- 10 WHEREAS, Calhoun, Chickasaw, Humphreys, Pontotoc and
- 11 Yalobusha Counties are the top five sweet potato producing areas
- 12 in Mississippi; and
- WHEREAS, Mississippi ranks third in number of acres planted
- 14 among sweet potato producing states and contributes \$24 million
- 15 to Mississippi's economy each year; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Mississippi hosts the National Sweet Potato Festival
- 17 each November in Vardaman; and
- 18 WHEREAS, in January 2000, Mississippi hosted the 38th Annual
- 19 United States Sweet Potato Council Meeting at Gold Strike in
- 20 Tunica, Mississippi, which had the highest attendance of sweet
- 21 potato growers in the history of the council; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Bobby Whitt, President of the Mississippi Sweet
- 23 Potato Council, has been elected to serve as the National
- 24 President of the Sweet Potato Council for 1999-2000:
