HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 143

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING MISS TAKIYAH PERKINS FOR

4 numerous honors and awards for her outstanding academic

12 years at Greenwood High School; and

15 Club Youth Leadership Seminar and has a brown belt in Tae-Kwon-Do;

17 WHEREAS, Miss Perkins has been recognized by the Kappa Alpha
18 Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., as 1999 Miss
19 Fashionetta; won First Place in the Elks Oratorical Contest in
20 Leflore County; and won First Place in the Essay Contest for
21 District 3 of the M.H.S.A.A.; and

22 WHEREAS, Miss Perkins, a remarkable student, has received
23 several scholarships including the scholarship for the Second
24 Congressional District of the Minority Caucus of the Mississippi
25 Association of Supervisors, the Top Lawyer Scholarship for the
26 Greenwood Mock Trial Team during the Magnolia Bar Association Mock

27 Trial Competition and the Educational Scholarship for the Leflore
28 County Chamber of Commerce; and

29 WHEREAS, Miss Perkins has served as a Page for the
30 Mississippi House of Representatives from 1994 to 2000; and
