- 2 AUTHORIZE THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF ANY COUNTY TO MAINTAIN
- PRIVATE ROADS AND DRIVEWAYS USED FOR TURNAROUNDS BY BUSES DESIGNED
- 4 AND OPERATED FOR THE TRANSPORTATION OF DISABLED PERSONS; AND FOR
- 5 RELATED PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 19-3-42, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 8 amended as follows:[JMR1]
- 9 19-3-42. (1) The board of supervisors of any county is
- 10 hereby authorized and empowered, in its discretion, to grade,
- 11 gravel or shell, repair, and/or maintain private gravel or shell
- 12 roads or driveways to private residences if such roads or
- 13 driveways are used for school bus turnarounds.
- 14 (2) Prior to engaging in the work authorized in subsection
- 15 (1) of this section, the board of supervisors shall spread upon
- 16 the official minutes of the board:
- 17 (a) The written request of the school board for such
- 18 work;
- 19 (b) The written approval of the board of supervisors
- 20 for such work;
- 21 (c) The specific location of the road or driveway to be
- 22 worked; and

23 (d) The name of the owner of the road or driveway to be

24 worked.

25 (3) The written request of the school board, as required in

26 subsection (2)(a) above, shall contain a current list of all

27 active school bus turnarounds presently in use by the school

28 district or contemplated for use by the school district for the

29 present school year. The approval by the board of supervisors

30 shall be valid and effective for the period of time that a

31 turnaround is anticipated for use, but in no event for a period

32 greater than one (1) year.

33 (4) In addition to the authority granted in subsection (1)

34 of this section, from and after October 1, 1989, the board of

35 supervisors of any county is further authorized, in its

36 discretion, to maintain public school grounds of the county and to

37 grade, gravel, shell or overlay, and/or to maintain gravel, shell,

38 asphalt or concrete roads, driveways or parking lots of public

39 schools of the county if, before engaging in such work, the board

of supervisors shall spread upon its official minutes the written

request of the school board for such work, the written approval of

42 the board of supervisors for such work and the specific location

43 of the school grounds or road, driveway or parking lot, to be

44 worked.

45 (5) In addition to any other authority granted in this

46 section, the board of supervisors of any county is hereby

47 authorized, in its discretion, to repair and maintain driveways

48 and parking lots of: (a) any nonprofit organization in the county

49 which is tax exempt under Section 501(c) of the United States

50 Internal Revenue Code and which has as one (1) of its primary

51 purposes for organization to aid and assist in the rehabilitation

of persons suffering from drug abuse or drug addiction; and (b)

53 any private, nonprofit cemeteries in the county. The board of

- 54 supervisors of any county shall not be authorized under the
- 55 provisions of this subsection to repair or maintain driveways or
- 56 parking lots located more than one hundred fifty (150) feet from
- 57 the center of any highway, road or street under the jurisdiction
- 58 of the county.
- 59 (6) (a) In addition to any other authority granted in this
- 60 section, the board of supervisors of any county is hereby
- 61 <u>authorized</u>, in its discretion, to grade, gravel or shell, repair,
- 62 <u>and/or maintain private gravel or shell roads or driveways to</u>
- 63 private residences if such roads or driveways are used for
- 64 turnarounds by buses designed and operated for the transportation
- 65 <u>of disabled persons.</u>
- (b) Prior to engaging in the work authorized in this
- 67 <u>subsection</u>, the board of supervisors shall spread upon the
- 68 official minutes of the board:
- (i) The written request of the organization
- 70 <u>seeking the work;</u>
- 71 <u>(ii) The written approval of the board of</u>
- 72 <u>supervisors for the work;</u>
- 73 <u>(iii) The specific location of the road or</u>
- 74 <u>driveway to be worked; and</u>
- 75 (iv) The name of the owner of the road or driveway
- 76 to be worked.
- 77 (c) The approval by the board of supervisors shall be
- 78 valid and effective for the period of time that a turnaround is
- 79 <u>anticipated for use, but in no event for a period greater than one</u>
- 80 <u>(1) year.</u>
- 81 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from

82 and after July 1, 2000.
