1	AN	ACT	TO	AMEND	SECTIONS	23-15-62	27 AND	23-15-713	, MISSISSIPPI

- CODE OF 1972, TO ALLOW QUALIFIED ELECTORS TO VOTE BY ABSENTEE
- 3 BALLOT FOR ANY REASON; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 23-15-627, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 6 amended as follows: [WAN1]
- 7 23-15-627. The registrar shall be responsible for furnishing
- 8 an absentee ballot application form to any elector authorized to
- 9 receive an absentee ballot. Absentee ballot applications shall be
- 10 furnished to a person only upon the oral or written request of the
- 11 elector who seeks to vote by absentee ballot; however, the parent,
- 12 child, spouse, sibling, legal guardian, those empowered with a
- 13 power of attorney for that elector's affairs or agent of the
- 14 elector may orally request an absentee ballot application on
- 15 behalf of the elector. An absentee ballot application must have
- 16 the seal of the circuit or municipal clerk affixed to it and be
- 17 initialed by the registrar or his deputy in order to be utilized
- 18 to obtain an absentee ballot. A reproduction of an absentee
- 19 ballot application shall not be valid unless it is a reproduction
- 20 provided by the office of the registrar of the jurisdiction in
- 21 which the election is being held and which contains the seal and

- initials required by this section. Such application shall be 22 substantially in the following form: 23 "OFFICIAL APPLICATION FOR ABSENT ELECTOR'S BALLOT 24 I, , duly qualified and registered in the Precinct 25 of the County of , and State of Mississippi, coming within 26 the purview of the definition 'ABSENT ELECTOR' will be absent from 27 the county of my residence on election day, or unable to vote in 28 person because (check appropriate reason): 29 () (PRESIDENTIAL APPLICANT ONLY:) I am currently a 30 resident of Mississippi or have moved therefrom within thirty (30) 31 days of the coming presidential election. 32 () I am an enlisted or commissioned member, male or female, 33 of any component of the United States Armed Forces and am a 34 35 citizen of Mississippi, or spouse or dependent of such member. () I am a member of the Merchant Marine or the American Red 36 37 Cross and am a citizen of Mississippi or spouse or dependent of such member. 38 () I am a disabled war veteran who is a patient in any 39 hospital and am a citizen of Mississippi or spouse or dependent of 40 such veteran. 41 () I am a civilian attached to and serving outside of the 42 United States with any branch of the Armed Forces or with the 43 44 Merchant Marine or American Red Cross, and am a citizen of Mississippi or spouse or dependent of such civilian. 45 () I am a citizen of Mississippi temporarily residing 46 outside the territorial limits of the United States and the 47 District of Columbia. 48 () I am a student, teacher or administrator at a college, 49
- () I am a student, teacher or administrator at a college, university, junior or community college, high, junior high, elementary or grade school, whose studies or employment at such institution necessitates my absence from the county of my voting

          23-15-713. For the purpose of this subarticle, any duly

     qualified elector may vote as provided in this subarticle if he be

     one who falls within the following categories:

(a) Any qualified elector who is a bona fide student,

teacher or administrator at any college, university, junior

college, high, junior high or elementary grade school whose

studies or employment at such institution necessitates his absence

from the county of his voting residence on the date of any

primary, general or special election, or the spouse and dependents

of said student, teacher or administrator if such spouse or

dependent(s) maintain a common domicile, outside of the county of

his voting residence, with such student, teacher or administrator.

- 118 (b) Any qualified elector who is required to be away

 119 from his place of residence on any election day due to his

 120 employment as an employee of a member of the Mississippi

 121 congressional delegation and the spouse and dependents of such

 122 person if he or she shall be residing with such absentee voter

 123 away from the county of the spouse's voting residence.
- (c) Any qualified elector who <u>desires to vote by</u>

 125 <u>absentee ballot</u> for any reason.
- 126 (d) Any person who has a temporary or permanent 127 physical disability.
- (e) The parent, spouse or dependent of a person with a temporary or permanent physical disability who is hospitalized outside of his county of residence or more than fifty (50) miles distant from his residence, if the parent, spouse or dependent will be with such person on election day.
- (f) Any person who is sixty-five (65) years of age or older.
- (g) Any member of the Mississippi congressional
 delegation absent from Mississippi on election day, and the spouse

- 137 and dependents of such member of the congressional delegation.

- SECTION 3. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi
- 140 shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor,
- 141 or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the
- 142 Attorney General of the United States or to the United States
- 143 District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the
- 144 provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and
- 145 extended.
- 146 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 147 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting
- 148 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
