## SENATE BILL NO. 2430

1 2 3	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 45-14-31, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO INCREASE THE SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR RADIOLOGICAL HEALTH LICENSES AND PERMITS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
5	SECTION 1. Section 45-14-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
6	amended as follows:
7	45-14-31. All initial application and registration fee and
8	annual fees due under this section shall be paid directly to the
9	agency for deposit into the Radiological Health Operations Fund in
10	the State Treasury. The Mississippi State Board of Health shall
11	submit its separate budget for carrying out the provisions of this
12	chapter. Said budget shall be subject to and shall comply with
13	the requirements of the state budget law. In order to supplement
14	state radiological health budget allocations authorized to carry
15	out and enforce the provisions of this chapter, the agency is
16	hereby authorized to charge and collect fees in accordance with

247	REGISTRANTS AND PERMITTEES
248	An out-of-state person possessing:

258	SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR TANNING EQUIPMENT
259	Fees for the initial registration and annual renewal of each
260	unit of tanning equipment shall be Thirty-five Dollars (\$35.00).
