- 19 WHEREAS, in the late 1970's, Reverend Owens relocated and
- 20 renamed his funeral home, changing the name to Owens and Sons
- 21 Funeral Home; and
- WHEREAS, in the early 1980's, Reverend Owens founded Owens
- 23 Limousine Service and in 1995, he opened his second Owens and Sons
- 24 Funeral Home; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Reverend Owens is survived by his lovely wife, Linda
- 26 Ramey, and many other kind and loving family members:
