and others similarly impaired in communicating with other
- 16 users of telecommunications services.
- 17 (2) The advisory committee shall be composed of:
- 18 (a) One (1) deaf person recommended by the Mississippi
- 19 Association of the Deaf;
- 20 (b) One (1) speech or hearing impaired person
- 21 recommended by the Mississippi Association for Retired Persons;
- (c) One (1) person recommended by the Coalition of
- 23 Citizens with Disabilities;

24 (d) One (1) representative of telecommunications
```

- 25 utilities chosen from a list of candidates provided by the
- 26 Mississippi/Alabama Telephone Association;
- 27 (e) One (1) representative of the Mississippi Speech
- 28 and Hearing Association;
- 29 (f) One (1) representative of the Veterans
- 30 Administration;
- 31 (g) One (1) representative from Vocational
- 32 Rehabilitation Deaf Services;
- 33 * * *
- 34 (h) One (1) hearing impaired representative of the
- 35 Mississippi School for the Deaf;
- 36 <u>(i)</u> Two (2) representatives chosen from the Public
- 37 Service Commission's staff and employees;
- 38 (j) One (1) person recommended by the Public Utilities
- 39 <u>Committee of the House of Representatives;</u>
- 40 (k) One (1) person recommended by the Public Utilities
- 41 <u>Committee of the Senate</u>;
- 42 (1) One (1) representative from the provider of the DPR
- 43 service; and
- (m) Three (3) "at large" individuals who have
- 45 particular skills, knowledge, experience or ability but who are
- 46 not necessarily speech or hearing impaired or otherwise affiliated
- 47 with an organization serving the speech or hearing impaired.
- The commission, in its discretion, may name a successor or
- 49 <u>similar organization to be represented on the committee if an</u>
- 50 <u>organization or agency named in this subsection ceases to exist.</u>
- 51 (3) The committee shall be appointed based on candidate
- 52 names submitted by the recommending agency or organization. Each
- 53 member of the advisory committee shall serve for a term of two (2)
- 54 years. A member whose term has expired shall continue to serve

- 55 until a qualified replacement is appointed. The members of the
- 56 advisory committee shall serve without compensation but shall be
- 57 entitled to reimbursement for travel <u>and expenses incurred in the</u>
- 58 performance of their official duties and per diem, which shall be
- 59 paid out of the trust fund on the same basis established for state
- 60 employees * * *.
- 61 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 62 and after its passage.
