## HOUSE BILL NO. 1130 (As Passed the House)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 43-6-151, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CHANGE THE TITLE OF THE MISSISSIPPI SUPPORT DOG ACT TO THE 1 3 MISSISSIPPI SUPPORT ANIMAL ACT; TO AMEND SECTION 43-6-155, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO ALLOW ANY PERSON WITH A DISABILITY 5 AND ALL ANIMALS SPECIFICALLY TRAINED TO ASSIST DISABLED PERSONS TO 6 HAVE ACCESS TO PUBLIC FACILITIES WITH CERTAIN LIMITATIONS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 SECTION 1. Section 43-6-151, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 10 amended as follows: 43-6-151. Sections 43-6-151 through 43-6-155 shall be known 11 as and may be cited as the "Mississippi Support Animal Act." 12 SECTION 2. Section 43-6-155, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 13 14 amended as follows: 15 43-6-155. (1) Any blind person, mobility impaired person, hearing impaired person or any other person living with a 16 17 disability who uses a dog or other animal specifically trained as a guide, leader, listener or for any other assistance necessary to 18 assist such blind, mobility impaired, hearing impaired person or 19 20 other person living with a disability in day-to-day activities shall be entitled to the full and equal accommodations, 21 22 advantages, facilities and privileges of all public conveyances, hotels, lodging places, businesses open to the public for the sale 23 24 of any goods or services and all places of public accommodation, amusement, or resort and other places to which the general public 25 is invited, and may take the dog or other animal into \* \* \* 26 conveyances and places, subject only to the conditions and 27

limitations applicable to all persons not so accompanied, except

- 30 (a) The dog or other animal shall not occupy a seat in
- 31 any public conveyance.
- 32 (b) The dog <u>or other animal</u> shall be upon a leash <u>or</u>
- 33 <u>otherwise sufficiently restrained in a manner appropriate for the</u>
- 34 <u>animal</u> while using the facilities of a common carrier.
- 35 (2) Trainers of support dogs <u>and other support animals</u> shall
- 36 have the same rights of accommodations, advantages, facilities and
- 37 privileges with support <u>animals</u>-in-training as those provided to
- 38 blind, mobility impaired, hearing impaired persons and other
- 39 persons living with a disability with support animals under this
- 40 section.
- 41 (3) No person shall deprive a blind, mobility
- 42 impaired, \* \* \* hearing impaired person, or a support animal
- 43 trainer of any of the advantages, facilities or privileges
- 44 provided in this section, nor charge such blind, mobility
- 45 impaired, hearing impaired person, person living with a disability
- 46 or support <u>animal</u> trainer a fee or charge for the use of the
- 47 <u>animal</u>.
- 48 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 49 and after July 1, 2000.
