SENATE BILL NO. 2430

1       AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 45-14-31, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,  
2 TO INCREASE THE SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR RADIOLOGICAL HEALTH LICENSES  
3 AND PERMITS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

4       BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

5       SECTION 1. Section 45-14-31, Mississippi Code of 1972, is  
6 amended as follows:

7       45-14-31. All initial application and registration fee and  
8 annual fees due under this section shall be paid directly to the  
9 agency for deposit into the Radiological Health Operations Fund in  
10 the State Treasury. The Mississippi State Board of Health shall  
11 submit its separate budget for carrying out the provisions of this  
12 chapter. Said budget shall be subject to and shall comply with  
13 the requirements of the state budget law. In order to supplement  
14 state radiological health budget allocations authorized to carry  
15 out and enforce the provisions of this chapter, the agency is  
16 hereby authorized to charge and collect fees in accordance with  
17 the following schedules:

44 authorizing the receipt of waste  
45 radioactive material from other  
46 persons for the purpose of  
47 super-compaction (compaction of  
48 seven-fold or greater). The licensee  
49 will dispose of the material by  
50 transfer to another person authorized  
51 to receive or dispose of the material.

52 (e) Licenses specifically \$ 5,000.00 \$ 5,000.00

53 authorizing the receipt of waste  
54 radioactive material from other  
55 persons for the purpose of  
56 incineration. The licensee will  
57 dispose of radioactive ash by  
58 transfer to another person authorized  
59 to receive or dispose of this material.

81 for human use of radioactive material  
82 for therapeutic purposes, except  
83 licenses in category IV(a).

84 (d) Licenses issued to \$ 400.00 \$ 400.00  
85 physicians or medical institutions  
86 for human use of radioactive material  
87 provided by a mobile nuclear medicine  
88 service.

89 (e) Licenses specifically \$ 1,200.00 \$ 1,200.00  
90 authorizing mobile nuclear medicine  
91 services to licensees in categories  
92 IV(b) or IV(d).

93 (f) Licenses specifically \$ 400.00 \$ 400.00  
94 authorizing the use of radioactive  
95 material contained in eye applicators  
96 or bone mineral analyzers.

97 V. Radiopharmacies

98 \* \* \* Licenses \$ 2,300.00 \$ 2,300.00  
99 specifically authorizing the  
100 processing or manufacturing and  
101 distribution or redistribution of  
102 radiopharmaceuticals, generators,  
103 reagent kits and/or sources and  
104 devices containing radioactive material.

195 SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR GENERAL LICENSE DEVICES

196 Initial registration and annual fees for the receipt,  
197 possession or use of radioactive material under a general license  
198 shall be per registration as follows:

199 (a) Certain measuring, \$ 150.00 \$ 150.00  
200 gauging and controlling device(s).

201 (b) Generally licensed gas \$ 100.00 \$ 100.00  
202 chromatographs.

203 (c) Static elimination \$ 100.00 \$ 100.00  
204 device(s) and ion generating tube(s).

205 (d) Source material. \$ 100.00 \$ 100.00

206 (e) Depleted Uranium. \$ 100.00 \$ 100.00

207 (f) In Vitro testing \$ 100.00 \$ 100.00  
208 and clinical labs.

209 (g) All other general \$ 100.00 \$ 100.00  
210 license registrations other than  
211 those specified above.

212 SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR X-RAY TUBE

213 Fees for the initial registration and annual renewal fees of  
214 each X-ray tube shall be as follows:

221                   **SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR INDUSTRIAL RADIOGRAPHY**

222                               **X-RAY REGISTRATIONS**

223               Fees for the initial registration and annual fees for  
224 industrial radiography x-ray devices shall be Four Hundred Fifty  
225 Dollars (\$450.00).

226                               **SERVICES**

227               Each person who assembles, installs or services radiation  
228 machines within the State of Mississippi shall pay an annual  
229 registration fee of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00).

230                               **SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR ACCELERATORS**

231               Fees for the initial registration and annual fees of each  
232 accelerator shall be Five Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$550.00).

233                               **SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR NEUTRON GENERATOR REGISTRATIONS**

234               Fees for initial registration and annual fees for \* \* \*  
235 neutron generators shall be Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00).

236                               **SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR NUCLEAR REACTORS**

237               A person possessing a Nuclear Regulatory Commission license  
238 or permit authorizing a nuclear reactor in the State of  
239 Mississippi for commercial production of electrical energy  
240 utilizing special nuclear material sufficient to form a critical  
241 mass, shall pay an annual fee of Seventeen Dollars (\$17.00) per  
242 megawatt (thermal) rating for each such reactor so licensed or  
243 permitted. When more than one (1) reactor is on the same site,  
244 the fee or sum of each additional reactor after the first shall be  
245 Five Dollars (\$5.00) per megawatt (thermal).

246                               **SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR OUT-OF-STATE LICENSES,**

247                                       **REGISTRANTS AND PERMITTEES**

248               An out-of-state person possessing:

249                   (a) A license from the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory  
250 Commission;  
251                   (b) A license or registration from an Agreement State  
252 or Licensing State; or  
253                   (c) A registration or permit from a state radiological  
254 health program; and who enters the State of Mississippi to conduct  
255 the activities authorized in such license, registration or permit  
256 shall pay an annual fee in accordance with the above fee  
257 schedules.

258                   **SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR TANNING EQUIPMENT**

259                   Fees for the initial registration and annual renewal of each  
260 unit of tanning equipment shall be Thirty-five Dollars (\$35.00).

261                   SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from  
262 and after July 1, 2000.
